

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
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# **SECTION ONE**



**ARKANSAS

## GOALS

While many purposes and objectives for a Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program can be stated, the primary goals of the Arkansas UCR program are:

1. To collect, verify, and analyze statistical data reported by law enforcement agencies in Arkansas.
2. To provide data for use by law enforcement agencies in administrative and operational assessments, preventive measures and evaluation of criminal justice programs, and manpower assessments.
3. To provide data for agencies throughout the state that are interested in the criminal justice system.
4. To give an overview of crime in Arkansas on a statewide basis, as well as selected data on local levels; to examine the nature of crime in Arkansas with its magnitude and trends; to provide this information to the above agencies and to the public.
5. To furnish Arkansas' Uniform Crime Reporting data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

In this annual report, definitions will be given where they are considered to be of most value to the reader, rather than in the introductory section.

## HISTORY OF UCR IN ARKANSAS

The Arkansas Crime Information Center was created in 1971 under the name of the Criminal Justice and Highway Safety Information Center pursuant to Arkansas General Act 286. The agency was transferred to the Department of Public Safety in 1975 by Act 742 and received its present name (ACIC) under Act 375 of 1979. The Department of Public Safety was abolished in July 1981 by Act 45 of 1981 and ACIC became an independent agency.

In outlining agency responsibilities, regarding crime statistics, the statute states: "The Center shall collect data and compile statistics on the nature and extent of crime ...in Arkansas and compile other data related to planning for and operating criminal justice agencies...the Center shall also periodically publish statistics...and report such information to the Governor, the General Assembly, federal, state and local criminal justice agencies, and the general public." Ark. Stat. Ann. §5-1102.

One component of the total Crime Information System is Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR). The responsibility for the collection of UCR data was assumed for the state by ACIC on January 1, 1974. Prior to 1974, Arkansas law enforcement agencies submitted UCR data directly to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The data collected under the current program is more descriptive of the entire state, offers training and assistance locally, verifies reports, and makes data analyses responsive to local needs. The data collected by the Arkansas Uniform Crime Reporting Program are forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for inclusion in national crime statistics.

## REPORTING PROCEDURE AND VERIFICATION

Law enforcement agencies, including municipal police departments, county sheriff's offices, and university campus security officers, send data to ACIC monthly. These reports comprise the data for:

1. Selected offenses reported to or discovered by, the submitting agency.
2. Type and value of property stolen and recovered.
3. Supplementary homicide information.
4. Law enforcement officers killed or assaulted.
5. Arrests of adults (including age, sex, race information).
6. Arrests of juveniles—under 18 years of age (including age, sex, race information).

These reports are checked for uniformity and accuracy. When a question arises concerning submitted data, the agency is contacted for verification or correction. When minor changes are made, the reporting agency is notified for correction of its copy.

## SCOPE OF UCR

Crime is separated into Part I and Part II offenses for UCR reporting purposes.

On a monthly basis, the number of offenses verified by law enforcement agencies for Part I crimes are reported. Related supplementary information is also submitted. Arrest data is reported for Part I and Part II offenses. The number of law enforcement employees are reported on an annual basis.

**CRIME INDEX**

It is the Crime Index offenses which are widely publicized by the news media and which are often used to assess the criminality of a given locale. The eight selected offenses (Crime Index) used to measure the extent, fluctuation, and distribution of crimes are:

**VIOLENT CRIMES**

1. Murder
2. Forcible rape
3. Robbery
4. Aggravated assault

**PROPERTY CRIMES**

5. Burglary
6. Larceny
7. Motor vehicle theft
8. Arson

The Crime Index offenses differ from Part I offenses in that manslaughter by negligence is not included in the Index.

Crime Rates for a given locale are established based upon the Crime Index offenses. The crime rate is one of the most often quoted crime statistics. This rate is a number representing the number of offenses (Index) in a year per 100,000 population. This number is obtained by:

$$\frac{\text{(Number of Index Offenses)}}{\text{(Population)}} \times 100,000 = \text{CRIME RATE}$$

For example, the Arkansas crime rate for all index offenses in 1980 is 3,850 per 100,000 population. This particular rate is based on all offenses reported statewide and a population coverage of 2,243,998. This adjusted population is the average population covered by UCR reporting on a monthly basis.

Crime Trends for a given locale are stated as a percent change over a comparable previous period. A negative percent would denote a decrease. Crime trends are generally established using only data from agencies with 12 months' reporting for two years. In this report, however, raw data from all agencies will be used to establish percent changes, (e.g. Robbery in Arkansas for December 1980 was up 26% as compared to December 1979. There were three more agencies reporting data in December 1979 than 1980).

