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INTRODUCTION

The Analysis of Victims of Part I Reported Crimes began in 1977. Jacksonville was one of early cities to realize the importance of analysis of victim data. All information contained in this report is derived from a computer program of the victim information obtained by the patrol officer when completing a General Offense/Incident Report. Since the implementation of the analysis, the collection of victim data by the patrol officer has been more complete.

Small incremental changes among sex, race, and age should not be considered as an indication of trend. Even a large fluctuation such as in the crime of murder, should be closely examined because of the relatively small number of reported incidents.

There are many variables influencing the reported victimization rates. Some identified variables are:

fluctuation and trends among crime reporting
shifts in property ownership
age shifts in the population
specific crime incidences (multiple murder)
prosecution emphasis (welfare fraud)
shifts in crime trends (decrease in burglary possibly due to enforcement of the Precious Metal Ordinance)
economic conditions (decrease in social aid programs, recession)
preventive measures (Neighborhood Watch and community education).

HIGHLIGHTS OF VICTIM ANALYSIS FOR 1981

The analysis of victims of Part I reported crime in Jacksonville for 1981 resulted in the following findings:





Males represented 58% of the victims of Part I Crimes and females 42%. In 1980, there was a slight increase (4%) of total victimization of females. Between 1980 and 1981 the percentage of total female victimization remained constant, but an increase was noticed in robbery (4%) and auto theft (4%).

Whites were the victims of Part I Crimes 73% and blacks 27%. An increase of black victimization by 2% was noted this year. Since the Analysis of Victims began in 1977, the victimization by race has remained constant at 75% (white) and 25% (black). The increase of reported black victimization occurred in the crime of larceny (2% increase among blacks).

The age group 25-34 continued to be victimized more (29%) than any other age group in all Part I Crimes. Persons 15-24 were victimized the most (35%) in the violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery, and assault).





The age group 25-34 was victimized most frequently (28%) in the property crimes (breaking and entering burglary, larceny, and auto theft). The most significant change in 1981 occurred among the "unknown age" category. It appears that efficiency in the acquisition of victim data has increased among the patrol officers. In 1979, the age of the victim was unknown in 9% of the total Part I crimes. In 1981, the "unknown age" category had decreased to 3% with the largest decrease being in property crimes. The implementation of a new reporting form in 1980 could be the influencing factor.

● FEMALE









1981 PART I REPORTED CRIME




