

1980

- \* Crime Index Offenses in 1980 increased by 11.9% over 1979, from 112,539 to 125,877.
- \* Violent Crimes increased by 11.4%, from 8,172 in 1979 to 9,107 in 1980.
  - Murder and non-negligent manslaughter increased from 129 to 160, a 24.0% increment.
  - Rape increased by 20.7%, from 614 in 1979 to 741 in 1980.
  - Robbery increased from 2,390 in 1979 to 2,658 in 1980.
  - Aggravated assault increased by 10.1%, to 5,548 in 1980 from 5,039 in 1979.
- \* Property Crimes increased by 11.9% over 1979, from 104,367 to 116,770.
  - Burglary increased from 30,568 to 35,649 a factor of 16.6%.
  - Larceny (theft) increased by 10.8%, from 67,480 to 74,750.
  - Motor vehicle theft increased from 6,319 to 6,371, an increment of 0.8%.
  - Arson was added to the Crime Index in 1980. There were 1,313 arsons.
- \* The value of property stolen in 1980 was \$54,265,504.
- \* The value of property recovered in 1980 was \$17,165,631.
- \* There were 75,567 arrests in 1980, an increase of 6.8% over 1979.
  - There were 18,496 arrests for Crime Index offenses.
  - There were 57,071 arrests for Class II offenses.
- \* One law enforcement officer was killed in the line of duty in 1980.
- \* There were 1,244 non-fatal assaults on law enforcement officers in 1980, a decrease of 3.6%.
- \* Law enforcement agencies employed 4,947 individuals in 1980.
  - There were 3,836 full-time sworn officers.
  - There were 1,111 full-time civilian employees.


IN MEMORIAM

INTRODUCTION

CHAPTER 1  
INTRODUCTION

The State of Kansas has participated in the national Uniform Crime Reporting Program since 1974, the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) has been the basis of Kansas offense data collected since that time. Since 1977 the Statistical Analysis Center (SAC) has had responsibility for the annual publication of crime statistics. Responsibility for data collection rests with the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), as it has since Kansas adopted the Uniform Crime Reporting System.

Definitions and classifications of crimes in the Uniform Crime Report are those of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, derived from work done by the International Association of Chiefs of Police. Kansas statutes are not used to classify offenses for the UCR. Offenses distinguished by their severity, frequency, and probability of being reported to law enforcement agencies comprise the Crime Index. Prior to 1980, the seven offenses included in the Crime Index were murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft. By Congressional mandate, beginning in 1980, arson was included in the Crime Index. All offenses not in the Crime Index are collectively identified as "Class II" or "Part II" offenses.

The Crime Index consists of two categories of offense, Violent Crimes and Property Crimes. The common feature of the Violent Crimes is the presence of the victim and threat or reality of physical danger to the victim. Murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault are the Violent Crimes. Property Crimes occur without the element of physical danger to a victim. Burglary, larceny (theft), motor vehicle theft, and arson are the Property Crimes. However, arson is presented as supplemental to the

Crime Index data in the 1980 Kansas Uniform Crime Report and is not included in Crime Index or Property Crime totals.

Often a single event involves the commission of several offenses. To avoid duplication, in a multiple-offense situation the Uniform Crime Report records only one crime. The offense to be recorded is determined by the "hierarchy rule", under which only the "most severe" crime is tabulated. Established by the FBI, the procedure gives priority to the Violent Crimes, followed sequentially by the Property Crimes and the Class II offenses. The method of recording arson represents an exception to use of the hierarchy rule. When arson occurs in conjunction with other offenses, both the arson and the most severe other crime perpetrated with it are tabulated.

Clearances occur when an offense is "solved" for crime reporting purposes (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 40). An offense is cleared when at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court or when law enforcement officers have the basis for taking such action but are prevented from doing so by extenuating circumstances. If the arrest of one person clears several offenses, each cleared offense is tallied. Hence, the hierarchy rule is not invoked for clearances.

