



#### DEFINITION OF TERMS

	DELIMITION OF TENES
JATL	-A facility operated by a unit of local govern- ment for the physical detention or confinement, for a period of one year or less, of persons charged with, or convicted of, criminal offenses.
LOCKUP	-A facility operated by a unit of local govern- ment for the physical detention or confinement, for a period of seventy-two hours or less, of persons charged with, or convicted of, criminal offenses.
HOLDING FACILITY	-A facility operated by a unit of local govern- ment for the temporary physical detention of persons awaiting processing, booking, appearance before a court of competent jurisdiction, or discharge.
CAPACITY	-The bed space for which the facility was original designed to accommodate.
RECOMMENDED CAPACITY-	-The bed space that should be available using a formula of fifty-two square feet of cell space per bed for existing facilities.
URGENT	-A situation or hazard which presents an immediate threat to the health and safety of immates or employees, or the potential for escape.
NECESSARY	-A situation or hazard which presents a potential threat to the health and safety of inmates or employees if they are continually exposed over a prolonged period.
DESTRABLE	-A condition which does not present an immediate or potential threat to the health and safety of inmates or employees; but which, if changed, would improve the habitability of the facility or the staff's management abilities.





#### A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE STATUS OF LOCAL CONFINEMENT FACILITIES

As enumerated in K.S.A. 1981 Supp. 75-5228, the Secretary of Corrections is given three major responsibilities in performing the jail inspection function.

- 1. The promulgation of advisory standards relating to the sanitation and safety of correctional institutions and jails.
- The periodic inspection of correctional institutions and jails.
- 3. The presentation of evidence to local officials and judicial personnel that a particular facility, within their jurisdiction, needs major improvement or should be closed.

The program responsibility entails on-site inspection of jails, including such basic areas as security, safety, sanitation and inmate services. The program staff also provides technical assistance and investigates complaints concerning the operation of jails and/or treatment of prisoners.

During 1981 the Jail Inspection Staff responded to requests from Washburn University and various counties in the state as participating consultants for jail staff training.

The Kansas Statute that requires inspections of Jail/Detention facilities also authorizes the Secretary of Corrections to request the aid of the State Fire Marshal's office and the State Department of Health and Environment. During calendar year 1981 the Jail Inspection Staff requested and coordinated twenty-six (26) joint inspections with the State Fire Marshal's office and seven (7) with the State Department of Health and Environment, the joint inspection requests had decreased from sixty-three (63) and twelve (12) or a 58% and 41% decrease respectively from 1980. These joint inspections are

requested because of serious problems in the Jail/Detention facilities that pertain to a particular field of expertise. The requests for joint inspections have been reduced as local authorities have steadily reduced their serious jail deficiencies in Fire Safety and Sanitation.

The Jail Inspection Staff investigated twenty-six (26) letters of complaint from individual inmates and/or their friends. The majority of these complaints were forwarded from the offices of the Governor and the Attorney General. There were fifty-five (55) allegations derived from the twenty-six (26) complaints but only six (6) of these allegations or 10.9% were found to be valid. The valid allegations covered primarily the areas of sanitation and food service. The number of complaints received in 1981 has increased by one over those received in 1980. The number of allegations against the facilities decreased from sixty-one (61) to fifty-five (55) or a 6.1% decrease, and the number of allegations found to be valid decreased from nineteen (19) to six (6). The percentage of valid allegations decreased from 31% to 10.9%. The number of complaints against Jail/Detention facilities has remained on a steady decline each year. The decrease in severe allegations against jail facilities this year is not inconsistant with the steady decline from previous years.

Throughout 1981 the Jail Inspection Staff made seventy-seven (77) on-site contacts to provide technical assistance with respect to the custody, care and treatment of inmates. These contacts included review and comment on plans for the construction or major modification of local Jail/Detention facilities. The number of requests for technical assistance has increased by 26% over the amount for 1980.

Inspections were made during 1981 of a total of one hundred twenty-four (124) operational Jail/Detention facilities. Of this one hundred twenty-four (124) total it was discovered that Kansas had eight-four (84) jails, nineteen (19) lockups, and twenty-one (21) holding facilities operating within the one hundred five (105) counties. The total number of operational jails has increased by one over 1980 due to the renovation and reopening of a previously closed facility. There are an additional twelve (12) Jail/Detention facilities that are not included in the operational list because of undergoing major renovation, new construction or closures due to various other reasons.

At the close of the calendar year 1981, there were 84 jails, 19 lockups, and 21 holding facilities operating within the 105 counties. Combined, these facilities confined an average of 1,612 individuals on any given day in 1981. The facilities range in age from 1 year to 81 years, with a mean age of 24.2 years as derived from group data. The total bed space for the combined jail/detention facilities is 2,557. The bed space for facilities holding up to one year is 2,241, with the recommended total bed space as derived from the Kansas Jail Standards regarding minimum cell space per inmate, for this type of facility being 1864.

MEETINGS RECOMMENDED BY THE SECRETARY OF CORRECTIONS, PURSUANT TO K.S.A. 1981 SUPP. 75-5228 REGARDING FACILITIES WITH SERIOUS DEFICIENCIES CONSIDERED TO BE A DETRIMENT TO HUMAN LIFE

During 1981 the Jail Inspection Staff identified twenty-six (26) facilities that contained serious deficiencies that could be a detriment to human life. This was a decrease of eight (8) or 23% from the thirty-four (34) facilities identified in 1980. By the end of 1981, fourteen (14) local governments had held meetings with the Secretary of Corrections or his designee, a remaining four (4) local governments scheduled meetings that will be held in calendar year of 1982. The fourteen (14) meetings held in 1981 resulted in a concensus from the local authorities to correct the deficiencies rated as urgent and necessary.

Effective July 1, 1981 K.S.A. 75-5228 was changed to require the Secretary of Corrections to request the meeting, serve as chairperson and establish the date, time and place of the meeting.
