



This report is one of a series designed to make data available on the population in facilities of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The data in this report provide a profile of persons discharged from facility custody during 1981. The following characteristics are covered in this report: type of release; sex; time served; age; commitment offense; prior criminal record; maximum sentence; county of commitment; violent felony offenders; and second felony offenders.


Characteristics of Inmates Discharged, in this edition, provides information on the amount of time served in Department facilities for several profile characteristics.

H I G H L I G H T S

1. During 1981 there were 8,838 inmates released from DOCS facilities. The vast majority, 85.0%, were released to parole supervision.
2. Males accounted for 96.4% of all inmates discharged compared to 3.6% for females.
3. Persons released to parole supervision for the first time on their current sentence made up 72.4% (6,396) of all persons discharged from DOCS facilities during 1981.
4. The median time served by males released at the discretion of the Board of Parole was 23.7 months while female first paroles had a median time of 19.7 months. Mandatory conditional releases served 23.9 months for males and 22.2 months for females.
5. Persons committed for murder and homicide served the longest periods of time, with medians of 56.4 and 50.9 months for male first paroles. Rape commitments served a median time of 43.7 months. The largest single crime category was robbery, accounting for 37.3% of all male first paroles, with a median time served of 28.8 months. Grand larceny (not auto) commitments served the shortest period for male first paroles, 17.1 months.

6. Slightly over 65% of male first paroles were under 30 years of age. While males aged 21 to 24 years served a median time of slightly over 23 months, male first paroles in the older age groups served slightly longer periods of time.
7. The majority of 1981 releases had a prior criminal record, with only 13.7% of male first paroles with no adult criminal history. 18.3% of male first paroles had a record of prior state or federal commitment. Persons with more serious prior criminal histories tended to serve more time under DOCS custody. Male first paroles with records of prior state commitments served a median time of 33.5 months while those with no record spent only an average of 20.2 months in DOCS facilities.
8. Almost 55% of male first paroles had been committed with maximum sentences of five years or less. Conditional releases generally had shorter maximum terms than did their parole counterparts.
9. 61.7% of male first paroles had been committed from New York City. An additional 12.5% came from the suburban New York City area while the remaining 25.8% were from upstate counties. Male paroles from New York City served the longest median time, 25.5 months, while those from the suburban New York City area served 22.4 months and upstate commitments, 22.1 months.
10. While nearly 76% of first paroles were first offenders, only about 56% of first CR's were first offenders.
11. Violent felony offenses comprised over 51% of first paroles and 45.5% of first conditional releases.
12. The median time served by first paroles committed for violent felony offenses was 26.3 months for first felony offenders and nearly 42 months for second felons.

1981 RELEASES: TYPE OF RELEASE

Type of Release There were 8,838 releases from Department facilities in 1981. 8,515 releases (96.3%) were males and 323 (3.7%) were females.

The largest number of males discharged in 1981 were released to parole supervision. These included 4,768 paroled by discretionary action of the Board of Parole (56.0%) and 2,471 by mandatory conditional release (29.0%). Thus, a total of 7,239 males (85.0% of total male releases) were released to parole supervision in 1981. 574 males (6.7%) were released on the maximum expiration date of their sentence. Other releases included 456 males (5.4%) transferred to institutions outside the Department, namely to the Department of Mental Hygiene, under a cooperative program for treatment of mentally-disturbed inmates. 129 males were released on court orders (1.5%) and there were 39 deaths (0.5%) none court-mandated. There was a total of 76 escapes from institutional custody and absconders from temporary release plus two other discharges. The percentage of male escapes and absconders in 1981 was only 0.7 percent -- most of whom were recaptured within a short period of time. In comparison with 1980 releases, a somewhat lower percentage of males were paroled by the Board of Parole in 1981 (3.3% less) while a higher proportion were released to parole supervision by conditional release (1.8% more). The proportion of males released by maximum expiration of sentence was up 1.1 percent in 1981, as well.

