PREFACE

The Department of Corrections is responsible for persons civilly committed to the California Rehabilitation Center as civil narcotic addicts under a program which started in 1961 pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 3000 et seq. The typical commitment process involves an individual being convicted of a felony, examination by a physician certifying the individual is addicted to heroin, sentencing being set aside, and a civil commitment to the California Rehabilitation Center program. In the past most commitments were for seven years with a provision for early discharge for the successful completion of three drug-free years as an outpatient. Recently the term of the civil commitment was made the same as it would have been for the felon offense under the Uniform Determinate Sentencing Act of 1976. Almost all the individuals have spent the institutional phase of their civil commitment at the California Rehabilitation Center.

Summary Statistics, Civil Commitment Program for Narcotic Addicts is a statistical presentation for population, movement, and characteristics of persons in the program during the calendar years 1979 and 1980. Institution population are referred to as residents, and releases to the community are referred to as outpatients. These data cover movements into and out of the institution and outpatient programs during each calendar year. The characteristics of the populations are as of December 31, of the designated year.

1979 and 1980

SUMMARY

INSTITUTION POPULATION AND MOVEMENT

California Rehabilitation Center institution population numbered 841 civil narcotic addicts on December 31, 1980. This was a ratio of 3.5 persons per 100,000 State population, the lowest since the program began in 1961. The highest ratio was 15.8 per 100,000 State population on December 31, 1969. The December 31, 1980 institution population of 841 persons was 10.5 percent lower than the population of 940 a year earlier.

CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS NEWLY RECEIVED FROM COURT

The courts committed fewer persons to the California Rehabilitation Center program during 1980 than any year since the program began. Over 98 percent of the 414 male civil narcotic addicts admitted had a felony charge pending. Nearly 96 percent of the 98 female civil narcotic addicts had a felony charge pending. The rate of commitment decreased from 12.11 per 100,000 State population during 1971 to a rate of 2.15 during 1980.

CHARACTERISTICS OF RESIDENTS IN CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER INSTITUTION PROGRAM

The California Rehabilitation Center population on December 31, 1980, consisted of 841 persons, 656 men and 185 women. This was a decrease of 10.5 percent from the 940 persons in the institution program December 31, 1979. Virtually all of the men (97.4 percent) had been charged with a felony, the majority involving crimes against property. Although most of the women (89.7 percent) also had felony charges, their offenses predominantly involved controlled substances and marijuana. The median age for male and female addicts increased from the previous year to 29.5 and 28.2 years, respectively. For both men and women, the proportion of Mexican-Americans increased while the black and white populations decreased from a year earlier.

CIVIL COMMITMENT PROGRAM FOR NARCOTIC ADDICTS

CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS RELEASED FROM THE INSTITUTION

During 1980 1,687 men and 429 women were released from the institution program. Of those released 79.8 percent of the men and 87.9 percent of the women were released to outpatient supervision. Most of the others released from the institution program were returned to court for sentencing on their original criminal charges.

OUTPATIENT POPULATION

Outpatients under supervision in the community decreased 28.6 percent from 3,586 civil narcotic addicts on December 31, 1979, to 2,559 persons on December 31, 1980. As the institution population declines so does the outpatient population.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONAL CENTERS

The Department of Corrections has community correctional centers in both northern and southern California. From 1975 through 1979 these centers housed a few civil narcotic addicts. These facilities did not house civil narcotic addicts during 1980.

INSTITUTION POPULATION AND MOVEMENT

California Rehabilitation Center institution population numbered 841 civil narcotic addicts on December 31, 1980. This was a ratio of 3.5 persons per 100,000 State population, the lowest since the program began in 1961. The highest ratio was 15.8 per 100,000 State population on December 31, 1969. Of the 841 narcotic addicts in the institution program on December 31, 1980, 656 were men and 185 women. The comparable population was 940 persons on December 31, 1979, and consisted of 760 men and 180 women. The population decreased during 1980 by 99 persons, or 10.5 percent, as shown in Table 1.

