

P R E F A C E

This report covers commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms; it should be noted that this confinement in jail does not reflect whether a person has been judged innocent or guilty. A separate commitment is reported each time a person is confined in jail on a charge of having violated a law or an ordinance, for being inebriated or insane, as a material witness in a criminal case, for investigation, for protection, or for any other reason. The confinement may be before or after adjudication of the case in which the prisoner is involved. A person who is recommitted after being released on bond or otherwise released is reported each time he is placed in jail.

The statistics in this report were obtained from the forms DC-J6-Record of Prisoners Confined. These forms are submitted monthly by the individual jails and jail farms to the Virginia Department of Corrections, Division of Finance, Jails Reimbursement Unit. The primary purpose of these documents is to serve as a basis for determining costs of operation and the amount of State reimbursement to local jails and city jail farms. To serve the secondary function, that of providing statistical data, the forms are then transferred to the Electronic Data Processing Unit for editing and computer processing. The final statistical report is prepared by the Research and Reporting Unit.

Data from similar annual jail reports are available back to 1943 and copies of more recent annual jail reports are available for fiscal years 1970 through 1979. All questions, remarks or requests relating to the report should be directed to the following agency:



**Commitments to County and City Jails and City Jail Farms
Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1980**

During fiscal year 1980 there were 181,454 commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms. This represents a 4.1 percent increase over commitments during 1979 (174,350).


RACE AND SEX

Among the jail commitments, 64.7 percent were white and 35.3 percent were non-white. The number of males received was 164,129 or 90.4 percent. The number of females was 17,325 or 9.6 percent. This has not significantly changed from last fiscal year when females comprised 10.0 percent of the commitments.



AGE

Last fiscal year there were 3,956 persons committed who were under age eighteen. During fiscal year 1980, 2.2 percent of the commitments (3,975) were in this category, which represents a 0.5 percent increase since last year.





OFFENSE

An analysis of the offenses for fiscal 1980 shows that Offenses Against Decency, Peace and Good Order were the most frequent (56,447 or 31.1 percent); traffic offenses ranked second, with 38,741 or 21.4 percent.



Specifically, the most common offenses were Drunkenness/Drunk and Disorderly, which represented nearly one quarter of all commitments (24.9 percent). The second most frequent offense was Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (13.2 percent).

Incarceration for violations of the narcotic laws accounted for only 6,600 commitments or 3.6 percent. This represents a decrease from last fiscal year, when 4.2 percent of the commitments were in this category.



TYPE OF OFFENSE

Of the total commitments, more than half were charged with misdemeanors (99,808 or 55.0 percent), which is a slight increase from last year when 54.1 percent were committed for misdemeanors. The persons committed on local ordinances ("other offenses") numbered 43,967 (24.2 percent) while 37,679 persons (20.8 percent) were charged with felony offenses.



PLACE COMMITTED FROM

Virginia counties accounted for 50.7 percent of the jail commitments and the cities accounted for 49.3 percent of the commitments. Of the 92,056 commitments from the counties, Fairfax had by far the greatest share, with 12,490, Arlington committed 5,066 and Henrico committed 4,745 prisoners. Of the 89,398 city commitments, Richmond had 16,474, Norfolk had 15,998, and Newport News had 9,948.

CAPACITY AND POPULATION ANALYSIS

The average of the rated capacities for all of the jails in Virginia is 54 beds. The total rated capacity for all of the jail facilities was 5,249 on June 30, 1980. In comparison, the average daily population for a Virginia jail facility was slightly less than this average rated capacity. During fiscal year 1980 the average population was 50.0 persons, which is a slight increase from fiscal 1979 when the average population was 49.7 persons.

The average number of commitments during fiscal year 1980 for the 97 jail facilities was 1,871, which is an increase over the 1979 average of 1,797 commitments. The average prisoner days in 1980 was 18,319 days as compared to 18,137 days for fiscal year 1979. Although the average number of commitments is rising, the average length of confinement per prisoner dropped slightly during fiscal year 1980. The average length of stay per commitment during fiscal 1980 was 9.8 days. Last fiscal year the average length of stay was 10.1 days.

Only 34 jails recorded more total prisoner days than capacity days available. There were 99 days during fiscal year 1980 when the total prisoner days for all Virginia jails exceeded the total State capacity.




ILLUSTRATION OF

DESCRIPTION

Rated Capacity is extracted from the Population Survey of Local Correctional Institutions. It is the design capacity of each jail and does not necessarily represent the number of beds in the jail.

Maximum is the highest recorded population for each jail during the fiscal year.

Capacity Days are determined by multiplying the rated capacity of each jail by 365 days.

Actual Prisoner Days are the total number of prisoner days recorded by each jail for the entire fiscal year.

Net Difference is recorded as positive when the rated capacity is greater than the total prisoner days. Jails with negative numbers are therefore overcrowded.

Percentage Difference is the net difference divided by the capacity days.

Days Above Rated Capacity are the number of days during the fiscal year that the number of prisoners being held exceeded the rated capacity.

Percent of Year Over Capacity is the number of days over capacity divided by 365, the total days in a year.
