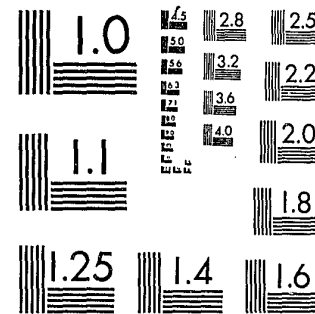

PREFACE

This report presents data concerning Pennsylvania's county prison and jail populations, the types of commitments and the types of discharges which these facilities have encountered during 1976 and 1977. It examines a number of characteristics concerning the prisoner populations with special attention being given to changes in the past two years and ongoing trends since 1960.

Information contained in this report demonstrates that the populations of the county prisons and jails increased slightly in 1976 and then declined slightly last year. However, in the past two years our county prisons have received almost 25,000 court commitments and over 121,000 detentioners.

In light of this large flow of offenders through the county correctional system, it is hoped that this report will aid administrators and practitioners throughout the Commonwealth in making decisions and developing strategies for the future.

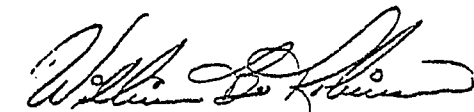

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INTRODUCTION

For many years the county prisons and jails of Pennsylvania have played an integral part in the correctional process in the Commonwealth. Approximately over half of the 68 county institutions currently in operation are 100 years of age or older.

County prison statistics have also been in existence in one form or another for the last 131 years. County prison statistics were originally made statutory in Pennsylvania in 1847 when the data was sent to the Secretary of the Commonwealth in the Department of State. This program was later transferred to the Pennsylvania Board of Public Charities in 1872. The Board was replaced by the Department of Public Welfare in 1921 and the program remained with this department. In 1956 the program was transferred to the Bureau of Correction within the Department of Justice. In 1968 the Office of Criminal Justice Statistics under the Governor's Justice Commission managed the program and currently the Bureau of Correction is responsible for the statistics after the program was transferred back in October 1976.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide summary data on populations and population movements and trends of prisoners confined to county prisons and jails. In general, data is presented for the period of 1960 through 1977, where possible, for identification of trends in county populations. In addition, special emphasis has been placed on data from 1976 and 1977 to show recent changes. Where possible data is broken down by race, sex, status and other critical variables. Data in this report are based entirely on monthly population reports submitted to the Bureau of Correction by each county prison and jail.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Class of County This is a legislative decennial classification, related to the size of county population. Population ranges for the nine classes are as follows: (1) First Class Counties - 1,800,000 or more inhabitants; (2) Second Class Counties -

800,000 to 1,800,000; (2-A) Second Class A Counties - 500,000 to 800,000; (3) Third Class Counties - 250,000 to 500,000; (4) Fourth Class Counties - 150,000 to 250,000; (5) Fifth Class Counties - 95,000 to 150,000; (6) Sixth Class Counties - 45,000 to 95,000; (7) Seventh Class Counties - 20,000 to 45,000; (8) Eight Class Counties - Less than 20,000 inhabitants. Comparisons between counties are most valid within the different county classifications. Table 1 identifies each county classification.

Conditional Releases This group represents parolees who are released under supervision of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole or are paroled by the Court of Record (often referred to as "county parole"). Unless specified, these two groups are combined in this report.

Unconditional Releases This group includes those sentenced prisoners who are given a final discharge and are no longer under any type of supervision after their release from prison. Unconditional releases include the following: (1) expiration of maximum sentence, (2) by court order, (3) by minor judiciary order, (4) by maximum commutation including good time, and by payment of fines and costs.

County Prisons and Jails In general, first to fifth class counties have "prisons" and sixth to eighth class counties have "jails" although local terminology will vary (Allegheny County Jail, for example). Essentially county prisons are administered by an appointed warden and a prison board, and county jails are administered by a Sheriff elected every four years. In recent years the county jails and prisons have primarily received only short term sentenced prisoners and pre-trial detentioners.

Court Sentences This group generally represents prisoners committed by a Court of Record to serve sentences for felony and misdemeanors offenses. In recent years, very few felony prisoners have been sentenced to county prisons. They are generally sentenced to State Correctional Institutions operated by the Bureau of Correction. Most court commitments to county institutions are for less serious offenses.