Females released in 1981 in comparison with male 1981 releases, showed a much higher proportion paroled by action of the Board of Parole (220 or 68.1%) and a smaller proportion of conditional releases to parole supervision, 55 or 17.0 percent. Thus, a total of 275 females or slightly over 85 percent were released to parole supervision -- only 0.1 percent more than the male experience. Nineteen females were released upon the maximum expiration of their sentences (5.9%) which was 0.8 percent less than males discharged at their maximum term.

TIME SERVED IN DOCS FACILITIES

The following sections present profile characteristics of inmates released to parole supervision for the first time on their current sentence. These characteristics include: sex; commitment offense; age at time of release; prior criminal record; maximum sentence and county of commitment. Each of these characteristics is shown by time actually served in DOCS facilities between the date originally received from the court of commitment and the date the inmate was returned to the community under parole supervision. Data are presented separately for discretionary Parole Board releases and for mandatory conditional releases which occur after an inmate has successfully completed two-thirds of the maximum sentence.

First Releases Information is presented in the next five sections on 6,396 inmates who were released for the first time to parole supervision on their current sentence. Of these 6,149 (96.1%) were males and 247 (3.9%) were females. Among male first releases, 4,109 (66.8%) were discretionary parole releases compared to 202 female paroles, 81.8 percent of total female first releases. Male conditional first releases numbered 2,040 (33.2%) while female conditional first releases were 45 (18.2%). In comparison with first releases to parole supervision in 1980, the percentage of first paroles declined from 69.2 percent in 1980 to 67.4 percent in 1981 while first conditional releases rose from 30.8 percent to 32.6 percent. Thus, the decline in first releases by the Board of Parole, which began in 1979 and leveled off in 1980, occurred again in 1981.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: SEX

A median time of 23.7 months was served in DOCS facilities by the 4,109 male first parole releases during 1981. Male conditional first releases served 0.2 of a month more, 23.9 months. Females released by first parole served less time than any of the other groups, with a median time of 19.7 months. Median time served by female first conditional releases was 22.2 months or 2.5 months more than the parole group.


TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE BY SEX

TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: CRIME

First Paroles Ninety-four percent of male first paroles in 1981 had been committed for felonies (3,863 out of 4,109). Robbery was the offense on commitment for the largest number of male first paroles (37.3%). Other felonies which comprised ten percent or more of the 1981 male first parole cohort included burglary (16.9%) and dangerous drugs (15.1%). Only 5.4 percent of male first paroles had been committed for homicide (220) and merely 6.0 percent had been committed as Youthful Offenders (246).

Slightly over 73 percent of male felons paroled for the first time in 1981 had served less than three years (2,827 out of 3,863). The median time served of male felon first paroles was 24.6 months, only a little over two years. Total male first paroles in 1981 served slightly under two years (23.7 months). Three-fourths of all male first paroles had served under three years (3,071 out of 4,109). This latter figure includes 246 male Youthful Offenders whose median time served was 17.9 months. The time served distribution of male first paroles by specific crime (felony) varies greatly depending on the severity and dispersion of offenses included in each designated crime and the numbers of commitments under these offenses. For example, robbery includes commitments under robbery first degree, robbery second degree and robbery third degree, which are class B, class C and class D felonies, respectively, in descending order of severity. While the spread of minimum terms permitted for specific crime classes may overlap, the tendency is toward longer minimum terms for the more serious crimes, as defined in the penal law. Thus, the median time served by male first paroles was longest for those convicted of murder (56.4 mos.), homicide (50.9 mos.) and rape (43.7 mos.) while shortest for grand larceny (not auto) -- 17.1 months.