## STATISTICAL FEEDBACK

While the information reported by law enforcement agencies is collected and analyzed by ACIC, one of the primary objectives of the UCR program is to provide reliable and meaningful data to the reporting agencies.

It is a function of ACIC to furnish statistical feedback to the reporting agencies and to other agencies interested in the criminal justice system. Current feedback includes the following:

1. Monthly: Crime Info, a report giving statewide totals and trends (percent changes) for Index Offenses. Data used in these trends are from agencies which reported for both the current and previous year. Year-to-date totals and trends for all agencies are also included.
2. Quarterly: Crime Info, a report giving the same information as a monthly Crime Info plus year-to-date totals on arrests and the type and value of property stolen and recovered.
3. Annually: Crime in Arkansas, a comprehensive report of statewide and local crime data.  
  
Rape In Arkansas, a comprehensive report of statewide rape data collected as a supplement to the UCR program.
4. Special Reports: Crime In Arkansas by Population Groupings, a report detailing significant crime data in sections according to population. This report is used mainly by law enforcement administrators.  
  
Reports requested by state, county, and municipal agencies involved in the criminal justice system.  
  
Reports requested by the news media.  
  
All other special data requested from various sources.

## LIMITATIONS OF UCR AND DATA COMPARISONS

While Uniform Crime Reporting is the best source of data available at the present time, it has been subject to much criticism during its history. Many of these commentaries are valid. The criticism is weakened when it is remembered that the program was developed to furnish information for use primarily by law enforcement agencies.

The obvious reaction to a publication of this sort is to make comparisons of data between jurisdictions, whether they be intrastate, regional, interstate, or national. Caution should be exercised for the many reasons which will become apparent as the reader continues through this publication. Comparisons may not be significant because of the great variety of factors which affect the extent and fluctuation of crime and which are not taken into consideration in either raw data or crime rates. All crimes are considered "equal" in computing crime rates. One murder affects a crime rate the same as one larceny. Another facet which limits comparisons is contributor history. The average number of reporting agencies in Arkansas has increased 73% from 1975 to 1980. The population coverage increased from 76.8% to 98.2%.

The Uniform Crime Reporting programs are designed to measure offenses reported and persons arrested. Difficulty will arise if this distinction is not kept uppermost in mind. Crime relates to events, but arrest relates to persons, and this is not a one-to-one correspondence. Crime (or offense/event) data are only collected for Part I offenses. The type and value of property stolen is requested only for Part I offenses. The number of arrests according to age, sex, and race is the only information submitted for Part II offenses. There is an obvious information gap here. Again, the Uniform Crime Reports are the best information available, while no claim is made that they represent "all crime" or any set portion of it.

## ARSON

The Congress of the United States has designated arson as a Part I crime and determined that it should be included in Crime Index. Because the state started collecting arson offense data late in 1979, only limited data will be included in this annual report.

## CRIME FACTORS

There are inherent limitations in current crime reporting practices. Of primary importance is the question of how much crime is being reported. Law enforcement agencies are only capable of reporting crimes known to them. In many instances, citizens do not report crimes directly to these agencies but may report them to the prosecuting authorities. A considerable volume of crime is not reported to law enforcement agencies because the victims

may consider the offenses against them to be of very little consequence; they believe there is nothing the police can do about them; they fear retaliation from offenders; or have shared willingly in such offenses as illegal sex acts, gambling or drug usage. Consequently, information concerning some offenses is never entered in the present statistical reporting system.


The information collected for this report is the most accurate crime information currently available in Arkansas. Caution should be exercised, however, in making direct comparisons of crime and arrest data reported by different law enforcement jurisdictions. Likewise, when comparing offense and arrest data, the reader should keep in mind that crimes relate to events while arrests relate to persons. A single criminal act may involve several crimes, several offenders, and several victims.

Set forth below are some additional conditions which will, by type and volume, affect the crime that occurs from place to place. These same conditions will also affect the amount of crime actually reported.

1. Density and size of the community population and metropolitan areas of which it is a part.
2. Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex, and race.
3. Economic status and mores of the population.
4. Relative stability of population including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types.
5. Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.
6. Educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
7. Effective strength of the police force.
8. Standards governing appointment to the police force.
9. Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.
10. Attitude of the public towards law and enforcement problems.
11. The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency including the degree of adherence to crime standards.

Current methods of gathering and reporting offense and arrest data, because they are influenced by many variables, provide a less than complete picture of criminality in our society. However, despite these shortcomings, there is at present no other information system available that will more adequately perform this task.


## METROPOLITAN CRIME

# MURDER

Murder is defined in Uniform Crime Reporting as the willful killing of another. The classification, as in all of the other Crime Index offenses, is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body.

Deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, or justifiable homicide are not included in the count for this offense classification. Attempts to kill or assaults to kill are counted as aggravated assaults and not as murder.