When one arrest results in charges for several offenses, only one charge is recorded as an arrest for the Uniform Crime Report. The charge is determined by the hierarchy rule. If one person is arrested several times during a reporting period, each separate arrest is tallied. If several persons are arrested for one crime, the arrest of each person is recorded.

A number of factors influence both the extent and the nature of crime in Kansas communities. Some variables are:

- Strength and effectiveness of law enforcement agencies;
- Administrative and investigative emphases and law enforcement policies;
- Prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational policies;
- Socioeconomic factors;
- Seasonality.

Because of the large number of crime factors, comparison between agencies when controlling only for size of population may not be conclusive.

In addition to the crime factors, several other considerations impose limitations on crime information. The UCR depends greatly on citizen reports of offenses, yet the rate of report of crime varies with the type of crime, sociological factors, and monetary concerns. Only offenses which come to the attention of law enforcement personnel receive UCR scrutiny. Changes in record-keeping over time result in inaccuracies in trend data, even when the changes represent overall improvement in the quality of the statistics.

CHAPTER 2  
CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

Eight offenses comprise the Crime Index. The Committee on Uniform Crime Reports of the International Association of Chiefs of Police selected seven offenses noted for their severity, frequency, and likelihood of being reported to law enforcement agencies. The seven are murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. In 1978 Congress mandated the addition of arson to the Crime Index. Because of the recency of its addition to the Crime Index and statistical difficulties, arson is not included in the data presented on Crime Index offenses. However, the data on arson is included as supplementary data in the section on offenses committed.

There were 125,877 Crime Index offenses in 1980, resulting in a loss of \$54,265,504. Law enforcement agencies in Kansas reported recovery of property totaling \$17,165,631. The number of Crime Index offenses in 1980 was 11.9% greater than in 1979. There were 24,050 clearances of Crime Index offenses in 1980, an increase of 5.3% over 1979.

Cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 76.1% of Kansas' Crime Index offenses and 68.3% of the property loss to such offenses. The larger agencies reported 71.3% of the value of recovered property in Kansas. Three-fourths (76.4%) of the clearances of Crime Index offenses occurred in the agencies with jurisdictions over populations greater than 10,000.

Four counties in Kansas have populations greater than 50,000: Johnson County, Sedgwick County, Shawnee County, and Wyandotte County. In those counties 40.6% of the total state population resides. The metropolitan counties reported 71,506 Crime Index offenses, 56.8% of the state total. Property loss to Crime Index offenses in the four counties totaled \$32,023,182 or 59.0% of the total

loss in Kansas. Reported value of property recovered in the metropolitan counties was \$9,463,354. Clearances of Index Offenses in the metropolitan counties totaled 13,909, or 57.8% of statewide clearances.

1971 - 1980



1980





FIGURE 3

CHAPTER 3  
VIOLENT CRIMES

Four Crime Index offenses are classified as Violent Crimes: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. Characteristic of each of the offenses is the presence of a victim and threatened or actual violence.

In 1980, there were 9,107 Violent Crimes, with an associated property loss of \$1,188,464. The incidence of Violent Crime in 1980 was 11.4% greater than in 1979. There were 3.82 Violent Crimes per 1,000 people in 1980. Clearances of Violent Crimes totaled 4,681, a 16.1% increase over 1979.

The cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 7,424 Violent Crimes, 81.5% of the statewide total. A similar proportion of the value of property loss associated with Violent Crimes, 79.3%, occurred in the larger cities. Three-fourths (75.2%) of the clearances of Violent Crimes, 3,521, occurred in those cities.

There were 6,115 Violent Crimes in the metropolitan counties, two-thirds (67.1%) of the Violent Crimes in Kansas. Property loss associated with Violent Crime in the four counties totaled \$953,389, or 80.2% of the statewide total. There were 2,814 clearances of Violent Crimes in the metropolitan counties.

1971 - 1980




CHAPTER 4

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter are defined in Kansas under three statutes:

Murder in the first degree is the killing of a human being committed maliciously, willfully, deliberately and with premeditation or committed in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any felony (K.S.A. 21-3401).