In comparison with male first paroles in 1980, the crime distribution in 1981 differed slightly. While total male first paroles fell from 4,708 in 1980 to 4,109 in 1981, a decrease of 599 or 12.7 percent, the proportions of specific crimes rose in 1981. For example, male first paroles who had been committed for burglary rose from 14.5 percent in 1980 (684) to 16.9 percent in 1981 (696). Robbery first paroles rose from 36.3 percent in 1980 to 37.3 percent in 1981. Conversely, male first paroles of drug commitments fell from 17.1 percent in 1980 to 15.1 percent in 1981. First paroles of males committed for murder rose from 0.9 percent in 1980 (43 cases) to 1.1 percent in 1981 (45 cases). First paroles of male Youthful Offenders fell from 6.9 percent in 1980 (326) to 6.0 percent in 1981 (246). The median time served of male first paroles in 1981, at 23.7 months, was six-tenths of a month shorter than the median time served by the 1980 cohort. The median time served by male first paroles for the "violent felony" type crimes of homicide, robbery, dangerous weapons and rape has risen 5.5 months for homicide, but has fallen 0.3 months for robbery, has risen 1.5 months for assault, but has fallen 4.3 months for rape and 5.1 months for dangerous weapons crimes. Thus, there has been a tendency for 1981 male first paroles who were committed for some types of violent felonies to have served less time than a comparable group in 1980.

97.0 percent of female first paroles in 1981 had been committed for felonies -- 196 out of 202. Drug crimes accounted for the highest proportion of female first paroles (50 or 24.8%) while the second highest number had been committed for robbery, 41 or 20.3 percent. Homicide commitments ranked third (13.4%) and forgery and assault commitments fourth (each 9.4%). In comparison with female first paroles in 1980, the number of female first paroles who were committed for drug crimes has fallen from 70 to 50 (from 31.5% to 24.8%) while first paroles for assault and forgery have risen from 10 and 8, respectively, in 1980, to 19 each in 1981 (9.4%). The trend in female first paroles for drug commitments has been downward for the past three years.

Nearly 87 percent of female felons paroled for the first time in 1981 had served less than three years (170 out of 196). This was up only 0.3 percent from 1980. The median time served of female felon first paroles was 19.9 months while the median time served of total female first paroles was 19.7 months, slightly longer than the 1980 experience (18.8 mos.). The median time served of total female first paroles was 4.0 months less than that for 1981 male first paroles. This difference was smaller than that in 1980, which was 5.5 months. The table below gives the median time served by commitment offense for both males and females and the numbers of first paroles for each offense.

First Conditional Releases Over 96 percent of male first conditional releases in 1981 had been committed for felonies (1,959 out of 2,037). The largest number of male first conditional releases had been committed for robbery (28.0%). The only other felony which comprised ten percent or more of the 1981 male first conditional release cohort was burglary (22.3%). Drug crimes, which accounted for over 15 percent of male first paroles in 1981, were only 6.0 percent of 1981 male conditional releases. Thus, it appears that males committed as drug offenders were more likely to be released by the Board of Parole than as conditional releases, in 1981. This was also true in 1980.

78.6 percent of male felons conditionally released for the first time in 1981 had served less than three years (1,539 out of 1,959). The median time served of male felon first conditional releases was 23.9 months and the same for total male first conditional releases. In comparison with male first paroles, total male first conditional releases served on an average only 0.2 of a month more time. Significantly, the median time served of male first conditional releases does not vary so much by individual crime as is the case for first paroles. The median time served ranges from 57 months for murder, almost 38 months for homicide and slightly under 37 months for Rape, down to 19.5 months for Grand Larceny. Drug and weapons crimes each averaged 21.1 months. Inmates are conditionally released by statute after having served at least two-thirds of their maximum terms.

In comparison with male first conditional releases in 1980, the proportion of releases by individual crime differed slightly in 1981. Total male first conditional releases in 1981 were down 99 cases, a decrease of 4.6 percent. While first conditional releases of robbery commitments fell from 676 to 570 during this period, burglary releases rose from 413 in 1980 to 454 in 1981. The median time served of male first CR's in 1981, at 23.9 months, was up 0.6 of a month from 1980. Median time served for individual crimes was up slightly for robbery in 1981 -- from 24.0 months to 27.6 months. Time served by males committed for rape also rose in 1981 (from 31.2 months to 36.8 months).

