

This report is one of a series designed to make data available on the population in facilities of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The data in this report provide a profile of persons discharged from facility custody during 1978. The following characteristics are covered in this report: type of release; sex; time served; age; commitment offense; prior criminal record; maximum sentence; and county of commitment.

Characteristics of Inmates Discharged, in this edition, provides information on the amount of time served in Department facilities for several profile characteristics. This information is provided in response to the expressed needs of the users of this report. We encourage the reader to write this Department to let us know what information is required so that we may prepare a product which will better serve the needs of the information user.


The material in this report was prepared from the computerized inmate information file maintained by the Division of Management Information Services.

HIGHLIGHTS

1. During 1978 there were 7,959 inmates released from DOCS facilities. The vast majority, 87.6%, were released to parole supervision. Maximum expiration of sentence was the next largest group, 4.8%, while the remaining 7.6% was made up of a composite of release types including transfers to other agencies, court ordered discharges, escapes and deaths.
2. Males accounted for 96.4% of all inmates discharged compared to 3.6% for females.
3. Persons released to parole supervision for the first time on their current sentence made up 73.5% (5,583) of all persons discharged from DOCS facilities during 1978.
4. The median time served by males released at the discretion of the Board of Parole was 22.2 months while female first paroles had a median time of 17.5 months. Mandatory conditional releases served slightly longer periods, 23.4 months for males and 22.1 months for females.

5. Persons committed for murder served the longest periods of time, 88.0 months for male first paroles. Rape commitments were next highest with 39.5 months followed by other homicide at 36.5 months. The largest single crime category was robbery, accounting for 34.1% of all male first releases to parole supervision with a median time served of 25.2 months. Grand larceny commitments served the shortest period for male first paroles, 18.3 months.
6. Over half the inmates released were under 30 years of age (64.2%). The older inmates had generally served longer periods of time with those 45-64 years of age serving a median time of 28.7 months.
7. Most of the 1978 releases had a prior criminal record with only 11.1% with no adult criminal history. 24.4% had a record of prior state or federal commitment. Persons with more serious prior criminal histories tended to serve more time under DOCS custody. Offenders with records of prior state commitments served a median time of 27.8 months while those with no record spent only 20.2 months in DOCS facilities.
8. Over half (54.9%) of the first releases had been committed with maximum sentences of four years or less. Conditional releases generally had shorter maximum terms than did their parolee counterparts although the median time served by those males conditionally released was greater, 23.4 months, than that served by male first paroles at 22.2 months.
9. Two out of three persons released had been committed from New York City. An additional 10.5% came from the suburban New York City area while the remaining 23.6% were from Upstate counties. Male first releases from New York City had a slightly longer median time served figure, 20.8 months, than did those from suburban New York City at 20.5 months and upstate at 19.4 months.

1978 RELEASES: TYPE OF RELEASE

Type of Release There were 8,050 releases from Department facilities in 1978. Information was available on the computer file for 7,959 of these releases. 7,675 releases (96.4%) were males and 284 (3.6%) were females.

The largest number of males discharged in 1978 were released to parole supervision. These included 4,812 paroled by discretionary action of the Board of Parole (62.7%) and 1,921 by mandatory conditional release (25.0%). Thus, a total of 6,733 males (87.7% of total male releases) were released to parole supervision in 1978. 375 males (4.9%) were released on the maximum expiration date of their sentence. Other releases included 259 males (3.4%) transferred to institutions outside the Department, the majority to the Department of Mental Hygiene, under a cooperative program for treatment of mentally-disturbed inmates. 195 males were released on orders from the court (2.6%) and there were 26 deaths (0.3%) none court-mandated. There were 36 escapes from institutional custody in 1978 and 49 absconders from temporary release, a total of only 1.1 percent - most of whom were recaptured within a short period of time.

Females released in 1978 showed a higher proportion paroled by action of the Parole Board (203 or 71.5%) and a smaller proportion of conditional releases to parole supervision, 37 or 13.0 percent. Thus, a total of 240 females or 84.5 percent were released to parole supervision - 3.2 percent less than the male experience. Only four females were released upon the maximum expiration of their sentences (1.4%) or 3.5 percent less than male releases at their maximum term. A relatively high proportion of females were transferred to the Department of Mental Hygiene (31, nearly 11%). Many of these are transferred back within a short period of time, after intensive treatment.