Male civil narcotic addicts received in the institution program during 1979 numbered 2,173. Of those received, the largest number was 1,385 male outpatients returned to the institution program, and the next highest 539 men who were newly received from court. During 1980 the 1,774 men received in the institution represented a decrease of 18.4 percent from the number received during 1979. Of the 1,774 men, 1,195 men were outpatients returned to the institution and 414 men were newly received from court.

There were 2,475 men released during 1979, of which 75.7 percent, or 1,874 men were released to outpatient status and 322 were discharged by court order. During 1980 there were 1,878 men released, 71.7 percent, or 1,347 men to outpatient status, 340 men discharged from the program, and the remainder released for other reasons.

The female civil narcotic addicts displayed a pattern that was similar to the men with the exception that during 1980 the ending population increased slightly over the 1979 ending population. There were 540 women received in the institution program during 1980, including 98 newly received from court and 337 women returned from outpatient status. During 1979, of the 601 women who were received in the institution program, 126 women were new admissions and 366 women were returned to the institution program. Of the 535 women released during 1980, the majority were placed on outpatient status. Of the 609 women released during 1979, 552 women were placed on outpatient status (Table 2).



CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS NEWLY RECEIVED FROM COURT

The courts committed fewer persons to the California Rehabilitation Center program during 1980 than in any other year since the program began. Over 98 percent of the 414 male civil narcotic addicts admitted had a felony charge pending. Nearly 96 percent of the 98 female civil narcotic addicts had a felony charge pending. The rate of commitment decreased from 12.11 per 100,000 State population during 1971 to a rate of 2.15 during 1980 (Table 3). Attitudinal changes in narcotic offenders, legislative changes, and changes in community support programs due to the reduction in state and federal funds were contributing factors in the reduction of civil narcotic commitment admissions.

Burglary offenses represented the largest percentage of the total male civil narcotic addict admissions for 1979 and 1980, 37.1 percent and 38.9 percent respectively. Controlled Substance Schedules I and II (opiate) offense groups for the men represented the second highest percentage, 27.9 percent during 1979 and 24.4 percent during 1980 (Table 4A). The two principal offense groups for the female civil narcotic addict admissions were Controlled Substance Schedules I and II (opiate), 38.8 percent during 1979 and 25.5 percent during 1980, and forgery and check offenses, 18.2 percent during 1979 and 21.4 percent during 1980 (Table 4B).

The rate of commitment by geographic areas per 100,000 State population is shown in Table 5. A decrease of 26.6 percent occurred between 1979 and 1980 when the rate went from 2.93 to 2.15. Los Angeles County represented 27.5 percent of the new admissions during 1979 and 24.4 percent during 1980, a decrease of 3.1 percentage points.

Of the 539 men received during 1979, 44.1 percent were white, 33.0 percent Mexican-American, and 21.3 percent black. During 1980 the ethnic distribution for the 414 men admitted was 38.2 percent white, 41.3 percent Mexican-American and 17.9 percent black (Table 6A). The ethnic distribution for the 126 women received during 1979 was 50.8 white, 24.6 percent Mexican-American, and 19.1 percent black. During 1980 the women received were 59.2 percent white, 19.4 percent Mexican-American, and 15.3 percent black (Table 6B).

The median age for male civil narcotic addicts admitted during 1980 was 28.4 years, reflecting an older age group. This is also shown in the 4.6 percent admitted under 21 years and 26.3 percent under 25 years. During 1971 the median age was 24.6 years, with 13.4 percent men under 21 years and 54.0 percent under 25 years. The median age of the female civil narcotic addicts was 27.4 years, 4.1 percent under 21 years of age and 31.6 percent under 25 years. In comparison, female civil narcotic addicts admitted during 1974 had a low median age of 24.1 years, 18.3 percent under 21 years and 59.3 percent under 25 years (Tables 7A, 7B, 8A, and 8B).

CIVIL COMMITMENT PROGRAM FOR NARCOTIC ADDICTS

The educational achievement score at time of admission indicates a 7.9 median grade for 1980 for male civil narcotic addicts. The female civil narcotic addicts show an 8.0 median grade for those admitted during 1979 and 9.3 median grade during 1980 (Tables 9A and 9B).