All of the 45 female first conditional releases in 1981 had been committed for felonies and the largest number were homicide commitments -- 12 or 26.7 percent, with robbery next at 7 (15.6%). 82.2 percent of females conditionally released for the first time in 1981, had served less than three years. The median time served of total female first conditional releases was 22.2 months, only 0.1 of a month greater than the median time served in 1980. Total female first CR's in 1981 served an average time of 2.5 months more than total female first paroles in 1981. There were 10 fewer total female first conditional releases in 1981 (45) than in 1980 (55).



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: AGE

First Paroles Over ninety percent of total male first paroles were under 40 years of age on release and slightly under one-half were in the 21 through 29 year age group. Only 15.6 percent were less than 21 years of age on release and only 2.6 percent were aged 50 or over. The median age on release of male first paroles was 26.8 years, slightly under the 1980 median of 27.1 years. While the median time served of all male first paroles in 1981 was 23.7 months, there appears to be a direct relationship between time served and age on release, with a high of 30.8 months as the median time served of those aged 50 to 64 and a low of 16.3 months for those 16 to 18 years of age on release.

The age distribution of female first paroles was higher than that for males. Slightly under 84 percent were less than 40 years of age on release and 41.0 percent were in the 21 through 29 year age group while only 6.0 percent were under 21. The median age on release of female first paroles was 30.6 years, 3.8 years greater than that for males. In 1980, the median age on release of female first paroles was two years less. The relationship between time served and age on release for females also appears to vary directly, but not for all age groups. The low was 14.0 months for females aged 16 to 18 years and the high was 24.0 months for the 40 through 44 year age group. The median time served of total female first paroles was 19.7 months, or 4.0 months less than that for males.

First Conditional Releases The median age on release of male first conditional releases (CR's) at 29.3 years was 2½ years greater than that for male first paroles. 85.5 percent of total male CR's were under age 40 on release and over 44 percent were in the age group 21 through 29. Slightly over 9 percent were less than 21 and 3.9 percent were 50 years of age or over on release. Median time served, 23.9 months for total male first CR's, showed less variation between age groups than male first paroles, but tended to be slightly longer for the higher age groups. Median time served ranged from a low of 20.7 months for the 16 to 18 year age group up to a high of 28.7 months for those aged 45 to 49 on release. Thus, male first conditional releases in the lowest three age groups tended to serve more time than male first paroles in those age groups while male CR's aged 25 or over tended to serve less time than male first paroles 25 or over on release.

Female first conditional releases had a median age of 29.8 years. This was 0.8 of a month younger than female first paroles and only 0.5 of a month older than male first CR's. The median time served of female first CR's was 22.2 months, or 1.7 months less than that for male CR's. Fluctuations by age group for median time served may have been chance variations due to the small number of cases involved.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASES: PRIOR CRIMINAL RECORD

First Paroles Almost one-half of male first paroles had either no prior adult record (no arrests) or no prior adult commitment (arrests, only). Slightly over 31 percent had one or more prior local commitments and a little over 18 percent had at least one previous state commitment.

While almost 80 percent of those who had no prior record nor commitment served less than three years, only 55.4 percent of male first paroles with one or more prior state commitments served less than three years when paroled for the first time. The median time served varied directly with the severity of the prior record. Those with prior state commitments (usually second felony offenders) averaged 33.5 months in department facilities which was at least 10 months longer than inmates with less severe prior records. One reason for this is the fact that second felony offenders receive more severe sentences, with a minimum term of one-half the maximum term. Inmates paroled for the first time must serve their minimum terms.

