

CRIMINAL PRICE FIXING CASES 1972-78:
SELECTED DATA ON THE POTENTIAL FOR FILING
AND REPORTING CLASS ACTION LITIGATION

I. INTRODUCTION

In this report we divide all criminal price-fixing cases occurring between January 1972 and January 1979 into two groups: those that did and those that did not have subsequent or parallel filed class actions. Within the category of those that did have subsequent or parallel filed class actions a distinction is drawn between those with and those without subsequent reported class actions. For each of these groups an attempt is made to measure and analyze differences in characteristics of the cases involved. A summary of this effort appears in Tables 1-3.

In each case data was collected for: (1) the average number of defendants; (2) the average size of market; (3) the percentage of dispositions which were nolo contendere; (4) the average duration of criminal proceedings; (5) the average fine; (6) the average volume of sales involved; (7) the sales per capita for the industry; (8) the sales per charged firm; (9) a percentage breakdown by Standard Industrial Classification (SIC); and (10) the type of plaintiff, e.g., consumer, business, or government. The sales per capita and the sales per charged firm were calculated by using U.S. data. Specifically, the average volume of sales used to compute these items was calculated by taking the total sales of all the firms in the U.S. with the relevant SIC number and dividing those sales either by the U.S. populations or

by the total number of firms in the U.S. with that same SIC number. All dollar figures are adjusted to reflect 1978 prices.

The number of cases for which information was available is listed under most of the entries in Tables 1 and 2. The percentage of dispositions which were nolo contendere is given for the total number of cases in the relevant group, and the filing date was considered the official beginning of a proceeding.

II. CRIMINAL PRICE-FIXING CASES AND CLASS-ACTION LITIGATION

As the summary in Table 1 indicates, there are several important differences between criminal price-fixing cases that are followed by a class action and those that are not. The most dramatic are in average volume of sales, sales per capita, and sales per charged firm. Sales by any of these three measures are much higher for price-fixing cases followed or paralleled by a class action. Clearly these cases provide greater incentive for attorneys, consumers, and businesses to initiate a class action and this finding is not unexpected. In addition, the average size of the market for the class-action group is substantially larger, and, as indicated in Table 3, somewhat more defendants are classified as manufacturers, presumably serving larger markets. The data in Table 1 also reveals a slightly higher percentage of nolo contenderes and a shorter average duration for the class-action group. It is possible that these factors also influence the decision to initiate a class action.

Within the class-action group there are cases with class actions that were filed only and cases with both subsequent filed and reported class actions. We consider a reported class action as one that has been listed as a class action in at least one of the following sources: West's Federal Practice Digest 2d, Defendant Plaintiff Table, West's Publishing Co., St. Paul, vol. 85-86, 1978; CCH Trade Cases, Commerce Clearing House, Inc., Chicago, 1972-79; Class Action Reports, ed., Beyerly C. Moore, Jr., vol. 1-5, 1972-78; Class Actions, Herbert B. Newberg, McGraw-Hill Book Co., New York, vol. 1-6, 1977. Again differences appear that could shed some light on what characteristics influence the actual reporting of a class action. Since all the sales figures are greater for the group not reported in these sources, the financial aspects of a case do not appear to be a central determinant of reporting. The average size of the market, however, is almost 60 million larger in the reported than in the non-reported class actions. It would seem that implicit in the reporting of a class action is a very strong concern with the size of the affected class. Consistent with this finding is the fact that there is a higher percentage of manufacturing firms, and hence national markets, in the group of reported class actions.

III. THE DATA

All the government price-fixing cases from 1972 through January 1979 were obtained from a special listing provided by the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice.¹ Those cases which also had subsequent or parallel filed class actions were found by searching a special compilation of class actions prepared for the Center by the Administrative office of the U.S. Court.² The defendant-plaintiff indices and class-action publications noted above³ were searched to determine which cases had subsequent or parallel reported class actions.