In 1980 there were 206 murders in Arkansas with seven additional justifiable homicides. This is a 6.2 increase in actual murders and no change in the rate per 100,000 since 1979. Approximately 71% of these murders occurred in a one victim/one offender situation.

Murder accounted for 0.2% of the total Crime Index and 2.7% of the Violent Crime Index. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions in the state (representing populations of more than 50,000 each) accounted for 39% of all murders.




## MURDER

The oldest victim was 75 years of age and the youngest, a newborn, less than a week old. The most frequent victims were ages 20, 23, 32 and 33. The 20-35 year old age groups accounted for almost half (45%) of the victims.

## RAPE

Forcible rape, as defined under this program, is the carnal knowledge of a female through the use of force or the threat of force. Assaults to commit forcible rape are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) is not counted in this category.

There were 592 forcible rapes in Arkansas during 1980. This is a 1% increase in actual offenses and a 5% decrease in the rate per 100,000 since 1979.

Rape accounted for 0.7% of the total Crime Index and 7.8% of the Violent Crime Index. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions in the state (representing populations of more than 50,000 each) accounted for 56% of all rapes.



### DISTRIBUTION OF RAPE TYPE



# ROBBERY

Robbery is the taking of property or things of value from a person by use of force or threat of force. Assault to commit robbery and attempts are included. This is a violent crime and frequently results in injury to the victim.

There were 1,841 robberies in Arkansas in 1980. Robberies represented 2.1% of the Crime Index and 24.2% of the Violent Crimes. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 50,000 each) accounted for 65% of all robberies.


Firearms were used in 59% of the robberies. The average dollar stolen during a robbery was \$515. Street robberies accounted for nearly 15% of all robberies.



## AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Attempts are included.

There were 4,954 aggravated assaults in Arkansas during 1980. Aggravated assaults accounted for 5.7% of the Crime Index and for 65.2% of the Violent Crimes. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 50,000 each) accounted for 46% of all aggravated assaults in the state.

There were 4,504 additional non-aggravated assaults reported during 1980.





### BURGLARY


Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify the crime as a burglary. The subclassifications of burglary are: forcible entry, unlawful entry without force, and attempted forcible entry.

There were 25,110 burglaries in Arkansas in 1980. Burglaries accounted for 29.1% of the state's Crime Index Offenses and 31.9% of the Property Crimes. 

### LARCENY BY MONTH 1979-80



## MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor vehicle theft is defined as the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts. This excludes the taking for temporary use by those persons having lawful access to the vehicle.

There were 4,210 motor vehicles stolen in Arkansas in 1980. The value of the stolen motor vehicles was \$14.7 million. Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 4.9% of the Crime Index offenses and 5.3% of the Property Crime offenses. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (population over 50,000) accounted for 42% of all motor vehicle thefts in 1980.





# ARSON

Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempts to burn, with or without attempt to defraud.

There were 644 Arsons reported in Arkansas in 1980. The value of the property damage was \$12.4 million. Arson accounted for 0.7% of the Crime Index offenses and 0.8% of the Property Crime offenses. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (population over 50,000) accounted for 34% of all arsons in 1980.







# ARREST DATA

## ARRESTS — DEFINITIONS

Arrest data is collected on all offenses. The offenses not previously defined are listed below.

Manslaughter by Negligence - The killing of another person, by gross negligence.

Non-aggravated Assaults - All assaults and attempted assaults which are not of an aggravated nature and do not result in serious injury to the victim.

Forgery and Counterfeiting - Making, altering, uttering, or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true or the attempt to do any of the above.

Fraud - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining of money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks except forgeries and counterfeiting.

Embezzlement - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

Stolen Property; Buying, Receiving, Possessing - Buying, receiving, or possessing of stolen property as well as all attempts of the above.

Vandalism - Willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

Weapons; Carrying, Possessing, etc. - All violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons.

Prostitution and Commercialized Vice - Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as prostitution, procuring, or the transportation of women for immoral purposes.

Sex Offenses - Statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like.

Narcotic Drug Laws - Offenses relating to narcotic drugs, such as unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs.

Gambling - Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

Offenses Against the Family and Children - Non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.

Driving Under the Influence - Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

Liquor Laws - State or local liquor law violations, except for driving under the influence and drunkenness.

Drunkenness - Drunkenness or intoxication.

Disorderly Conduct - A breach of the peace.

Vagrancy - Vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

All other offenses - All violations of state or local laws not covered previously except traffic.

Suspicion - Arrests for no specific offense and released without formal charges being placed.

Curfew and Loitering Laws (juveniles) - Offenses relating to violation of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

Runaway (juveniles) - Limited to juveniles taken into protective custody under the provisions of local statutes.