Slightly over 23 percent of female first paroles in 1981 had no prior record while almost 40 percent had no prior commitment. Thus, nearly 63 percent had either no prior record or commitment, 13 percent more than the male experience. Only 7.9 percent of female first paroles had previous state commitments and about 29 percent had a prior local commitment. The median time served of female first paroles appears to be slightly longer for those with one or more prior state commitments (2 years).

Male first paroles in 1981 in comparison with 1980 male first paroles, had slightly less severe prior records since one percent more of the 1981 male first paroles had no prior record and about one percent less had a prior state commitment. The reverse was true for female first paroles in 1981 in comparison with 1980 in that nearly 4 percent less of 1981 female first paroles had no prior record or commitment. While nearly 6 percent more female first paroles in 1981 had a prior local commitment, 1.6 percent less had a prior state commitment.

First Conditional Releases Over 73 percent of male first conditional releases had previously served time in a penal facility for a prior criminal conviction. Nearly 34 percent had served sentences in local facilities and over 39 percent had served time in state or federal prisons. Thus, 23.5 percent more male first conditional releases had prior commitments compared to male first paroles in 1981. In contrast with the male first parole group, those with no prior adult records served on the average slightly longer times than those with no prior commitment or with local commitments only. The median time served of male first conditional releases was only one month longer than those with no prior adult record.

Female first conditional releases also had a more serious prior criminal record than their parole counterparts. Nearly 49 percent had served time in penal facilities for prior offenses and only 7 offenders (15.6%) had no prior adult criminal record. There was no apparent relationship between length of time served and prior adult criminal record.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: MAXIMUM SENTENCE

First Paroles The median maximum sentence on commitment of total male first paroles was 5 years. Slightly under 41 percent had received maximum terms of either 3 years (24.9%) or 4 years (16.0%) while 51.4 percent had received maximum sentences of 5 years or more. Slightly over 7 percent of male first paroles were under maximum terms of life imprisonment. While the median time served of all male first paroles was 23.7 months, median time served varied directly with the maximum term received on commitment, with a few exceptions. For example, the median time served of male first paroles with 4½ year maximum terms (17.9 mos.) tended to be lower than the median time served by those with either 4 or 5 year maximum terms. It is noted that the maximum terms mandated for class C violent felony commitments range from 4½ to 15 years. Thus, an inmate who had received a maximum term of 4½ years would be eligible for first parole after having served one-third of the maximum term because such a minimum is mandated for class C violent felonies (first offenders). One-third of 4½ years would be 18 months (including jail time). Some of the male first paroles who had received 4 year maximum terms or 5 year terms may have been second felony offenders who had been discharged from their first paroles and whose minimum terms had been mandated at one-half the maximum. Thus, such first parolees would have served two or 2½ years, respectively, before parole. Male first paroles with life maximum terms averaged only 33.2 months confinement because a class A-II felony (drug crime) has a life maximum term but the minimum can be as low as three years. As indicated in the table, three first paroles had received death sentences on commitment which were subsequently reduced to life terms by court action. These inmates were then paroled after serving at least 10 years.

The median maximum sentence on commitment of female first paroles was only 4 years. One-half had received maximum terms of either 3 years (36.1%) or 4 years (13.9%) while merely 41.6 percent had received maximum terms of 5 years or more. About 9.4 percent of female first paroles were serving a maximum sentence of life imprisonment. In spite of the fact that a little over 2 percent more female first paroles were serving life terms, because of a higher proportion of drug commitments, female maximum terms tended to be lower than that for males. Median times served by female first paroles ranged from almost 14 months for those with 3 year maximum terms up to over 4 years for those with maximum terms of 20 years or more. Thus, the relationship between median time served and maximum term on commitment appeared to be a direct one except for 4½ year maximum terms and life maximums, as in the case of male first paroles.