Murder in the second degree is the malicious killing of a human being, committed without deliberation or premeditation and not in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate a felony (K.S.A. 21-3402).

Voluntary manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice, which is done intentionally upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion (K.S.A. 21-3403).

For the Uniform Crime Report, murder and non-negligent manslaughter are defined as "the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another", (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 6).

In 1980 there were 160 homicides committed, compared to 129 in 1979, an increase of 24.0%. The largest number of murders and non-negligent manslaughters per month, 21, occurred in June. Clearances of homicides totaled 146, a 33.9% increase over 1979.

Reported demographic characteristics of the victims included age, sex, race, and ethnicity. Forty-nine (49) victims aged 22 to 30 comprised the largest age group. Three-fourths (75.6%) of the victims, 121, were male; 24.4%, or 38, were female. There were 107 white victims, 49 black victims, 3 American Indian victims, and 1 Oriental victim. Fifteen (15) of the victims were of Hispanic origin.

Characteristics of offenders likewise are collected. There were 176 offenders. Offenders outnumbered victims because of the number of multiple-offender homicides. Of the total number of offenders, 137 were males and 20 were females. There were 95 white offenders and 58 black offenders. Ten (10) were of Hispanic origin.

Over one-fourth (26.1%) of all offenders, 46, victimized members of their families; 107 victimized individuals other than family members. Eleven percent (11.4%) of all homicides were of spouses. Nearly half (47.7%) of all victims were persons known by but not related to the offenders. Victim and offender were strangers in only 13.1% of the 1980 homicides. In 23 instances the relationship of the victim to the offender was not known.

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter occurred under a variety of circumstances. Of the total number of offenders, 24, or 13.6%, perpetrated homicides while committing other felonies. There were 75 offenders, 42.6%, who committed homicides during arguments.

Four types of weapons were used by over three-fourths (81.2%) of all offenders. Seventy-five (75) offenders, 42.6% of all offenders, used handguns. There were 34 offenders, 19.3%, who used knives. Shotguns were used by 18 offenders. Sixteen (16) offenders used personal weapons, hands, fists, feet, etc.

#### Negligent Manslaughter

Negligent manslaughter is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as "the killing of another person through gross negligence" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 9). There were 8 instances of negligent manslaughter in 1980, 5 of which involved one victim of one offender and 3 of which involved multiple victims of one offender. Four victims were age 5 and under and 4 victims were age 19 to 23. Five of the victims were male and 3, female. There were 5 white, 3 black, and 2 Hispanic victims of manslaughter. All offenders were age 21 to 26. Four were male and 4 were female. Three were mothers, one was a daughter, and 4 were acquaintances. There were 5 white, and 3 black offenders. Two additional offenders were of Hispanic ethnicity. Four victims were killed by individuals handling firearms, three by fire, and one by personal weapons.

#### Justifiable Homicide

Justifiable homicide is defined as:

1. the killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty, or
2. the killing (during the commission of a felony) of a felon by a private citizen.

(Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 6)

Twelve justifiable homicides occurred in 1980. Those killed included 3 teenagers, 4 individuals in their twenties, 4 in their thirties, and one in his sixties. All were male. Nine were white, 3 were black. Eleven of the incidents involved one victim and one offender; one incident involved one victim and two offenders. The 13 perpetrators included 8 individuals age 24 to 29, 3 age 31 to 38, one age 41 and one age 53. All were male. Twelve were white and one was black. Eleven of the perpetrators were law enforcement officers and 2 were private individuals. Nine were strangers to their victims and one was an acquaintance; the relationship of 3 of the perpetrators to their victims if not known. Seven of the perpetrators used handguns, 4 used shotguns, and one used a blunt object; one weapon is not known. Seven of the victims were killed while committing a felony. Three were attacking police officers and one was attacking a civilian. One victim was resisting arrest when he was killed.