### TIME SERVED IN DOCS FACILITIES

The following sections present profile characteristics of inmates released to parole supervision for the first time on their current sentence. These characteristics include: sex; commitment offense; age at time of release; prior criminal record; and maximum sentence. Each of these characteristics is shown by time actually served in DOCS facilities between the date originally received from the court of commitment and the date the inmate was returned to the community under parole supervision. Data are presented separately for discretionary Parole Board releases and for mandatory conditional releases which occur after an inmate has successfully completed two-thirds of the maximum sentence.


A separate section is provided on "street" releases or the total number of persons returned to the community during the year from DOCS custody. These include subsequent as well as first releases to parole supervision plus persons discharged at maximum expiration of sentence. Time served is calculated from date of latest admission (this could be either as a violator returned from parole supervision or as a new court commitment) until date released back into the community. These data are presented on an individual county basis.

First Releases Information is presented in the next five sections on 5,853 inmates who were released for the first time to parole supervision on their current sentence. Of these 5,649 (96.5%) were males and 204 (3.5%) are females. Among male first releases, we find that 4,136 (73.2%) were discretionary parole releases compared to 181 female paroles (88.7%). Male conditional first releases numbered 1,513 (26.8%) while female conditional first releases were 23 (11.3%).


TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: SEX A median time of 22.2 months was served in DOCS facilities by the 4,136 male first parole releases during 1978. Male conditional first releases served over one month more, at 23.4 months, than did the first paroles. Females released by first parole served substantially less time than any of the other groups with a median time of 17.5 months. Time served by female first conditional releases was 22.1 months or 4.6 months more than the parole group.

TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: CRIME

First Paroles Over 92 percent of male first paroles in 1978 had been committed for felonies (3,821 out of 4,135). Robbery was the offense on commitment for the largest number of male first paroles (35.4%). Other felonies which comprised ten percent or more of the 1978 male first parole cohort included dangerous drugs (17.6%) and burglary (13.0%). Only 7.2 percent of male first paroles had been committed for homicide (298) and only 7.5 percent had been committed as Youthful Offenders (312).

About 80 percent of male felons paroled for the first time in 1978 had served less than three years (3,067 out of 3,821). The median time served by male felon first paroles was 22.7 months -- less than two years. Total male first paroles in 1978 had served an average of 22.2 months. Nearly 82 percent had served less than three years (3,380 out of 4,135). This latter figure includes 312 male Youthful Offender first paroles whose median time served was 18.6 months. The time served distribution of male first paroles by specific crime (felony) varies greatly depending on the severity and dispersion of offenses included in each designated crime and the numbers of commitments under these offenses. For example, robbery includes commitments under robbery first degree, robbery second degree and robbery third degree, which are class B, class C and class D felonies, respectively, in descending order of severity. While the spread of minimum terms permitted for specific crime classes may overlap, the tendency is toward longer minimum terms for the more serious crimes, as defined in the penal law.

Nearly 99 percent of female first paroles in 1978 had been committed for felonies -- 179 out of 181. Dangerous drug crime commitments accounted for the highest proportion of female first paroles (69 or 38.1%) while the second largest number had been committed for robbery, 39 or 21.5 percent.

Almost 95 percent of female felons paroled for the first time in 1978 had served less than three years (170 out of 179). The median time served of female felon first paroles was only 17.5 months, less than a year and a half. The median time served of total female first paroles was the same. Table 2 gives the median time served by commitment offense for both males and females and the numbers of first paroles for each offense.

First Conditional Releases Exactly 92 percent of male first conditional releases in 1978 had been committed for felonies (1,393 out of 1,514). The largest number of male first conditional releases had been committed for robbery (32.5%). The only other felony which comprised ten percent or more of the 1978 male first conditional release cohort was burglary (14.5%). Dangerous drug crimes, which accounted for nearly 18 percent of male first paroles in 1978, were only 3.4 percent of males conditionally released for the first time. Many of the "Rockefeller" law dangerous drug commitments were paroled in 1978 after serving minimum terms of one year. Only 8.1 percent of male first conditional releases had been committed for homicide (122) and only 7.7 percent had been committed as Youthful Offenders (116).

About 84 percent of male felons conditionally released for the first time in 1978 had served less than three years (1,169 out of 1,393). The median time served of male felon first conditional releases was 23.5 months, almost two years. The median time served of total male first conditional releases in 1978 was 23.4 months -- nearly 85 percent had served less than three years (1,285 out of 1,514). Like first paroles, the time served

distribution varies by specific crime. Table 2A gives the median time served by commitment offense for both male and female first conditional releases.