First Conditional Releases. The median maximum sentence on commitment of total male first conditional releases was 4 years. Over 69 percent had received maximum terms of either 3 years (45.3%) or 4 years (24.0%) while over 29 percent had received maximum sentences of 5 years or more. This contrasts sharply with male first paroles with a median maximum sentence of 5 years and over 51 percent with maximum terms of 5 years or more. One reason for the preponderance of short-termers who are first conditional releases has been the tendency for the Board of Parole to reject for parole at the first MPI hearing those with short court-set minimum terms such as one year. Since this MPI hearing may occur only a relatively short time before the inmate is eligible for conditional release, he may not reappear before the Board but instead be conditionally released after having served two-thirds of his maximum term.

While the median time served of all male first conditional releases was 23.9 months, time served appeared to vary directly with maximum sentence received on commitment, with few exceptions, namely, those with life terms. The shortest median time served was 19.9 months for those with three year maximum terms while the longest median time served was by males with maximum terms of over 10 years but less than 20 years (76.8 months).

The median maximum sentence on commitment of female first conditional releases was three years. Over 71 percent had received maximum terms of either three years (60.0%) or four years (11.1%) while only 12 female first conditional releases had received maximums of five or more years (26.7%). Thus, female first conditional releases tended to receive maximum terms lower than their male counterparts. For example, nearly 15 percent more females had 3 year maximum terms on commitment. The median time served by total female first conditional releases (22.2 mos.) was 1.7 months less than the male experience. The relationship between time served and maximum sentence on commitment for females was also a direct one and similar to that for male first conditional releases.



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: COUNTY OF COMMITMENT

First Paroles Nearly 62 percent of male first paroles had been committed from the five boroughs which comprise New York City. An additional 12.5 percent had been committed from the counties suburban to New York City with the remaining 25.8 percent coming from upstate counties. While the median time served of all male first paroles was 23.7 months, inmates committed from New York City served a median time of 25.5 months, almost 2 months longer. Male inmates committed from the counties suburban to New York City served a median time of 22.4 months and upstate male commitments served an average of 22.1 months. Thus, male commitments from New York City paroled for the first time in 1981 served an average length of time which was 3.4 months longer than male first paroles committed from upstate counties and 3.1 months longer than suburban commitments.

Slightly less than 57 percent of female first paroles during 1981 were from New York City. The suburban New York City area accounted for 14.4 percent and the upstate counties for 28.7 percent. Thus, 4.8 percent fewer female first paroles than males had been committed from New York City while a higher proportion of female first paroles had been committed from the upstate area (2.9%) and a higher proportion of females from the suburban New York City area (1.9%). While the median time served of all female first paroles was 19.7 months, New York City commitments averaged slightly more time, 20.4 months. The median time served of upstate female first paroles was slightly less (19.1 months) and suburban New York City first paroles averaged the shortest time served (18.5 months).

First Conditional Releases Slightly over 71 percent of male first conditional releases had been committed from New York City while almost 11 percent had been committed from suburban counties and nearly 18 percent from upstate. Thus, nearly 10 percent more of the male first conditional releases were from New York City than were male first paroles. Conversely, over 8 percent fewer male first conditional releases were from the upstate area than the proportion of male first paroles. The median time served of male CR's committed from New York City was 23.7 months, only slightly less than the median time served of total male first CR's (23.9 mos.). Median time served of suburban New York City commitments was slightly higher at 24.0 months and higher again for commitments from the upstate area (25.4 mos.).

Almost 69 percent of female first conditional releases in 1981 were from New York City while the suburban New York City area accounted for slightly over 11 percent and the upstate counties, 20 percent. Thus, more female first CR's had been committed from upstate counties and fewer from New York City than was true for males. The median time served was longest for females committed from the suburban New York City area (23.0 mos.) slightly shorter for New York City females (22.7 mos.) and shortest for upstate females (21.4 mos.).



TIME SERVED ON FIRST RELEASE: VIOLENT FELONY OFFENDER STATUS OF FIRST AND SECOND FELONY OFFENDERS

First Paroles New York State enacted legislation in 1978 designating certain crimes against persons as violent felony offenses (VFO). More severe prison terms and restrictions on plea bargaining were provided for such offenses. This section deals with the violent felony offender crime status of first paroles, both sexes combined.