1971 - 1980



1980



1980




CHAPTER 5

RAPE


Rape in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3502, 1979 Supp. as "the act of sexual intercourse committed by a man with a woman not his wife, and without her consent . . .". The definition of rape used by the Uniform Crime Reporting System is "the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 10).

There were 741 confirmed rapes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1980. Not a crime inherently involving property loss, rape had an associated \$7,472 in property loss. Rape increased by 20.7% over the incidence in 1979. There were 0.62 rapes per 1,000 women in 1980. A total of 357 rapes were cleared, an increase of 21.4% over 1979.

There were 623 rapes, 84.1% of rapes in Kansas, in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. Property loss to rape in the larger cities totaled \$7,332, or 98.1% of the property loss to rape in Kansas. There were 278 clearances of rape in the larger cities.

Law enforcement agencies in the metropolitan counties recorded 522 rapes and an associated property loss of \$6,212. There were 231 clearances of rape in the four counties.

CHAPTER 6

ROBBERY

Robbery in Kansas is "the taking of property from the person or presence of another by threat of bodily harm to his person or the person of another or by force" (K.S.A. 21-3426). For purposes of the Uniform Crime Report, robbery is "the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 12).

There were 2,658 robberies in 1980, an increase of 11.2% over the number in 1979. There were 1.12 victims of robbery per 1,000 persons. Property loss to robbery totaled \$1,180,992. The most common type of robbery was highway robbery, that which "occur(s) on the streets, in alleys, and generally in view of law enforcement patrol but outside of structures" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 51). Commercial houses, businesses other than gas stations, convenience stores, or banking institutions (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 51), suffered the largest total loss to robbery, \$281,898. Robbery clearances in 1980 totaled 810, or 17.5% more than in 1979.

Over ninety percent of all robberies (91.9%) occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. There were 2,445 robberies in the larger cities, resulting in the loss of \$935,171. Robbery clearances in the larger cities totaled 707, or 87.2% of all robbery clearances in Kansas.

There were 2,088 robberies in the four metropolitan counties, 78.5% of all robberies in Kansas. Loss to robbery in the metropolitan counties totaled \$947,177. There were 620 clearances of robbery in the four counties.



CHAPTER 7

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3410 as:

- (a) Unlawfully assaulting or striking at another with a deadly weapon; or
- (b) Committing assault by threatening or menacing another while disguised in any manner designed to conceal identity; or
- (c) Willfully and intentionally assaulting another with intent to commit any felony.

Aggravated assault is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as:


an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 15).

Aggravated assault is the most frequent of the Violent Crimes. There were 5 548 aggravated assaults in 1980, an increase of 10.1% over the number in 1979. Aggravated assault occurred at the rate of 2.33 per 1,000 people in 1980. There is no property loss associated with aggravated assault: when property is involved, the crime is classified as robbery. Clearances of aggravated assault in 1980 totaled 3,368.

In cities with populations greater than 10,000 there were 4,238 aggravated assaults, 76.4% of those in Kansas in 1980. Clearances of aggravated assault in the larger cities totaled 2,426.

There were 3,409 aggravated assaults in Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee, and Wyandotte Counties in 1980. Law enforcement agencies in the four counties cleared 1,877 aggravated assaults.

CHAPTER 8  
PROPERTY CRIMES

Three Crime Index offenses are classified as Property Crimes, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft. The common feature of the Property Crimes is the absence of the victim from the scene of the crime.

There were 116,770 Property Crimes in 1980, resulting in property loss of \$53,077,040. The incidence of Property Crimes in 1980 was 11.9% greater than in 1979. There were 49.03 Property Crimes per 1,000 people in Kansas in 1980. Clearances of Property Crimes totaled 19,369, a 3.0% increase over 1979 clearances.

The cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 88,312 Property Crimes, 75.6% of all Property Crimes in Kansas. Property loss associated with such crimes totaled \$36,134,441 in the larger cities. There were 14,842 clearances of Property Crimes in the larger cities, 76.6% of all clearances of Property Crimes in Kansas.