Detentioners Received This group represents persons detained prior to trial and other prisoners not sentenced directly to the local prisons or jail where they are confined. Detentioners include those: (1) held for trial, further hearing or as a material witness, (2) held for various federal, state and other police authorities, (3) held for juvenile court, and (4) held for mental examination or observation.

Detentioners Released This group represents eight types of releases: (1) by bail, (2) by holding authority (court, minor judiciary, coronor), (3) by sentence to the prison, (4) by sentence to the Bureau of Correction, (5) by sentence to a State Regional Correctional Facility, (6) by various federal

state and police authorities, (7) juvenile court wards, and (8) mental patients transferred or released. Unless otherwise specified "detentioners released" includes all of these categories.

Minor Judiciary Sentences This group represents prisoners who are committed by the Minor Judiciary (District Magistrates and Justices) to serve sentences in county prisons for primarily summary offenses. However, in Philadelphia the Municipal Court handles these types of cases.

Part I Offenses These offenses are murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft and auto theft. These offenses are used in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and comprise their Crime Index. Nationwide, these crimes are used to measure the distribution and trends in criminal activity.

Part II Offenses These offenses are all other crimes not listed under Part I Offenses, and are too numerous to list in detail in this report.

Rate Per 100,000 Civilian Population This ratio represents the relativity of increasing or decreasing prison populations with respect to the general population of each county. For 1960 and 1970 the U.S. Bureau of Census populations were used and in all other years estimates of populations by various agencies were used.

Yearly Average Daily Population This term represents the cumulative daily population counts as of midnight divided by 365 or 366 days.

COUNTIES NOT REPORTING

It should be noted that three counties did not report on a regular monthly basis during 1977. Bradford County did not report from August through December, Fulton County and Jefferson County did not report from September through December. In addition, it should be noted that where 1975 statistics are present, Westmoreland County prisoners were counted in the counties where they were confined since Westmoreland County's prison was taken over by the Bureau of Correction in 1969 and operated as a regional correctional facility.

POPULATION TRENDS

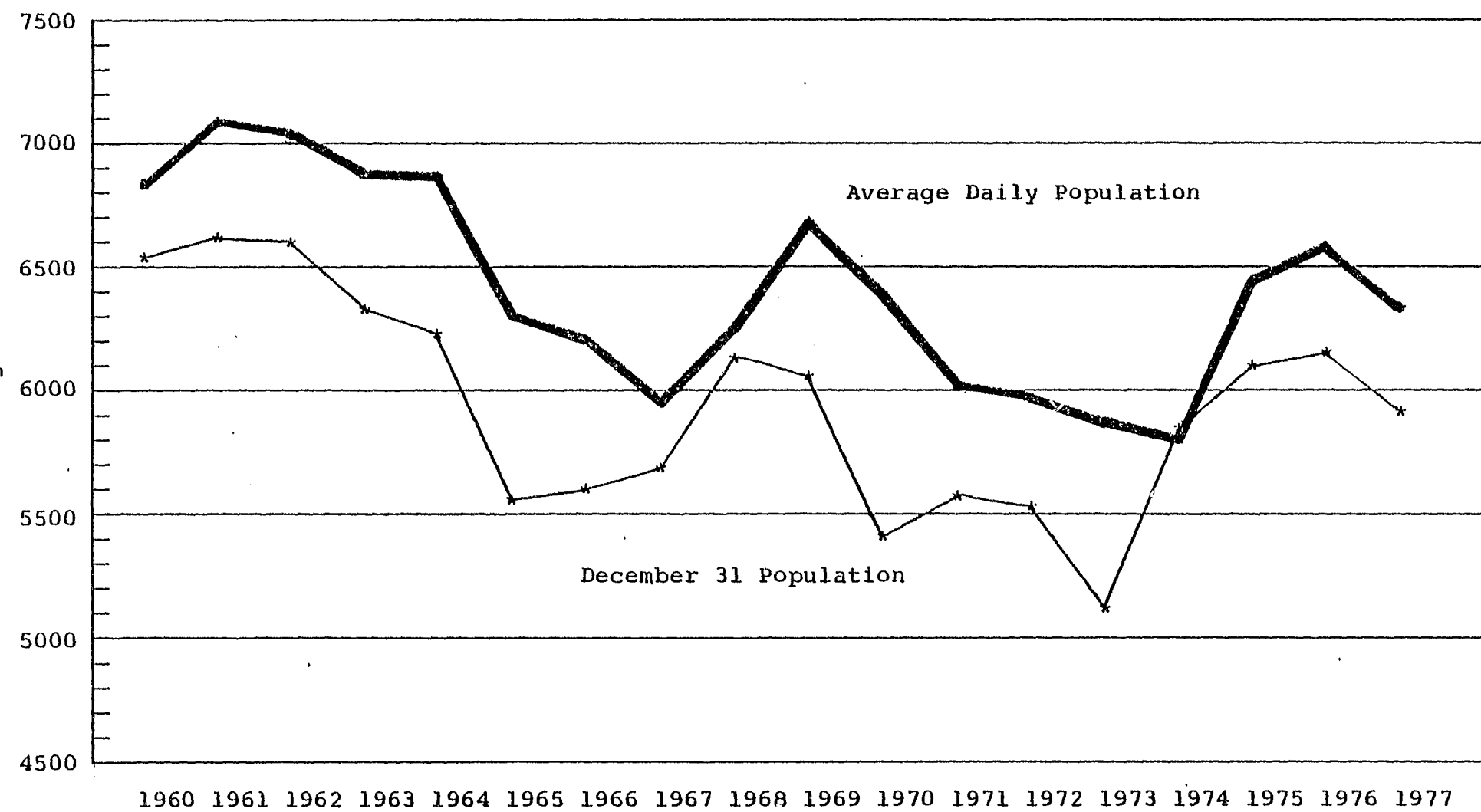
As presented in Table A below, the average daily population in Pennsylvania county prisons increased slightly in 1976 and then dropped to pre-1975 levels during 1977. Similarly, the rate per 100,000 civilian population increased slightly in 1976 and then decreased in 1977.

