#### ABSTRACT

The furlough program has been in operation by the Massachusetts Department of Correction since November 6, 1972. A total of 75,515 furloughs have been granted between the inception of the program and December 31, 1981. During that period, 573 of those furloughs resulted in escapes (a resident failing to return to his/her correctional facility within two hours of his/her designated time), thus yielding an overall escape rate of 0.8%. The present report contains a statistical description of the furlough program for the year 1981 as well as a trend analysis of the program since its inception in 1972.

From January 1, 1981 to December 31, 1981, a total of 8,196 furloughs were granted. The number of individuals furloughed in 1981 was 1,248. The escape rate by furloughs granted during 1981 was 0.4% and the escape rate by individual furloughed was 2.7%.

#### . INTRODUCTION

This report is a statistical description of the Massachusetts Department of Correction furlough program for the year 1981. Included is some information on trends for the program from its inception in 1972 until the end of the year 1981.

The report is divided into two sections. The first section gives an overview of pertinent furlough statistics for the year 1981 only. Section II provides a brief overview of the Massachusetts furlough program. Comparisons of furlough characteristics over the past nine years are discussed. In addition, this section contains escape rates on background variables of an individual for each furlough granted during 1981. The background variables include personal background characteristics, present offense variables, criminal history variables, and furlough variables.

The data for the tables in this report were derived from the computerized data base developed by the Correction and Parole Management Information System (CAPMIS) and were produced on the Massachusetts State College Computer Network (MSCCN).

## STATISTICAL FACT SHEET ON THE MASSACHUSETTS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FURLOUGH PROGRAM - 1981

#### 1981 Statistics

From January 1, 1981 to December 31, 1981, a total of 8,196 furloughs were granted. The number of individuals furloughed in 1981 was 1,248. The average number of furloughs per resident was approximately 7.

#### Escape Rate by Furlough - 1981

During 1981, out of the 8,196 furloughs granted, 34 resulted in escape for an escape rate (by furlough) of 0.4% for 1981.

#### Escape Rate by Individual Furloughed in 1981

Of the 1,248 individuals furloughed in 1981, 34 were declared on escape status. The escape rate by individual furloughed was 2.7%.

#### Late Returns for 1981

For 1981, there were 182 cases which were classified as late returns. These 182 cases involved 157 individuals. These 157 individuals all returned within two hours of their designated time of return. Twenty-five individuals voluntarily returned within the two hour period more than once during 1981.

#### Furloughs by Security Level - 1981

During 1981, 483 furloughs were from maximum or medium security institutions, representing 6% of the furloughs granted during 1981. There were 2,193 furloughs granted from minimum security (representing 27%) and 5,520 furloughs from pre-release (representing 67% of the furloughs granted during 1981). Table I presents information on furloughs by security level for 1981 along with the corresponding escape rates.

#### SECTION I

Statistical Fact Sheet on the Massachusetts Furlough Program, 1981

### Proportion of Reseases Participating in Furlough Program - 1981

From January 1, 1981 to December 31, 1981, the Department of Correction released 1,118 residents to the community. Of that total, 663 had received one or more furloughs before release (59%). The remaining 41% of the individuals released had not participated in the furlough program during their incarceration.

#### Individuals Returning Voluntarily During 1981

There were fourteen individuals who were on escape status from their furloughs and returned voluntarily within 24 hours from their return time. These 14 individuals represent 41% of the 34 persons who were declared on escape status.

## Furloughs Monthly in Proportion to Average Population - 1981

Out of an average population of 3,478, an average of 437 individuals received a furlough in one of the months of 1981. This results in an average proportion of 12.6% of the population being furloughed in a month. The overwhelming majority (76%) of the population is housed in maximum or medium security institutions in an average month in 1981; on the average, 1.3% of this population received a furlough during 1981. During a typical month in 1981, 37% of the minimum security population and 60% of the pre-release population received furloughs.

Table II presents information on the number of individuals furloughed in proportion to the average population for 1981.

#### SECTION II

Furlough Statistics Since Inception of Program

#### OVERVIEW

The furlough program for residents of Massachusetts correctional facilities has been operating since November 6, 1972. Between that date and December 31, 1981, a total of 75,515 furloughs have been granted. In 573 cases, individuals have failed to return to their respective correctional facility within two hours of their prescribed time of return. Thus, since the inception of the program there has been an overall escape rate of 0.8%

Table III presents a summary of furlough statistics for the years 1972 to 1981. For each of these years information regarding the number of furloughs, the number of individuals furloughed, the number of escapes, and corresponding escape rates is presented.

