


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



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## INTRODUCTION

As enumerated in K.S.A. 75-5228, the Secretary of Corrections is given three major responsibilities in performing the jail inspection function:

- (1) The promulgation of advisory standards relating to the safety and sanitation of correctional and detention facilities.
- (2) The periodic inspection of correctional and detention facilities.
- (3) The presentation of evidence to local officials and judicial personnel that a particular facility within their jurisdiction needs major improvement or should be closed.

The program responsibility entails on-site inspection of jails, including such basic areas as administration, facility construction, personnel, housekeeping, food service, medical care, emergency procedures, sanitation, safety, counseling, recreation, and programs. The program staff also investigates complaints referred by the Governor's Office, the Attorney General's Office, and others, concerning the operation of jails and/or the treatment of prisoners.

It is evident that detention facilities throughout the state have been neglected for years. Not only are facilities old and antiquated, but Administrators' attitudes have not reflected the new concepts of rehabilitation and humane housing and treatment. Thought should be given to the fact that the jails of the state house many persons who are but charged with crimes and awaiting the completion of the judicial process. Those convicted and serving time in the jails are in need of safe and adequate facilities and activities which will reflect positively upon their behavior when they are eventually released back into the communities.

In this age of recognized human rights, more and more people are becoming aware of the right of the confined and seeking the assurance those rights are respected. State and federal courts throughout the nation are hearing cases regarding alleged "cruel and unusual punishment" because of the deplorable conditions of city, county and state detention/correctional facilities. In some cases, judgements have been rendered against the Administrators of the facilities. With the changing public and judicial attitudes impacting on the environment of local detention operations, it is anticipated that rapid change for the improvement of detention facilities and programs is inevitable.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

JAIL-----A facility operated by a unit of local government for the physical detention and correction of persons charged with, or convicted of, criminal offenses for a period of one year or less.

LOCKUP-----A facility operated by a unit of local government for the physical detention of persons charged with, or convicted of, criminal offenses for a period of seventy-two hours or less.

HOLDING FACILITY-----A facility operated by a unit of local government for the temporary physical detention of persons awaiting processing, booking, appearing before court, or discharged.

CAPACITY-----The number of bed space presently available.

RECOMMENDED  
CAPACITY-----The bed space that should be available using a formula of fifty-two square feet of cell space per bed.

URGENT-----A situation, or hazard, which presents an immediate threat to the health and safety of the inmates or employees, or the potential for escape.

NECESSARY-----A situation, or hazard, which presents a potential threat to the health and safety of the inmates or employees if they are continually exposed to the situation over a prolonged period.

DESIRABLE-----A condition which does not present an immediate or potential threat to the health and safety of the inmates or employees; but, if changed, would improve the habitability of the facility or the staff's ability to manage the facility.

JAIL INSPECTION ACTIVITIES

During the calendar year 1977, the Jail Inspection Staff was involved in forty-five joint inspections with the State Fire Marshal's Office and the State Department of Health and Environment. The Staff also investigated thirty-three complaints concerning the operation of jails and the treatment of inmates; attended forty-eight meetings with district judges, commissioners, attorneys, and architects for the purpose of planning new facilities or renovating existing ones; and inspected one-hundred and thirty-five detention facilities.

These inspections indicated that eighteen of these facilities were not being used for detention purposes. Of the one-hundred and eighteen operational facilities, eighty-eight are jails, nineteen are lockups, and eleven are holding facilities.


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SUMMARY

The mission of the Jail Inspection Section is to upgrade the jail/detention facilities operated by the cities and counties within the state via maintenance of a uniform set of standards for sanitation and the care and safety of inmates. The Department of Corrections, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-5228, is responsible for providing staff training, technical assistance and leadership in areas related to the upgrading of the conditions of the jails and detention facilities within the State of Kansas.

The Kansas Advisory Jail Standards and Procedures have been developed to assist Administrators in their efforts to upgrade their detention facilities. These are state standards which are applied by the Jail Inspectors during an inspection. Recommendations for the improvement of such areas are made in report form to the District Judges, County Commissioners and County Attorneys following the inspection.

The effectiveness of jail standards is measured by the reduction of the number of deficiencies and by the increase of the total number of facilities which currently meet the standards. It should be noted that cooperation of the local units of government across the state has been outstanding. Without the continued cooperation of these various units of government, the implementation of the Kansas Advisory Jail Standards and Procedures can not be successful.