All female first conditional releases in 1978 had been committed for felonies (23) and the largest number were homicide commitments, seven or 30.4 percent. Nearly 96 percent of females conditionally released for the first time in 1978 had served less than three years (22 out of 23). The median time served of total female first conditional releases was 22.1 months.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: AGE

First Paroles Over 91 percent of total male first paroles were under 40 years of age on release and more than 52 percent were in the 21 through 29 year age group. Slightly less than 14 percent were less than 21 years of age on release and only 2.4 percent were 50 or over. The median age on release of male first paroles was 27.0 years. While the median time served of all male first paroles in 1978 was 22.2 months, there appears to be a direct relationship between time served and age on release, with a high of 28.7 months as the median time served of those aged 45 to 64 on release and a low of 17.4 months for those 16 to 18 years of age on release.

The age distribution of female first paroles was slightly higher than that for males. Nearly 84 percent were under 40 years of age on release and slightly over 59 percent were in the 21 through 29 year age group. Only 6.6 percent were less than 21 on release but 5.0 percent were aged 50 or over. The median age on release of female first paroles was 27.6 years. The relationship between time served and age on release for females appears to be similar to that for male first paroles although the median time served of female first paroles (17.5 months) was nearly five months less than that for males.

First Conditional Releases The median age on release of male first conditional releases (CR's) at 28.0 years was one year more than for male first paroles. 86.3 percent of the male CR's were under age 40 upon release. As with the parole group, the time served tended to increase with age on release. Male first CR's in the under 30 categories served longer periods than their parole counterparts. However, with exception of the 40-44 and the 65 and over groups, the male first CR's, 30 years of age and above, served somewhat less time than the comparable parole groups.

Female first conditional releases had a median age of 28.8 years. As with first paroles, this age was slightly higher than in the male CR group. The median time served by female first CR's was 22.1 months or 2.3 months less than for males.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASES: PRIOR CRIMINAL RECORD

First Paroles Over one-half of male first paroles had either no prior adult record (no arrests) or no prior adult commitment. Nearly 28 percent had prior local commitment(s) only and about 21 percent had previous state or federal commitments.

While nearly 86 percent of those who had no prior record nor commitment served less than three years, slightly under 70 percent of males with one or more prior state and/or federal commitments served less than three years when paroled for the first time. The median time served of male first paroles varied directly with the severity of the prior record. For example, those with no prior record served an average of 20.2 months; those with no prior adult commitment averaged 21.1 months; those with prior local commitments only was 22.0 months; while male first paroles with previous state commitments averaged 27.8 months in department facilities.

Over one-fourth of female paroles in 1978 had no prior record (26%) while 42 percent had no prior commitment. Thus, only 32 percent had prior local, state and/or federal commitments. In fact, only 10.5 percent had previous state or federal commitments. While the median for all female first paroles was 17.5 months, there does not appear to be any appreciable differences between the median times served by the severity of prior record.

First Conditional Releases. Over two out of three (69.2%) male conditional releases had previously served time in a penal facility for a prior criminal conviction. 33.1% had served sentences in local facilities and 36.2% had served time in state or federal prisons. In contrast with the male first parole group, those first conditional releases with no prior record served a median time of over two years (25.1 months) with only those with prior state commitments serving longer terms (25.2 months). The shortest median time served was 21.9 months for offenders with prior local incarceration only.

The female first conditional releases tended to have a more serious prior criminal record than did their parole counterparts. Over half had served time in penal facilities for prior offenses and only 13.0% (3 offenders) had no prior adult criminal record. Those inmates with prior state or federal commitments served the longest median time, 28.0 months. The other three groups served considerably shorter periods.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: MAXIMUM SENTENCE

First Paroles The median maximum sentence on commitment of total male first paroles was 5 years. Over 46 percent had received maximums of either 3 years (23.9%) or 4 years (22.4%) while nearly 45 percent had received maximum sentences of over 5 years. A little over 13 percent of male first paroles were under maximum sentences of life imprisonment. While the median time served of all male first paroles was 22.2 months, time served varied directly with maximum sentence received on commitment, with few exceptions. Yet male first paroles under life maximums averaged only 20.6 months confinement, because a large portion of these had been felony class A-III commitments under the old Rockefeller drug laws with very short minimum sentences (often one year) and life maximum sentences. It appears that a smaller proportion of the maximum sentence on commitment is served by male first paroles who have received longer maximum terms. For example, male first paroles with a three year maximum sentence served a median time of 16.2 months or 45% of their term; those with a four year maximum served 20.5 months or 43% of their term; and those with a five year maximum served 24.3 months or 41% of their term. In contrast, the median time served by inmates with maximum sentences of ten or more years was about 28% of their term.