A further breakdown by type of sentence separates offenders sentenced as second felony offenders from other felony sentences. The total number of 1981 first paroles tabulated by crime and second felony offender status was 4,273. About 38 cases were not included because the second felony offender law did not take effect until September 1, 1973. While nearly 76 percent of first paroles were first offenders, the residual, slightly over 24 percent, were second felony offenders. Violent felony-type offenses made up over 51 percent of the entire first parole group while other felony offenses accounted for nearly 43 percent. Nearly 37 percent of total first paroles had been committed for other felony offenses such as property or drug crimes while only 6 percent had committed other felonies of a coercive or violent nature. Almost 6 percent of first paroles were Youthful Offenders. These proportions differ slightly from 1981 commitments where about 60 percent were committed for violent felony offenses and correspondingly lesser proportions for other felonies and as Youthful Offenders.

The crimes of Robbery 1 and 2 made up the largest proportion of first paroles convicted of violent felonies (over 63%) and the proportion was similar for both first and second felons. The distribution of first felons differs from that for second felons with respect to various violent felonies, for example: 9.5 percent of first felon parolees (violent crimes) were committed for Manslaughter 1st while only a little over 3 percent of second felons were convicted of this crime. Conversely, only about 5 percent each of the first parolee group had been convicted of Burglary 2nd or a dangerous weapons crime while 10 percent of second felony offenders (violent crimes) were committed for Burglary 2nd and nearly 14 percent, for a dangerous weapons offense. These tabulations depict only the current commitment crime.

The median time served by first paroles for violent felony-type offenses, other coercive crimes and non-violent felonies was compiled by specific crime within these three categories separately for first felons and for second felony offenders. The median time served by all first felons paroled for the first time, committed for violent felony offenses, was 26.3 months. Conversely, the median time served by second felony offenders committed for

violent felonies and also paroled for the first time was much longer -- almost 42 months, about 3½ years. For each individual violent crime, the median time served by second felons was usually several months longer than the time served by first felon parolees.

The crime of Robbery 3rd made up the largest proportion of first paroles convicted of other crimes of a coercive or violent nature (not VFO's). Robbery 3rd comprised 63.2 percent of the first felon group and 84.2 percent of second felons. One reason for this difference is that almost 30 percent of first felony parolees in the other violent felony group had been convicted of Manslaughter 2nd while only about 9 percent of second felony offender parolees had been committed for this crime. The median time served of total first felons committed for coercive crimes was 25.5 months and for second felony offenders, 28.4 months, only about 3 months longer. Thus, first felons committed for other violent (coercive) crimes served, on average, under one month less than first offenders committed for violent felony offenses. While the time served by parolees convicted of coercive felonies, by individual crime category, was longer for second felons than for first felons, this was

partially offset for the total group because of the relatively high proportion of short-termers, such as Robbery 3rd commitments in the second felon group and the low proportion of Manslaughter 2nd commitments in this same group.

In the non-violent felony group consisting of property and drug crimes, the highest proportion of first felon parolees were drug commitments (54.2%) and the second most common was Burglary 3rd (27.5%). In the second felon group, the most common crime was Burglary 3rd (53.3%) while drug crimes accounted for only 13.2 percent of this group. The median time served of first parolees who had been convicted of non-violent felonies was only 19 months for first felons and 21 months for second felons. In each non-violent crime category, second felons served slightly longer terms on average than first felons. It appears that first parolees who had been convicted of non-violent felonies served on the average the shortest length of time in DOCS facilities -- slightly over 1½ years for first felons and only 21 months for second felons. Conversely, violent felony offenders served the longest periods of time -- slightly over 2 years, 2 months for first felons and an average of about 3½ years for second felony offenders.