Over 90 percent of both men and women had resided in California ten years or more before admission to the California Rehabilitation Center (Tables 10A and 10B).

Male civil narcotic addicts were a median 17.3 years old when they were first arrested. The female civil narcotic addicts were a median 19.1 years old (Tables 11A and 11B).

The percentage of male and female admissions who had served prior prison commitments was more during 1980 than 1979. In 1980, 28.7 percent of the men had prior prison commitments. The 23.6 percent who had prior California prison experience included 6.0 percent who were not discharged from their felon commitment when they came in as civil narcotic addicts. For women, the 12.3 percent with prior California prison commitments included 3.1 percent who were not discharged at the time of admission as a civil narcotic addict (Tables 13A and 13B).





CHARACTERISTICS OF RESIDENTS IN CALIFORNIA REHABILITATION CENTER INSTITUTION PROGRAM

The California Rehabilitation Center population on December 31, 1980 consisted of 841 persons, 656 men and 185 women. This was a decrease of 10.5 percent from the 940 persons in the institution program on December 31, 1979. Almost all (97.4 percent) of the male civil narcotic addict institution population and 89.7 percent of the women had a felony charge pending on December 31, 1980 (Tables 14A and 14B). Of the 639 men in the institution on December 31, 1980 with felony charges, 53.7 percent involved crimes against property offenses and 33.3 percent involved controlled substances and marijuana offenses. The 166 women in the institution on December 31, 1980 with felony charges consisted of 50 percent for controlled substances and marijuana offenses and 39.2 percent who were convicted of crimes against property offenses (Tables 15A and 15B).

Over half of the male and female civil narcotic addict institution population were committed from Southern California counties in both December 31, 1979 and 1980. Los Angeles County committed 28.5 percent of the male population and 20 percent of the female population in the institution on December 31, 1980 (Tables 16A and 16B).

Both men and women had a shift in the ethnic distribution. On December 31, 1979, the male ethnic distribution was: 41.6 percent white, 33.6 percent Mexican-American and 23.4 percent black. The comparable data for December 31, 1980 was: 39.5 percent white, 38.4 percent Mexican-American and 20.3 percent black. Female civil addicts had an ethnic distribution on December 31, 1979 of 49.5 percent white, 23.3 percent Mexican-American, and 21.1 percent black. The comparable data for December 31, 1980 was: 47.0 percent white, 28.1 percent Mexican-American and 20.6 percent black. For both men and women the proportion of Mexican-American was increasing while the white and black populations were decreasing (Tables 17A and 17B).

The median age for male and female civil narcotic addicts increased slightly from 28.9 years for the men and 27.6 years for women on December 31, 1979 to 29.5 years for the men and 28.2 years for the women on December 31, 1980. The percent under 25 years for the men decreased from 20.0 percent on December 31, 1979 to 15.1 percent on December 31, 1980. The women experienced a greater decrease in the percent under 25, going from 29.4 percent of the December 31, 1979 population to 20.0 percent of the December 31, 1980 population (Tables 18A and 18B).

Male civil narcotic addicts with prior prison terms increased from December 31, 1979 to December 31, 1980, from 18.7 percent to 22.3 percent, respectively. Women who had prior prison records represented 8.4 percent of the December 31, 1979 population and 7.0 percent of the population on December 31, 1980 (Tables 19A and 19B). Exactly the same 39.2 percent of the male civil addict population had not been released since commitment for both years (Table 20).



CIVIL COMMITMENT PROGRAM FOR NARCOTIC ADDICTS







CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS RELEASED FROM THE INSTITUTION

During 1980 there were 1,687 men and 429 women released from the institution program. Of the 1,687 men released 79.8 percent were to outpatient supervision, and of the 429 women 87.9 percent were released to outpatient supervision (Tables 21A and 21B). Most of the others released from the institution program were returned to court for sentencing on their original criminal charges.

Nearly three-fourths of the male and female civil narcotic addicts had experienced previous releases to outpatient status and had returned to the institution program with or without a new civil commitment (Tables 21A and 21B).