The median maximum sentence on commitment of female first paroles was also 5 years. 47.5 percent had received maximums of either 3 years (33.1%) or 4 years (14.4%) while nearly 46 percent had received maximum sentences of over 5 years. Over 29 percent of female first paroles were under a maximum sentence of life imprisonment. Over twice as high a proportion of female first paroles had received life maximums compared to males because of the relatively higher proportion of female drug law commitments, most of which, first paroled in 1978, had been committed under the "Rockefeller" drug laws. The median time served of all female first paroles was only 17.5 months. The relationship between time served and maximum sentence on commitment for females also appears to be a direct one although the variation by maximum sentence is narrower.

First Conditional Releases The median maximum sentence on commitment of total male first conditional releases was only three years. Seventy-eight percent had received maximums of either 3 years (50.5%) or 4 years (27.5%) while only about 15 percent had received maximum sentences of over five years. This contrasts sharply with male first paroles, with a median maximum sentence of 5 years and nearly 45 percent with maximums of over 5 years. One explanation for the fact that most first conditional releases are short-termers is that most inmates with three year terms do not have minimum terms set by the court. And approximately 95 percent of these short-term cases have minimum periods of imprisonment set by the Parole Board which are greater than one-third of the maximum term. Thus, if a short-term inmate is rejected for parole at his first MPI hearing, it may be a relatively short period of time before he is eligible for conditional release. Therefore, many of these inmates do not appear again before the Parole Board but instead are conditionally released by statute after having served at least two-thirds of their maximum sentence (2 years for 3 year terms).

While the median time served of all first conditional releases was 23.4 months, time served varied directly with maximum sentence received on commitment, with few exceptions, as in the case of first paroles. Yet, like first paroles, it appears that a smaller proportion of the maximum sentence on commitment is served by male first conditional releases who have received longer maximum terms. By statute, inmates conditionally released must have served at least two-thirds of their maximum sentence while inmates can be paroled after serving only a minimum period of imprisonment which can be as short as one year. This accounts for the fact that time served by males conditionally released for the first time tends to be higher than for first paroles.

The median maximum sentence on commitment of female first conditional releases was also 3 years. Nearly 87 percent had received maximums of either three years (65.2%) or 4 years (21.7%) while only one female first conditional release had received a maximum sentence of over five years (4.3%). Thus, female first conditional releases tended to have shorter maximum sentences than males. The median time served by female first conditional releases (22.1 months) was slightly over one month less than the male experience. The relationship between time served and maximum sentence on commitment for females is also a direct one and similar to that for male first conditional releases.



"STREET" RELEASES

The following section provides time served information on all offenders released back into the community during 1978, that is, "street releases." Time served is calculated from date of last admission to the 1978 release date. The prior sections dealt only with first releases excluding offenders re-paroled or released upon maximum expiration of sentence subsequent to their return to DOCS custody for violation of parole. Thus, this section on "street" releases provides the reader with information on the total number of persons returned to the community by the county of original commitment rather than solely the first releases dealt with previously in this report.

TIME SERVED FOR "STREET" RELEASES: COUNTY OF COMMITMENT

Two-thirds of the total male releases had been committed from the five counties which comprise New York City. An additional 10.5% had been committed from counties suburban to New York City with the remaining 23.6% coming from other upstate counties. These male "street" releases served a median time of 20.4 months under DOCS custody which is somewhat the time served for first releases alone. A large majority of the males released, 85.7%, had served less than 3 years in department custody with inmates from New York City serving slightly longer periods than their suburban and upstate counterparts. The median time by New York City commitments was 20.8 months compared to 20.5 months by suburban commitments and 19.4 months by upstate commitments.

As with male commitments, one out of three women released during 1978 was from New York City. The suburban New York City area accounted for 10.2% and the upstate counties for 23.4%. The median time served by total women, released to the community was 16.9 months. Better than nine out of ten (95.9%) of the women released had served less than three years under DOCS custody. Women from New York City served slightly less median time, 16.7 months, than did those from suburban New York City, 17.8 months, and from upstate counties, 16.9 months.