There were 65,391 Property Crimes in the metropolitan counties, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee and Wyandotte. Property loss to such crimes totaled \$31,069,793 in the four counties. Clearances of Property Crimes in the metropolitan counties totaled 11,095.

1971 - 1980





FIGURE 16

CHAPTER 9

BURGLARY

Burglary in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3715 as:

...knowingly and without authority entering or remaining within any building, mobile home, tent or other structure, or any motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, railroad car or other means of conveyance of persons or property, with intent to commit a felony or theft therein.

For the Uniform Crime Report, burglary is defined as "the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 20), and includes concealment within a building. UCR guidelines rule out illegal entry of a tent or vehicle used for recreational purposes. Burglary is tabulated according to the provisions of the "Hotel Rule". The "Rule" holds that multiple burglaries of transient dwellings or commercial spaces under a single manager, incidents most likely to be reported to a law enforcement agency by the manager rather than the lessees, are counted as one offense.

There were 35,649 burglaries in 1980, an increase over 1979 of 16.6%. Residence burglaries totaled 21,701, non-residence burglaries totaled 13,948. Burglary occurred at the rate of 14.97 per 1,000 residents of Kansas. Property loss to burglary totaled \$18,395,642. Loss from residence burglaries comprised 64.3% of the total loss to burglaries. There were 5,723 clearances of burglaries, an increase of 13.3% over 1979.

Nearly three-fourths (73.1%) of all burglaries, 26,049, occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. Property loss to burglary in the larger cities totaled \$11,700,270. Clearances of burglaries in the larger cities totaled 4,132.

In Johnson County, Sedgwick County, Shawnee County, and Wyandotte County combined, there were 20,625 burglaries, 57.9% of all burglaries in Kansas.

Burglaries in the four metropolitan counties resulted in property loss totaling \$10,670,768, or 58.0% of the loss to burglaries in Kansas. There were 3,607 clearances of burglaries in the four counties.



CHAPTER 10  
LARCENY (THEFT)

Kansas Statute (K.S.A. 21-3701) defines theft as:

- ...any of the following acts done with intent to deprive the owner permanently of the possession, use, or benefit of the owner's property:
- (a) Obtaining or exerting unauthorized control over property; or
  - (b) Obtaining by deception, control over property; or
  - (c) Obtaining by threat, control over property; or
  - (d) Obtaining control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another.

For the Uniform Crime Report larceny (theft) is "the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 23). Attempts to commit larceny are included in the definition.

There were 74,750 incidents of larceny (theft) in 1980, an increase of 10.8% over 1979. The most common form of larceny was theft of automobile parts and accessories, which occurred 17,931 times. Larceny occurred at the rate of 31.39 per 1,000 people. Loss of property to theft totaled \$15,628,278. Clearances of larcenies decreased by 1.1% from 12,102 in 1979, to 11,974 in 1980.

Three-fourths (76.6%) of all larcenies, 57,256, occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. Value of property loss to larceny in those cities totaled \$9,841,356, or 63.0% of the state total. There were 9,669 clearances of larcenies in the cities with populations greater than 10,000.

There were 40,866 victims of larceny in the metropolitan counties; their monetary loss totaled \$8,680,088. Theft of automobile parts and accessories comprised 29.7% of all larcenies in the four counties. Clearances of larcenies in the metropolitan counties totaled 6,780.



CHAPTER 11  
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor vehicle theft in Kansas is included within the theft statute, K.S.A. 21-3701. Because of the large monetary loss due to motor vehicle theft, the offense is tabulated separately from larceny of other types of property for the Uniform Crime Report. Motor vehicle theft is "the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle"; a motor vehicle is defined as "a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 27).

In 1980 there were 6,371 incidents of motor vehicle theft, 52 more than in 1979. There were 2.68 motor vehicle thefts per 1,000 residents in 1980. The total value of property loss attributed to motor vehicle theft was \$19,053,120. The total value of stolen motor vehicles, however, was \$20,576,309. This apparent discrepancy is explained by the hierarchy rule: when motor vehicles are stolen concurrently with commission of a higher offense, the value of the stolen vehicle is entered with the higher offense. A total of 4,423 motor vehicles were recovered. Clearances of motor vehicle theft totaled 1,672.