THE LARGEST COUNTY PRISONS

Sixteen county prisons averaged over 100 prisoners per day in 1976 and 1977. These sixteen counties accounted for 77.6% of all county prisoners in 1976 and 76.9% in 1977. Allegheny, Chester and the Detention Center all showed increases in average daily populations from 1976 to 1977 while the rest of the prisons remained fairly constant or dropped in the past two years. It should be noted that the rates in the following table are based on average daily populations and they will not correspond to the rates in Table 6.

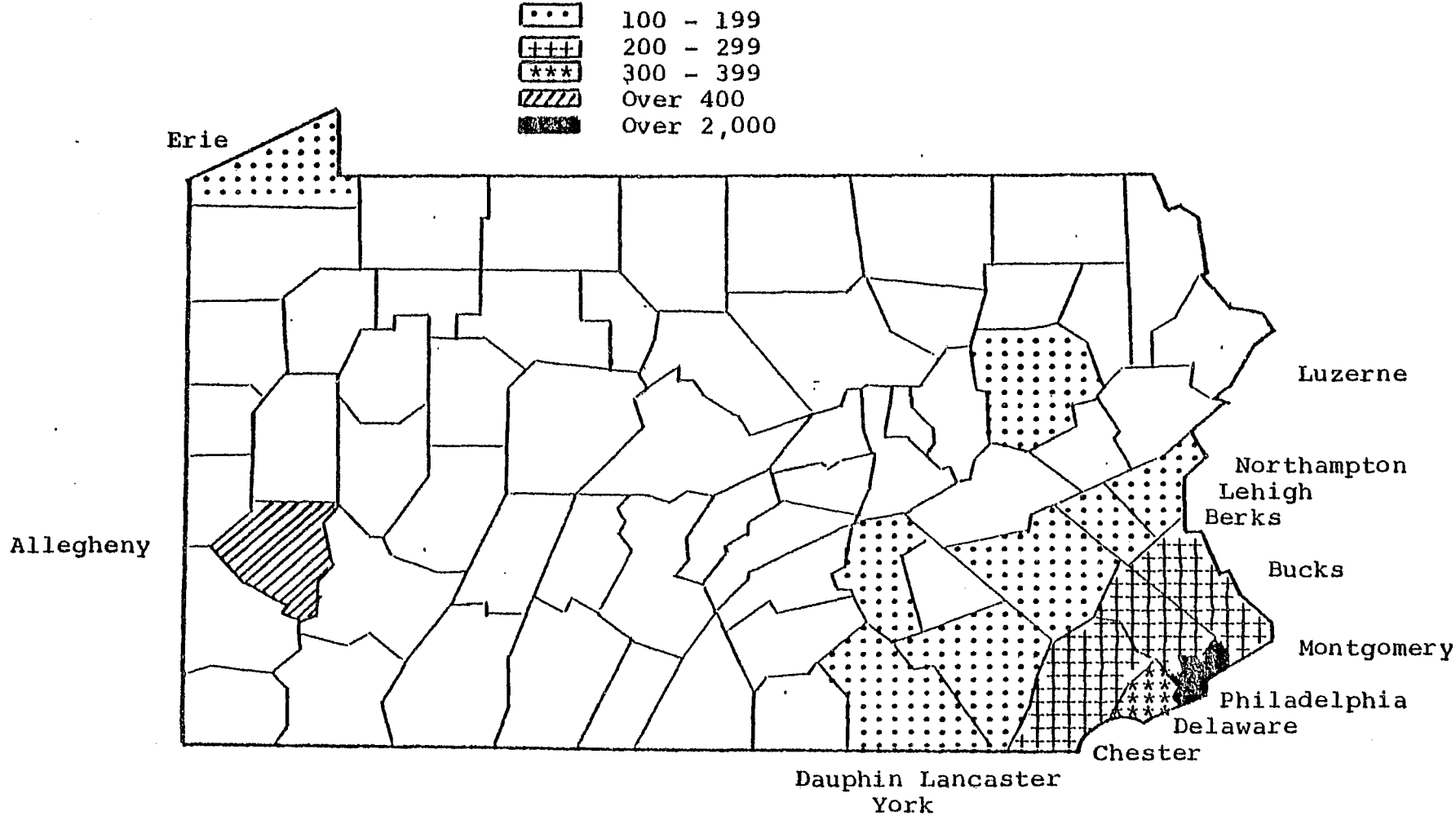

