

INTRODUCTION

This Directory of Registered Apprenticeship Programs lists by region apprenticeship programs offered in the Federal Prison System. Apprenticeship training programs, in which inmates learn a skilled trade under the tutelage of an experienced craftworker, are approved at the state and national levels by the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training (BAT) of the U. S. Department of Labor. On successful completion of a registered apprenticeship program, the inmate receives a nationally recognized certificate of completion issued by the BAT.

Release success has been linked to the inmate's ability to find and retain employment. Apprenticeship gives inmates the opportunity to learn a trade through a standardized training program. Through completion of this program, inmates can apply for skilled, high paying jobs, secure that their training will be universally accepted.

The apprenticeship program has other benefits as well. Each program is established in conjunction with a local Joint Apprenticeship Committee, composed of volunteer representatives from labor and management. Working with institution staff, this Committee sponsors and oversees the apprenticeship program from

development through operations. As a result, the correctional community strengthens its community resources, increasing communication and mutual assistance and promoting improved inmate community ties.

The Federal Prison System, in cooperation with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, established its first apprenticeship program in 1968 at the U. S. Penitentiary, McNeil Island, Washington. Since that time, the number of registered apprenticeship programs in Federal prisons has grown to 245 at the close of fiscal year 1980 with 733 inmates enrolled in the program.

Please note that the asterisks throughout the directory indicate apprenticeship programs in Federal Prison Industries (UNICOR).



FPI-MAR-9-27-79-5N-2574

1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE §544.50. The Bureau of Prisons provides an inmate the opportunity to participate in apprenticeship training programs to prepare the inmate for career employment in various trades. It is the policy of the Bureau of Prisons to establish approved apprenticeship training programs for inmates in those areas of its institutions which have the potential to meet the requirements and standards of the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training (BAT), U.S. Department of Labor.]

The Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training (BAT), U.S. Department of Labor, through its Regional, State and area representatives, makes BAT personnel available to Bureau of Prisons educational staff for the development of registered apprenticeship training programs.

2. DIRECTIVES AFFECTED

- a. Directive Rescinded: P.S. 5350.10, Apprentice Training in Institutions.
- b. The rule cited in this statement is contained in 28 CFR 544.50.

3. BACKGROUND. The Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training is the nation's primary service agent for the development and implementation of approved apprenticeship programs. Through BAT's Washington Office of Special Activities and its Regional, State, and area offices, Federal and State correctional institutions can receive direct assistance in the establishment and registration of apprenticeship programs for inmates. By utilizing these services, the Bureau of Prisons is provided an excellent opportunity to take advantage of additional training resources within those institutional work areas where standards of apprenticeship can be applied for training inmates in various occupations.

4. PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITY. Establishing, implementing and administering apprentice training activities shall be under the direct supervision of the Supervisor of Education. In the process of attaining approved programs, the Supervisor of Education will work closely with and utilize the services of the Facilities Administrator, UNICOR Superintendent, shop foremen, education staff members, and other institutional service personnel responsible for areas of work or service that are apprenticeable. The Supervisor of Education may appoint a member of the Education staff to serve as an apprenticeship coordinator. The Supervisor of Education shall be responsible for providing related instruction for apprenticeable trades. The Supervisor and/or the coordinator should be responsible for all contacts, actions, meetings, and discussions with officials of the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training and the advisory members of the Joint Apprenticeship


Training Committee. The Supervisor of Education shall consult with BAT's Apprenticeship Training Representative on all matters regarding the procedures and methods for program development as required by BAT's regulations for registered apprenticeship programs.

5. PLANS. Institutions shall strive for complete approval of all occupations within the institution which are officially defined as apprenticeable and which have the potential to meet BAT's requirements and standards for registration at the national or state level. The Supervisor of Education will include in the Annual Plan those apprenticeable occupations which have the best possibility for approval and registration by the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training.

6. PROCEDURES. The Supervisor of Education is responsible for initiating the following procedures:

- a. Reviewing apprenticeship opportunities in all areas of the institution;
- b. Contacting the BAT Regional Director in the appropriate area and requesting a meeting with BAT representatives for discussing the prospects of organizing an apprenticeship program;
- c. Reporting in writing the results and progress of the meeting to the Regional Education Administrator with a copy of the report to the Education Administrator in the Central Office;
- d. Requesting through the Regional Office and Central Office any assistance required for the establishment of these programs; and
- e. Submitting an approved copy of the Standards and Registration Certificate to the Regional and Central Offices.

7. AUDIT RESPONSIBILITY. The Regional Education Administrator is responsible for an annual audit of the apprenticeship programs in each institution within that region.