Over three-fourths (78.6%) of all motor vehicle thefts, 5,007, occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. The value of property loss to motor vehicle theft in the larger cities totaled \$14,592,815. Agencies in the larger cities recovered 3,377 stolen motor vehicles. Clearances of motor vehicle thefts in the larger cities totaled 1,041.

There were 3,900 motor vehicle thefts in the four metropolitan counties, resulting in a loss of \$11,718,937. Recovered motor vehicles totaled 2,594 in the four counties. There were 708 clearances of motor vehicle thefts in the metropolitan counties, 42.3% of all clearances of motor vehicle thefts in Kansas.



## CHAPTER 12

### ARSON

Arson is defined under the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as "any malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc." (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 58). The Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson; hence arson occurring in multiple-offense situations is reported, as is the highest ranking concurrent offense.

There were 1,313 known incidents of arson in 1980. By comparison there were 902 reports of arson in 1979. Because the arson report was initiated in 1979, it is likely that the increase in reported arsons reflects increased agency participation in the reporting system as much as a true increase in the incidence of arson.

Of the total number of arsons, 691 (52.6%) involved structural property, 396 (30.2%) involved mobile property, and 226 (17.2%) involved other property. A small proportion of the structural property which was burned, 12.2%, was unused, unoccupied, or abandoned. Property damage due to arson totaled \$8,470,978. There were 263 clearances of arson in 1980, over one-third (36.1%) of which involved juveniles only.

The cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 523 arsons, 75.7% of the total number reported. Property loss to arson in those cities totaled \$5,739,522.

There were 725 arsons (55.2%) in the four metropolitan counties, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee, and Wyandotte. Value of property loss to those arsons, \$3,527,715, represented 41.6% of the total loss to arson in Kansas.



## CHAPTER 13

### ARRESTS

Arrest data is provided on the number of persons arrested, cited or summoned for criminal acts in both Crime Index and Class II categories. The age, sex, race, and ethnic origin of persons arrested each month are tabulated. Additionally, the disposition of juveniles taken into custody is noted.

In 1980 there were 75,567 individuals arrested for criminal offenses. Arrests in 1980 increased 6.8% over 1979. Of the total, 18,496, or 24.5%, were for Crime Index offenses, and 57,071, or 75.5%, were for Class II offenses. Juveniles arrested totaled 19,315, or 25.6% of all arrests.

Arrests of males totaled 62,020, comprising 82.1% of all arrests in Kansas. There were 2,787 males arrested for Violent Crimes and 12,384 arrested for Property Crimes. Arrests for Crime Index offenses comprised 24.5% of male arrests. Arrests of females totaled 13,547. There were 246 females arrested for Violent Crimes and 3,079 arrested for Property Crimes. Arrests for Crime Index offenses comprised 24.5% of all arrests of females. Juveniles comprised 23.3% of males arrested and 35.8% of females arrested.

Of the total number of individuals arrested, 63,099, or 83.5%, were white; 11,544, or 15.3%, were black; 717, or 0.9%, were American Indian nationalities; and 207, or 0.3%, were other races. Individuals of Hispanic origin comprised 4.6% of those arrested.

There were 20,039 juveniles who had contact with law enforcement agencies, not all of whom had been taken into custody for committing an offense. Of those juveniles 13,475, or 67.2%, were referred to juvenile court or probation department.

1980




FIGURE 23

1980





FIGURE 24

CHAPTER 14

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Law enforcement officers may become victims of assault as a consequence of their occupations. The Uniform Crime Report addresses all assaults on officers which involves more than mere verbal abuse or minor resistance to an arrest" (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 62).

One sworn officer was killed in the line of duty in 1980. He died as a result of a shotgun blast to the head while sitting in his patrol car with a fellow officer. One individual was arrested and charged in the case.