As Table III shows, the escape rates by furlough have decreased from 1973 to 1980 with 1981's rate slightly higher and range from a high of 1.9% to a low of 0.3%. Similarly, the escape rates by individual have also decreased during this time frame from a high of 7.6% to a low of 2.0%

Since the inception of the furlough program, the number of individuals furloughed per year has decreased. From 1973 to 1980, the number of individuals furloughed decreased from 1,868 to 1,193— a decline of 36%. From 1980 to 1981, the number of individuals furloughed increased by 5%. The escape rate by individuals furloughed has also decreased from 1973 to 1980 with the rate in 1981 slightly higher than the rate in 1980. In 1973, the escape rate by individual was 7.2% and in 1980, the rate was 2.0%. The 1981 rate increased to 2.7%. While these trends were occurring, the percentage of individuals being released who had not participated in the furlough program prior to their release has increased. Table IV presents the data for the percentage of releases who participated in the furlough program prior to their release.

From 1973 to 1981, the number of releases increased by 16% as shown in Table IV. However, during this time the percentage of individuals released who have participated in the furlough program has decreased from 69% to 41%.

Tables V, VI, VII give furlough statistics by institution furloughed for the years 1973 to 1975, 1976 to 1978, and 1979 to 1981 respectively. The number of furloughs and the corresponding escape rates for each correctional institution is given. Although minor fluctuations have occurred at some institutions, the overall escape rates have been decreasing.

As Table VIII indicates, the percentage of the population in maximum and medium security institutions who received furloughs decreased from 15.2% in 1974 to only 1.3% in 1981. The 1981 percentage of minimum security individuals furloughed is the lowest since the inception of the program and the percentage in pre-release showed a drop of 6.7 percentage points from 1980 to 1981. Overall, the 1981 figure of 12.6% represents the lowest percentage of the population furloughed since the inception of the program and represents a decrease from 1980 of 1.5 percentage points.

At this juncture, the report looks at the escape rates of characteristics of individuals for each furlough granted for 1981. Information concerning an individual's present offense variables, personal background characteristics, criminal history variables, and furlough variables has been examined. In order to determine any significant relationships between the characteristics of the existing variables and their escape ratios, chi square statistics were computed. During 1979, there were ten variables that were found to be significant. They were: sex, known drug use, total number of court appearances, number of charges for person offenses, property offenses, drug offenses, and escape offenses, age at first court appearance, prior Department of Youth Service commitments, and total number of prior incarcerations. After examining the variables for 1980, the same characteristics were found to be significant.

After completing an analysis of the data for 1981, five of the ten variables were still significant. That is, women offenders with several prior court appearances, prior charges for property and drug offenses, and a first court appearance at age fifteen or younger have higher escape rates. Also, one additional variable—maximum sentence—was found to be significant. Those offenders with a maximum sentence of three years or less had higher escape rates than those offenders with maximum sentences of four years or more.

The tables that follow in Appendix I contain frequencies and escape rates of characteristics of individuals for each furlough granted during 1981. It is important to note that the figures in these tables refer to the number of furloughs, not the number of individuals furloughed; therefore, some individuals who received more than one furlough are counted more than once in the tables in Appendix I.

#### FOOTNOIES

- 1. The Department of Correction furlough statistics define an "escape from furlough" in accordance with Department Order 467.1 entitled, "Furloughs Rules and Regulations," according to Section 10.4(c): "Failure of the resident to return to the correctional facility after the two hour period set forth in Section 10.4(b) shall be considered an escape regardless of prior notification to the facility by the resident that he would be late. The superintendent or his designee shall notify, forthwith, appropriate law enforcement officials of the escape.
- 2. These figures may differ from prior departmental reports due to multiple counting of individuals furloughed from different institutions.
- 3. The figures for 1972 represent totals for only two months of 1972. Therefore, the number of furloughs and individuals furloughed is much lower than subsequent years.
- 4. The figure for the total number of individuals furloughed since the inception of the program is not the sum of the individual years. Individuals are furloughed in different years and so by adding the yearly totals for individuals participating in the program, multiple counting occurs.