A median eight months was spent in the institution program by the 358 male civil narcotic addicts released to outpatient status for the first time during 1980. This eight month median has remained the same for the past four years. The 927 men released during 1980 after return without a new civil commitment spent a median four months and the 62 men re-released after return with a new civil commitment spent a median eight months. Women spent the same median time as the men before first release to outpatient status and one month less than the men for the women re-released after return without a new civil commitment (Tables 22A and 22B).

Of the 358 male civil narcotic addicts released to outpatient status, 126 or 35.2 percent had burglary 2nd offenses. This group spent eight months in the institution program before release for the first time during 1980. The next largest group of men had Controlled Substance Schedules I & II (opiate) offenses and also spent eight months in the institution program. The largest group for the female narcotic addicts released for the first time were Controlled Substance Schedules I & II (opiate) offenders who had spent nine months in the institution (Tables 23A and 23B).

1974 THROUGH 1980



OUTPATIENT POPULATION

Outpatients under supervision in the community decreased 28.6 percent from 3,586 civil narcotic addicts on December 31, 1979 to 2,559 persons on December 31, 1980. There were 3,261 persons received on outpatient status, 1,724 persons (52.9 percent) released from the institution program and 1,537 persons (47.1 percent) were reinstated or reactivated to active outpatient status during 1980. Of the 4,288 persons removed from outpatient status, 3,338 persons or 77.8 percent were suspended, 728 persons or 17.0 percent successfully completed the program, 192 persons or 4.5 percent were discharged by court order, and 30 persons died (Table 24).

Of the 1,957 male civil narcotic addicts in outpatient status on December 31, 1980, 96.2 percent had a felony charge and 3.7 percent had a misdemeanor charge. In contrast, on December 31, 1980, there were 89.4 percent of the female outpatients with a felony charge and 10.6 percent had a misdemeanor charge (Tables 25A and 25B).

Of the male addicts with a felony charge on December 31, 1980, 45.1 percent had committed crimes against property and 40.8 percent had Controlled Substance Schedules I & II (opiate) offenses. The percentages for the women differed from the men. Of the women with a felony charge 45.6 percent had committed Controlled Substance Schedules I & II (opiate) offenses and 45.0 percent had committed crimes against property offenses (Tables 26A and 26B). Over half of the men and women in outpatient status are in southern California counties, 54.6 percent of the men and 57.5 percent of the women (Tables 27A and 27B).

The ethnic distribution of the male civil narcotic addicts in outpatient status on December 31, 1980 was 42.5 percent white, 37.1 percent Mexican-American, and 19.3 percent black. The ethnic distribution for the female civil narcotic addict outpatient population was 56.3 percent white, 22.8 percent Mexican-American, and 17.8 percent black (Tables 28A and 28B).

Civil narcotic addicts in outpatient status for the first time represented 40.6 percent of the male population and 42.5 percent of the female population. Addicts in outpatient status for less than one year represented 39 percent of the men and 34.7 percent of the women during 1980 (Tables 29A and 29B).

During 1980, there were 1,361 male and 422 female civil narcotic addicts suspended for the first time after spending a median four months in active outpatient status (Tables 31A and 31B). Of the 1,347 men released during 1980 to outpatient status, 49.7 percent were suspended the same year of release. A slightly higher proportion (54.9 percent) of the female civil narcotic addicts released during 1980 were suspended the same year of release (Tables 32A and 32B). The 1,533 men and women reinstated to active status include a number of cases suspended and reinstated the same day to break the outpatient time if they got into difficulty while under outpatient supervision (Table 33).


Over one-fourth (27.3 percent) of the men released to outpatient supervision in 1980 were returned to the institution program during 1980. This was the highest rate of return for any year from 1971 through 1980. The majority (26.3 percent) were returned without a new civil commitment. Exactly the same percentage (27.3 percent) of women were returned by the end of the same year released (Tables 34A and 34B).

The disposition of persons released to outpatient status are shown on Tables 35A and 35B as of December 31, 1979 for release years 1974 through 1979 and December 31, 1980 for years 1975 through 1980.

EACH YEAR AFTER RELEASE IN 1974 THROUGH 1980