There were 1,244 non-fatal assaults on law enforcement officers in 1980. In 375 instances, 30.1%, officers sustained injury as a consequence of the attack. Assailants used personal weapons, hands, fists, feet, etc., in 985 cases. The largest number of assaults, 531, or 42.7%, occurred as officers responded to disturbances. There were 966 assaults on officers assigned to one-person vehicles; in 73.8% of those assaults, the officer was assisted. Over half of all assaults on law enforcement officers, 628, or 53.1%, occurred between 8:01 P.M. and 2:00 A.M. There were 1,183 clearances of assaults on sworn officers; a rate of 95.1%.

 1980




CHAPTER 15

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

There were 227 law enforcement agencies in Kansas which submitted 1980 law enforcement employee data. Four additional agencies were covered by the reporting agencies. As of October 1, 1980, there were 4,947 individuals employed in law enforcement agencies.

Over three-fourths (77.5%) of all law enforcement employees, 3,836, were sworn officers. The median age of sworn officers in 1980 was 34.7 years. There were 3,512 male officers, 91.6%, and 324 female officers, 8.4% of all sworn employees. A total of 3,645 were white, 165 were black, 24 were American Indian, and 2 were Oriental. There were 80 officers of Hispanic ethnicity. The largest proportion of officers, 1,429, or 39.8%, had some college education. There were 884 officers with 6 to 10 years of service in their reporting agencies. The largest proportion of officers, 25.1%, had 3 to 5 years of total experience in law enforcement.

There were 1,111 civilian employees of law enforcement agencies. The median age of civilian employees was 35.5 years. Male civilian employees totaled 331 and female civilian employees totaled 780. Whites comprised 93.2% of the civilian law enforcement personnel. There were 37 Hispanic individuals employed as civilian staff of law enforcement agencies.

## GLOSSARY

**ACTUAL OFFENSE:** An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.

**ALL OTHER OFFENSES:** State and local offenses not otherwise specified.

**ARREST:** The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law, to charge him or her with a criminal offense or to initiate juvenile proceedings.

**ARSON:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud.

**ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

**ASSAULT, OTHER:** An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

**BURGLARY:** The unlawful entry of or concealment within a structure to commit a felony or theft.

**CLASS I:** Classification of offenses including the Crime Index and negligent manslaughter.

**CLASS II:** Classification of offenses encompassing all crimes not included in Class I. However, for purposes of this publication negligent manslaughter is included with the Class II offenses.

**CLEARANCE:** An offense for which at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for adjudication; or for which said procedure would be completed were it not for reasons preventing law enforcement officers from acting. Such reasons include death of the offender, confession by an offender for another offense under different jurisdiction, denial of extradition, refusal of victim to cooperate, prosecution of offender for a lesser charge, and policy regarding handling of juveniles.

**CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault.

**CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

**CRIME INDEX:** Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.

**CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS:** Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag; and refusing to assist an officer.

**DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED:** The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

**DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION:** Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

**DRUNKENNESS:** All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorderly, common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.

**EMBEZZLEMENT:** Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

**FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING:** All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

**FRAUD:** Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

**GAMBLING:** Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.

**JUVENILE:** Person under the age of eighteen.

**LARCENY (THEFT):** The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

**LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION:** Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

**METROPOLITAN COUNTIES:** Classification comprised of the four counties with populations greater than 100,000: Johnson County, Sedgwick County, Shawnee County, and Wyandotte County. These four counties are substantially larger than the remaining 101 counties.

**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT:** The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

**MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER:** The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

**OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN:** All charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family or children.

**PROPERTY CRIMES:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

**PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE:** Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

**RAPE:** The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

**REPORTED OFFENSE:** An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

**ROBBERY:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

**RUNAWAY:** Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

**SEX OFFENSES:** Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.

**STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING:** Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

**SUSPICION:** Arrests for examination by police, after which persons arrested are released.

**UNFOUNDED OFFENSE:** An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.

**VAGRANCY:** Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc".

**VANDALISM:** The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

**VIOLENT CRIMES:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

**WEAPONS OFFENSES:** Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.
