



Approving the Interception of Wire or Oral
Communications**

This report is submitted under the provisions of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2519(3). The statute requires that each April the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts shall transmit to Congress a report concerning the number of applications for orders authorizing or approving the interception of wire or oral communications. This report includes statistics on the number of applications and extensions granted or denied during calendar year 1980, together with a summary and analysis of the data required by law to be filed with the Administrative Office of the United States Courts by federal and state judges and prosecuting officials.

This is the thirteenth report filed under the Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance provisions of Title III of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, approved on June 18, 1968 (82 Stat. 218). This report summarizes the period from January 1, 1980 to December 31, 1980.

The requirements of the statute and the regulations are explained in Sections I and II of the text. Section III provides a summary and analysis of the reports submitted by judges, while Section IV presents a summary and analysis of reports completed by prosecuting officials. The last two sections of the narrative are concerned with information reported in calendar year 1980 which relates to all intercepts authorized since 1969.

The appendix consists of four tables. Table A-1 contains all reports filed by federal judges and prosecuting officials for intercepts terminated during calendar year 1980. Table B-1 presents the same information for reports filed by state judges and state prosecuting officials. The supplementary reports submitted by federal and state prosecuting officials (concerning additional activity during 1980 as a result of intercepts previously reported) are provided in tables A-2 and B-2, respectively.

I. Reporting Requirements of the Statute

Title 18 U.S.C. Section 2519(1) requires that every state and federal judge file a written report with the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts on each application for an order authorizing the interception of a wire or oral communication. This report, furnished within 30 days of the denial or expiration of the court order (including all extensions), must contain certain detailed information including the name of the applicant, the offense specified in the application, the type of interception device, the type of location, and the duration of the authorized intercept.

Prosecuting officials, who applied for intercept orders, are required to submit reports to the Administrative Office in January of each year for each order which expired the previous calendar year. These reports contain information relating to the cost of the intercept, the number of days the intercept device was in actual operation, the total number of intercepts, and the number of incriminating intercepts recorded. The results of the intercepts in terms of arrests, trials, convictions, and the number of motions to suppress evidence obtained through the use of the intercept are also provided.

The judge or the prosecutor does not submit information concerning the identity (name, address, or phone number) of the parties to the interception. The Administrative Office is not authorized to collect this type of information.

This report tabulates the number of applications for interceptions which were granted or denied, as reported by judges, as well as the number of applications where interception devices were installed, as reported by prosecuting officials. No statistics are available on the number of devices installed for each application.

II. Regulations

First developed by the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts in November 1968, the regulations and reporting forms were last revised in April 1979. Additional changes are being made in 1981 to further simplify completion of the reporting form. Copies of the regulations, and the federal wiretapping statute may be obtained by writing the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, Washington, D.C. 20544.

According to the statute only the Attorney General (or his designee) may authorize an application to a federal judge for an order authorizing interception of wire or oral communications. For those states with wiretapping legislation applications may be made only by a prosecuting attorney, "if such attorney is authorized by a statute of that State to make an application to a State court judge of competent jurisdiction." Data on wiretaps terminated during the current year appear in appendix tables A-1 (federal) and B-1 (state).

Since many wiretap orders are related to large scale criminal investigations which cross county and state boundaries, arrests, trials, and convictions resulting from these interceptions often do not occur within the same year as the installation of the intercept device. Therefore, Title 18 U.S.C. Section 2519(2) requires that supplementary reports be filed by prosecuting officials concerning additional court or police activity occurring as a result of intercepts reported in prior years. Appendix tables A-2 (federal) and B-2 (state) describe the additional activity reported by prosecuting officials in their supplementary reports.

Table 1 lists the Federal government and 27 states which have laws authorizing courts to issue orders permitting wiretapping and electronic surveillance. Two states, Idaho and Louisiana, have been added since last year. Neither state reported the use of any wiretap during 1980.

III. Summary and Analysis of Reports by Judges

The name of the judge responsible for the original authorization appears in the appendix. The data, reported for calendar year 1980, includes only those orders for which the period of interception concluded during 1980.

During calendar year 1980, 566 applications for orders to intercept wire or oral communications were made to state and federal judges. One of these applications was denied by a federal judge in the Western District of Oklahoma, while another was denied by a state judge in Norfolk County, Massachusetts. Of the 564 applications granted, 483 (85.6 percent) were granted by state judges, while federal judges issued 81 wiretap orders.

State judges in New Jersey authorized 177 applications, accounting for 31.4 percent of the total. This represents a substantial 20.4 percent increase over the 147 orders issued by New Jersey state judges a year ago. State judges in New York signed 128 orders. Intercepts authorized and approved in New York and New Jersey comprised 54.1 percent of all wiretap authorizations during 1980.

Table 2 summarizes the intercept orders authorized by each reporting jurisdiction, the intercept orders reported as amended, the extensions granted, and the average length of the original authorizations and extensions. The 564 wiretap orders authorized in 1980 was a modest 2.0 percent increase over the 553 authorized in 1979. This rise in authorizations reversed a six year decreasing trend. The number of authorizations this year was still 34.7 percent below the 864 wiretap authorizations during calendar year 1973, the record high year. State authorizations rose 3.6 percent during 1980, while orders issued by federal judges decreased 6.9 percent. Table 2 also reflects the total number of days the intercepts were actually in operation, and the location where the interception of communication occurred.