MAJOR TYPES OF RECEPTIONS

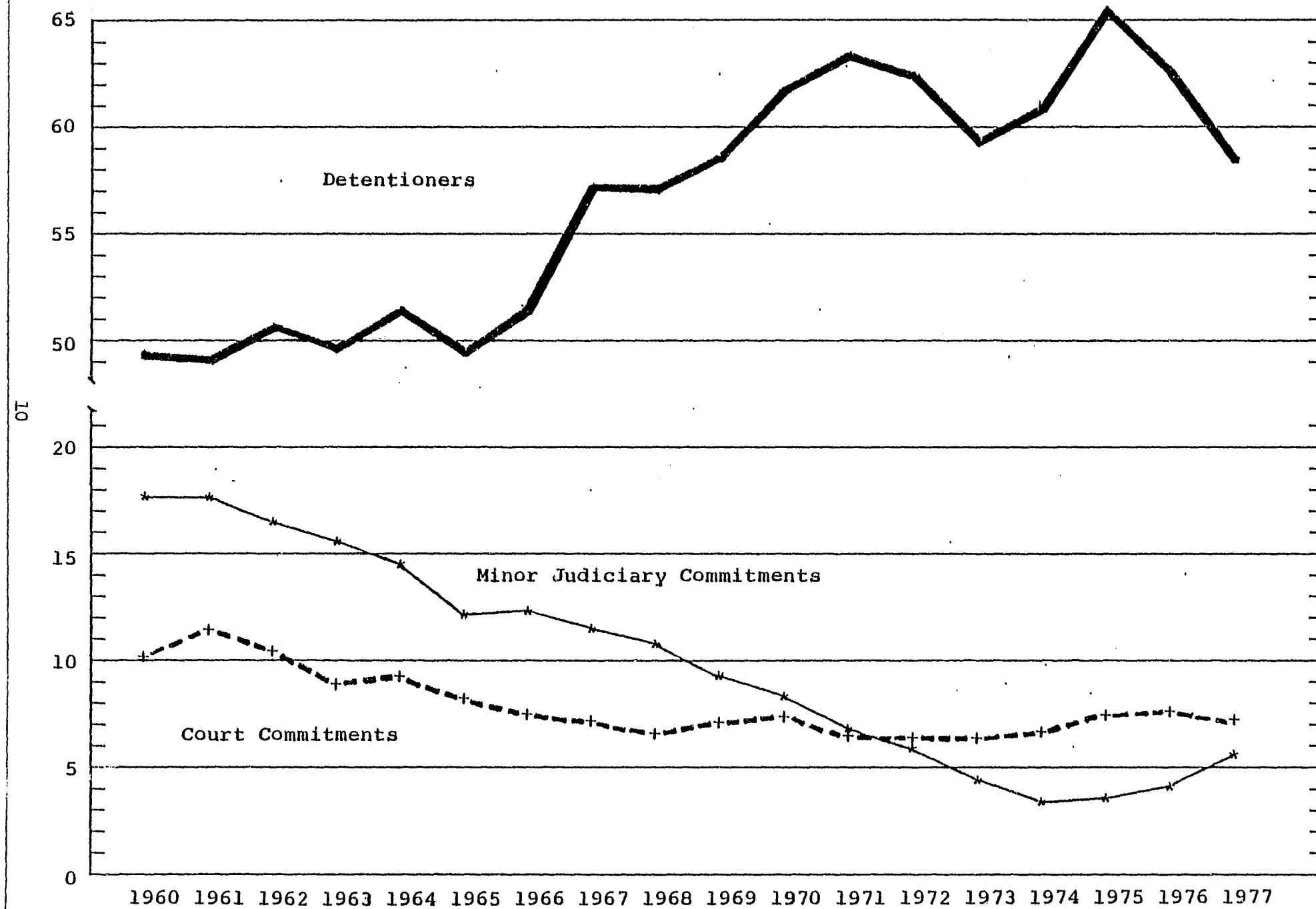
In 1976 the number of court commitments received in county prisons continued to increase with a jump of 1.7% over 1975 levels. However, in 1977 court commitments dropped by 8.6%. Minor judiciary commitments rose significantly during the past year. In 1976 the increase was 11% over 1975 levels and in 1977 there were 29.4% more minor judiciary commitments than in 1976. The number of detentioners continued to decline during the past two years with a 3.7% drop in 1976 and a 6.6% drop in 1977.

