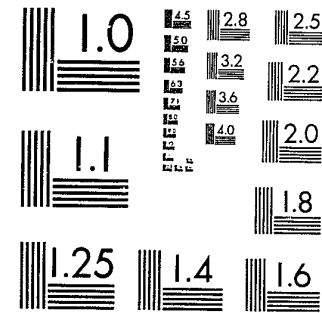


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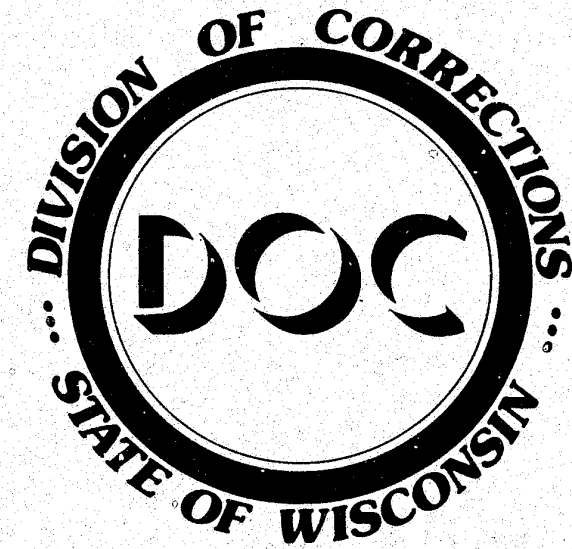

H I G H L I G H T S

- * A total of 938 juvenile males and 92 juvenile females were admitted to state juvenile correctional institutions in 1979, compared with 1,278 males and 184 females in 1978. This 29.5 percent decline in admissions is attributable to the new Wisconsin Children's Code, which became effective on November 18, 1978. The new Code provides for community-based treatment of juvenile offenders except those found to be a danger to self or the public and in need of restrictive custodial treatment.
- * Among the boys admitted in 1979, 563 were new admissions (including 39 state probation violators); 178 were returns from aftercare; 163 were returns from aftercare pending a revocation hearing, and 33 were temporary admissions from probation pending a revocation hearing. Among the girls, 50 were new admissions (including 3 state probation violators); 17 were returns from aftercare; 22 were returns from aftercare pending a revocation hearing, and 3 were temporary admissions from probation pending a revocation hearing. (Tables 1 and 1-A).
- * Nearly one-half (49.7 percent) of the juveniles admitted in 1979 came from the seven counties which comprise the Milwaukee and Southeastern Regions. The Milwaukee Region accounted for 31.4 percent of all admissions and the Southeastern Region for 18.3 percent. (Table 3)
- * Median age of all boys admitted in 1979 was 16.5 years, compared with 16.4 years in 1978. The median age of girls rose to 16.2 years from 16.1 years in 1978. (Table 4)
- * Among new admissions, median age of the boys was 16.2 years and of the girls, 15.9 years, same as in 1978. (Table 5)

- * About three-fourths (73.2 percent) of the boys and two-thirds of the girls admitted to correctional institutions during 1979 were White. Of the rest, 20.2 percent of the boys and 25.0 percent of the girls were Black, while 6.5 percent of the boys and 7.6 percent of the girls were Native American. (Table 7)
- * More than three-fourths (76.8 percent) of the newly-admitted boys had been involved in burglary (37.8 percent), auto theft (24.1 percent), or other theft (14.9 percent). Among the newly-admitted girls, nearly one-half (44.0 percent) had been involved in theft, other than auto theft, and 16.0 percent had been involved in auto theft. (Table 10)
- * Nearly three-fourths (71.9 percent) of the boys sent back to correctional institutions from aftercare were returned for violating the law, and 64.7 percent of the girls were returned for absconding or running away. (Table 11)
- * Among the juveniles newly-admitted in 1979, girls were more likely than boys to have acted alone when involved in delinquent behavior. (Table 12)
- * Four-fifths of the newly-admitted juveniles had been on probation at some time before being committed to a correctional institution. Half of the boys and 56.0 percent of the girls had been under supervision by a county social services agency, while 17.9 percent of the boys and 24.0 percent of the girls had been supervised by a juvenile court worker. Another 12.1 percent of the boys and 6.0 percent of the girls had been supervised by the State Department of Health and Social Services. (Table 13)
- * About three-fifths (61.1 percent) of the boys and four-fifths (82.0 percent) of the girls had had experience with child guidance clinics or other child caring agencies before being committed to a correctional institution. (Table 14)
- * About one-fourth of the newly-admitted juveniles (22.4 percent of the boys and 25.0 percent of the girls) came from families receiving some form of public assistance. (Table 15)

- * Forty percent of the newly-admitted boys and 58.0 percent of the girls had completed eight grades of school or less. Another 36.4 percent of the boys and 30.0 percent of the girls had completed ninth grade. (Table 16)
- * Only 188 of the 563 newly-admitted boys and none of the 50 girls were reported to have been given an achievement test upon admission. Of those tested, 62.2 percent scored at the sixth grade level or lower. (Table 17)
- * Ten counties accounted for the bulk of new admissions and returns from after-care in 1979 — 68.2 percent of the boys and 65.7 percent of the girls. Milwaukee County alone accounted for 32.4 percent of the boys and 34.3 percent of the girls. (Appendix A)
- * Characteristics of newly-admitted juveniles from the 10 counties are shown in Appendix B.
- * The number of juveniles returned from aftercare or admitted temporarily from probation for replacement planning dropped virtually to nothing in 1979 after accounting for about one-fifth of all admissions in 1978. This resulted from a Department of Health and Social Services policy against admitting juveniles for replacement planning. (Appendix C)
- * In each of the six Regions, the proportion of juveniles who were admitted as returns from aftercare increased substantially in 1979. (Appendix D)
- * Milwaukee County's proportion of all types of juveniles admissions for the period 1975 through 1979 is shown in Appendix E.