A. Authorized Length of Intercepts

The authorized length of time for the 564 applications granted varied from one to 180 days. The longest (which included five extensions) was for a federal wiretap in the Eastern District of Louisiana. The average length of an original authorization was 24 days - the same as in 1979; while the average length of the 201 extensions was 21 days (compared to 20 days in 1979). The total number of days in operation where communications were intercepted varied from one day to 175 days for the same federal wiretap in the Eastern District of Louisiana. Seventeen original intercepts were reported as amended. The amendments usually required an addition or change to a telephone line, the persons to be monitored, or the offenses under investigation.

B. Offenses

There was a wide range of offenses specified in the applications for court orders. Many applications specified more than one criminal violation. Table 3 illustrates the most serious offense named in the applications. In this report, where the offense listed was related to any violation of drug laws, the offense appears as "narcotics." Narcotics was the most serious offense specified in 282 wiretap orders, or exactly one-half the total. Gambling offenses (including bookmaking) were under investigation in 199 authorizations, accounting for 35.3 percent of the total. Racketeering was cited as the major offense in 29 applications, all of which were approved by federal judges.

C. Locations

For the twelfth consecutive year the location most often reported was a "single family dwelling" which accounted for 232, or 41.1 percent of the total. Apartments were the location for 153 interceptions (27.1 percent), while 89 intercepts (15.8 percent) were placed in business locations. Other locations of authorized interceptions of wire or oral communications included 17 multiple dwellings and another 40 were combinations of business and living quarters. In 33 interceptions, the location specified was a public pay telephone, an automobile, a briefcase, or social club.

IV. Summary and Analysis of Reports by Prosecuting Officials

Eighty-four state jurisdictions, as well as the U. S. Department of Justice, submitted reports on wiretap authorizations. Five jurisdictions did not submit any information on the intercepts reported by judges as terminated in 1980, while one jurisdiction submitted reports on some, but not all, of their communications intercepts. For those jurisdictions, the phrase "No prosecutor's report" is used in the appendix tables.

The reporting numbers used in the appendix tables are reference numbers assigned by the Administrative Office of the United States Courts and do not correspond to the authorization or application numbers used by the reporting jurisdiction. The same reference number is used for any supplemental information which may be reported for the communications intercept in subsequent reports (in Appendix tables A-2 and B-2).

A. Nature of Intercepts

Of the 564 applications granted, there were 524 prosecutors' reports which included information on the average number of intercepts per day, the number of persons intercepted, the total number of communications intercepted and the number of incriminating intercepts. Twenty-one authorized intercepts were reported as never installed, while an additional 19 prosecutors' reports were not received.

The average number of intercepts per day ranged from zero to 592 for a federal wiretap in the District of Minnesota which was in operation for 30 days. The average number of persons whose conversations were intercepted was 136 per installed intercept, a substantial 130.5 percent rise over the same figure in 1979. The number of conversations overheard ranged from zero to 22,673 for a federal wiretap in the Eastern District of Louisiana. The average number of intercepts was 1,058 per order. The largest number of conversations intercepted in a single state wiretap was 14,790 by the State Attorney General of New York. Almost 30 percent of the conversational intercepts produced incriminating evidence. A summary of the average number of intercepted communications by jurisdiction appears in Table 4.

A telephone wiretap was the electronic surveillance device used in 475 or 90.6 percent of the 524 installed intercepts. Twenty-seven wiretaps used microphone eavesdrops while more than one type of device was used in 22 cases. Table 6 presents the type of surveillance used for each intercept installed.

B. Cost of Intercepts

For the fifth consecutive year, costs for installing and monitoring intercepts increased. The average cost for the 500 intercept orders for which a cost figure was reported was \$17,146, a 4.3 percent rise over the average cost of \$16,437 reported in 1979. Over the last five years costs have risen 146.0 percent. A summary of the cost information by jurisdiction appears in Table 5.

The highest reported cost for a single federal wiretap authorization was \$446,844 for a combined telephone wiretap and microphone eavesdrop in the Eastern District of Louisiana. It was in operation a total of 56 days and the offenses specified were racketeering, bribery, and obstruction of justice. Ten other federal wiretaps had costs in excess of \$100,000.

For state wiretaps, the highest cost for a single authorization was recorded by the Sixth Judicial Circuit of Florida which includes Pasco and Pinellas Counties. This telephone wiretap cost \$81,000 for 71 days of operation. The offense specified was narcotics and resulted in 17 arrests.

C. Arrests and Convictions

There were 1,871 persons arrested as a result of intercepts installed during calendar year 1980. Of these, 259 defendants (13.8 percent) were convicted. These figures are incomplete because many of the criminal cases for which electronic surveillance has been reported in 1980 are still under active investigation. Additional costs, arrests, trials, motions to suppress, and convictions resulting from these intercepts will be reported by prosecutors in future supplementary reports. Table 6 shows the number of persons arrested and convicted as a result of 1980 interceptions.

V. Summary January 1 - December 31, 1970-1980

Table 7 summarizes authorized intercepts as to location and major offense for calendar years 1970 through 1980 as well as the average number of persons intercepted. Costs in 1980 were as follows:

VI. Supplementary Reports

During 1980, there were 704 arrests and 645 convictions at an additional cost of \$551,946 as a result of 315 authorized intercepts completed in previous years. Table 8 summarizes the additional police and court activity by year and jurisdiction for wiretaps terminated from 1969 through 1980. The total number of arrests and convictions resulting from intercept devices installed in calendar years 1969 through 1980 is reflected in Table 9. Detailed data on all supplementary reports submitted in 1980 appear in appendix Tables A-2 and B-2 of this report.