MAJOR TYPES OF RELEASES

The three major types of releases from county prisons are unconditional (final or no supervision), conditional (paroles) and detentioners. Unconditional releases have risen in the last four years with increases of 2.5% in 1976 and 12.5% in 1977. Conditional releases have also been on the rise in the last four years with increases of 11.7% in 1976 and 0.2% in 1977. The number of detentioners released has dropped in the past two years. In 1976 detention releases fell 4.0% and in 1977 the number decreased by 7.8%.

STATUSES ON DECEMBER 31

During 1977 the statuses of county prisoners in all categories decreased from December 31, 1976 levels. Those having sentences of less than two years dropped 5.5% from 1976 to 1977, those having maximum sentences of over tow years dropped 13.2% from 1976 to 1977 and detentioners dropped to 1974 levels. The most significant decline was for juveniles. On December 31, 1977 there were only 5 reported juvenile court cases, which is a 90% frop from 1975.

RACIAL DISTRIBUTION

The proportion of white prisoners in county prisons and jails has increased significantly during the pas two years. On December 31 in 1976 and 1977 whites accounted for the majority of prisoners which has not occurred since 1966. In fact, the 1977 proportion was the second largest since 1960. The counties having a majority of non-whites on December 31 for the past two years were: Allegheny, Dauphin, Delaware and Philadelphia. Detailed racial distributions for each county prison or jail is presented in Table 3.

OFFENSE DISTRIBUTION

Table H presents the offense distribution of all sentence prisoners committed to county prisons and jails during 1976. As expected, only 31.5% of all county commitments are for Part I Offenses*. The remaining 68.5% are considered Part II Offenses. The major offenses of 1976 county commitments were: motor vehicle code violations (15.8%), disorderly conduct (8.2%), burglary (10.9%), larceny (11.9%), drunkenness (6.3%), and narcotic drug laws (7.3%). These offenses represented 60.4% of all county commitments.

MAXIMUM SENTENCE DISTRIBUTION

Approximately the same number of persons were sentenced to terms of less than 90 days and from 12 to 23.9 months, with each accounting for 41.9% of the total. The average sentence for whites was over two months less than that for non-whites and the average sentence for females was almost four months less than the average for males.

TIME SERVED BY METHOD

Overall, sentenced prisoners served about 11 days more in prison in 1976 than they did in 1974. This increased amount of time spent in county prisons was primarily a result of longer time served for those release unconditionally, particularly among those released at the expiration of sentence. Conditional releases served about the same amount of time as in 1974. A lower proportion of discharges in 1977 were unconditional than in 1974, and conversely, larger proportion were conditional discharges.

TIME SERVED BY OFFENSE

As expected, those persons released during 1976 who were committed for murder served the longest amount of time, that being almost a year total. Other Part I offenses similarly had the longest amount of time served. Persons committed for arson, embezzlement and sex offenses served the longest amount of time for those committed under Part II offenses.