First Conditional Releases The total number of 1981 first conditional releases tabulated by crime and second felony offender status was 2,063. About 19 early cases were not included because the second felony offender law had not yet been enacted. While 55.6 percent of first CR's were first offenders, the residual, 44.4 percent, were second felony offenders. The proportion of first offenders was considerably lower than that of first parolees (nearly 76%) since the Board of Parole is more likely to grant parole to first offenders. Violent felony-type offenses made up 45.5 percent of the entire first CR group while other felony offenses accounted for nearly 51 percent. About 37 percent of total first CR's had been committed for other felony offenses such as property or drug crimes while nearly 14 percent had committed other felonies of a coercive or violent nature. Almost 4 percent of first CR's were Youthful Offenders. The proportion of violent felony-type offenses was higher for first paroles in 1981 (over 51%) compared to first CR's (45.5%) while other felony offenses of a coercive nature was proportionally lower for first paroles (only 6%) although the proportion of property, drug crimes (non-violent) was essentially similar for both groups.

The crimes of Robbery 1 and 2 also made up the largest proportion of first CR's convicted of violent felonies (over 48%) and the proportion of Robbery 2 was similar for both first and second felons (32%). The distribution of first felons differs from that for second felons with respect to various violent felonies, for example: dangerous weapons crimes accounted for only 8.5 percent of first felon CR's while this crime accounted for over 28 percent of second felon violent felony CR's. Nearly 9 percent of first felon CR's were convicted of Manslaughter 1st while almost 4 percent of second VFO CR's were convicted of this crime. Over 16 percent of first VFO CR's were committed for Robbery 1st but only 7.8 percent of second felony CR's.

The median time served by first CR's for violent felony-type offenses, other coercive crimes and non-violent felonies was compiled by specific crime within these three categories separately for first felons and for second felony offenders. The median time served by all first felons conditionally released for the first time, who had been convicted of violent felony-type offenses, was 24.5 months. This was slightly less time than the comparable group of first paroles (26.3 months). But the median time served by second felony offenders committed for violent felonies and also first CR's was longer, 31.9 months, but not nearly so long as the comparable group of first paroles -- 41.9 months. For each individual violent crime, the median time served by second felons was usually several months longer than the time served by first felon conditional releases. Because of the differences in crime distribution between first and second felons, in that lesser violent felonies such as dangerous weapons crimes rather than those such as Manslaughter 1st or Robbery 1st accounted for larger proportions of the second felony group, the median time served by total VFO second felony CR's was merely 7.4 months longer than first felony CR's.

The crime of Robbery 3rd made up the largest proportion of first CR's convicted of other crimes of a coercive or violent nature (not VFO's). Robbery 3rd comprised 42.2 percent of the first felon group and 67.2 percent of second felons. Over 36 percent of first felon CR's in this group had been committed for Manslaughter 2nd and this same crime accounted for 17.2 percent of the second felony CR's. The median time served of total first felons committed for coercive crimes was 25.6 months and for second felony offenders, 26.2 months, only 0.6 of a month longer. The time served by CR's convicted of coercive felonies, by individual crime category, was longer for second felons than for first felons, in most cases.

In the non-violent felony group consisting of property and drug crimes, the highest proportion of first felon CR's were Burglary 3rd commitments (38.7%) and the second most common was drug crimes (29.8%). In the second felon group, the most common crime was Burglary 3rd (64.2%) while All Other Felonies was second (15%) and Grand Larceny next (13%). Drug crimes accounted for only 4.9 percent of the second felon CR group. The median time served of first CR's who had been convicted of non-violent felonies was only 21.1 months for first felons and 22.7 months for second felons. Thus, first CR's who had been convicted of non-violent felonies served on the average the shortest length of time in DOCS facilities except for first paroles of non-violent felons. Conversely, violent felony offenders served, for the most part, the longest periods of time and the median time served was slightly longer for most violent felony offenses for first paroles than for first conditional releases; and this was true for both first and second felony offenders.
