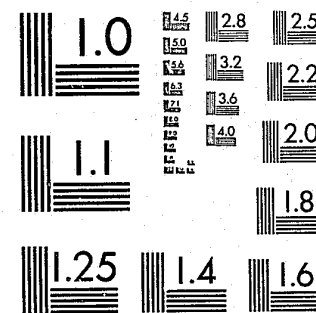

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FISCAL YEAR SUMMARY REPORT
OF POPULATION MOVEMENT
1982

This bulletin provides information relating to the volume and movement of offenders for whom Wisconsin's Division of Corrections had supervisory responsibility during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982. Data about fiscal year movements and average daily populations for the following offender populations can be found in Tables 1-5: adult correctional institutions,^{/1} Bureau of Community Corrections residential centers, juvenile institutions, probation and parole services, and absconders from probation and parole supervision.

A total of 29,556 offenders were under Division of Corrections supervision on June 30, 1982; an increase of 2,139 cases (7.8 percent) over July 1, 1981 levels. The number of offenders confined in facilities for adults, including residential centers, increased from 4,016 on July 1, 1981 to 4,487 on June 30, 1982, an increase of 11.7 percent. The juvenile institution population decreased 5 percent from 483 on July 1, 1981 to 459 on June 30, 1982. Probation and parole services caseload increased from 20,043 to 21,868 (9.1 percent) during the fiscal year while the probation and parole absconder caseload decreased 4.6 percent (from 2,875 to 2,742) during the same time period. It should be noted that these figures do not include institutionalized adults or juveniles reported as absent in the footnotes for Tables 1, 2, and 3.

^{/1}Includes Wisconsin offenders resident under contract in Minnesota correctional institutions, a program that began in September, 1981.

Note: Includes community supervision cases supervised in other states, cases from other states supervised in Wisconsin, offenders resident in Minnesota facilities, absconders from probation and parole, and residents in medical hospitals.

The average daily population for all offenders supervised by the Division of Corrections has increased steadily during the past five years from a total of 25,116 cases in fiscal year 1978 to 28,473 cases in fiscal year 1982. This is an overall increase of 13.4 percent during the five year period.

The correctional institution average daily population includes offenders confined in institutions for adults, juveniles, and youthful offenders as well as offenders residing in Bureau of Community Corrections residential centers. This population decreased slightly in 1979 and remained stable in 1980. However, the population began to rise in 1981 and by the end of fiscal year 1982, had increased 15.2 percent over 1980 levels.

/2 Sex of 1 resident in a medical hospital was not reported. For purposes of this bulletin, this case was included as a male.

/3 Sex of 7 residents in hospitals was not reported but cases are included in this publication as males.

Table C provides data on correctional institution average daily populations for the fiscal years 1978-1982 by type of institution and sex of resident. The number of adult residents in correctional institutions increased steadily during the five-year period from an average daily population of 3,381 in 1978 to 4,229 in 1982, an increase of 25.1 percent. Juvenile institution average daily populations, however, declined during the five-year period from a high of 738 in 1978 to a low of 454 in 1982, an overall decrease of 38 percent. This decrease is attributable primarily to the revision of Children's Code which became effective in November 1978. This revision provides that a juvenile may be placed in Division of Corrections custody only if he or she is adjudged delinquent of an act which would be punishable by a sentence of six months or more if committed by an adult, and only if found to be a danger to the public and in need of restrictive custodial treatment.

Average end-of-the-month population figures for total persons on probation and parole services caseloads during the past five fiscal years are presented in Table D. The average end-of-the-month population increased during each of the five years with the overall increase between 1978 and 1982 being 13.3 percent.

Probation and parole average end-of-the-month populations are presented in Table E. The number of persons under probation supervision increased during each of the five years. The average end-of-the-month number of persons under parole supervision reached a five-year high of 3,664 in 1979, declined to a low for the five-year period of 3,200 in 1981, and increased slightly (1.8 percent) to an average of 3,257 in fiscal year 1982.

Average end-of-the-month population figures for probation cases broken down by type of case and sex are presented for the five-year period in Table F. The number of adult male probation cases rose steadily from a low of 11, 191 in 1978 to 14,300 in 1982. The average-end-of-the-month figures for adult female probationers also showed a consistent increase during the same time period. The average number of persons reported as juvenile probation cases decreased steadily throughout 1978-1982 as did the number of youthful offenders on probation status.

Data relating to the end-of-the-month average population of absconders from probation supervision by type of probation supervision is presented in Table G. The total number of absconders from probation reached a five-year high of 2,674 in 1981 but declined to 2,551 in 1982, a decrease of 4.6 percent.

Average end-of-the-month populations for parole and juvenile aftercare cases for the past five fiscal years are presented in Table H. The average end-of-the-month population of cases on parole and juvenile aftercare reached a low for the five-year period of 2,942 in 1981 but increased to 3,030 in 1982 (3 percent). The populations of males and females on both youthful offender parole and juvenile aftercare supervision reached lows for the five-year period during 1982.

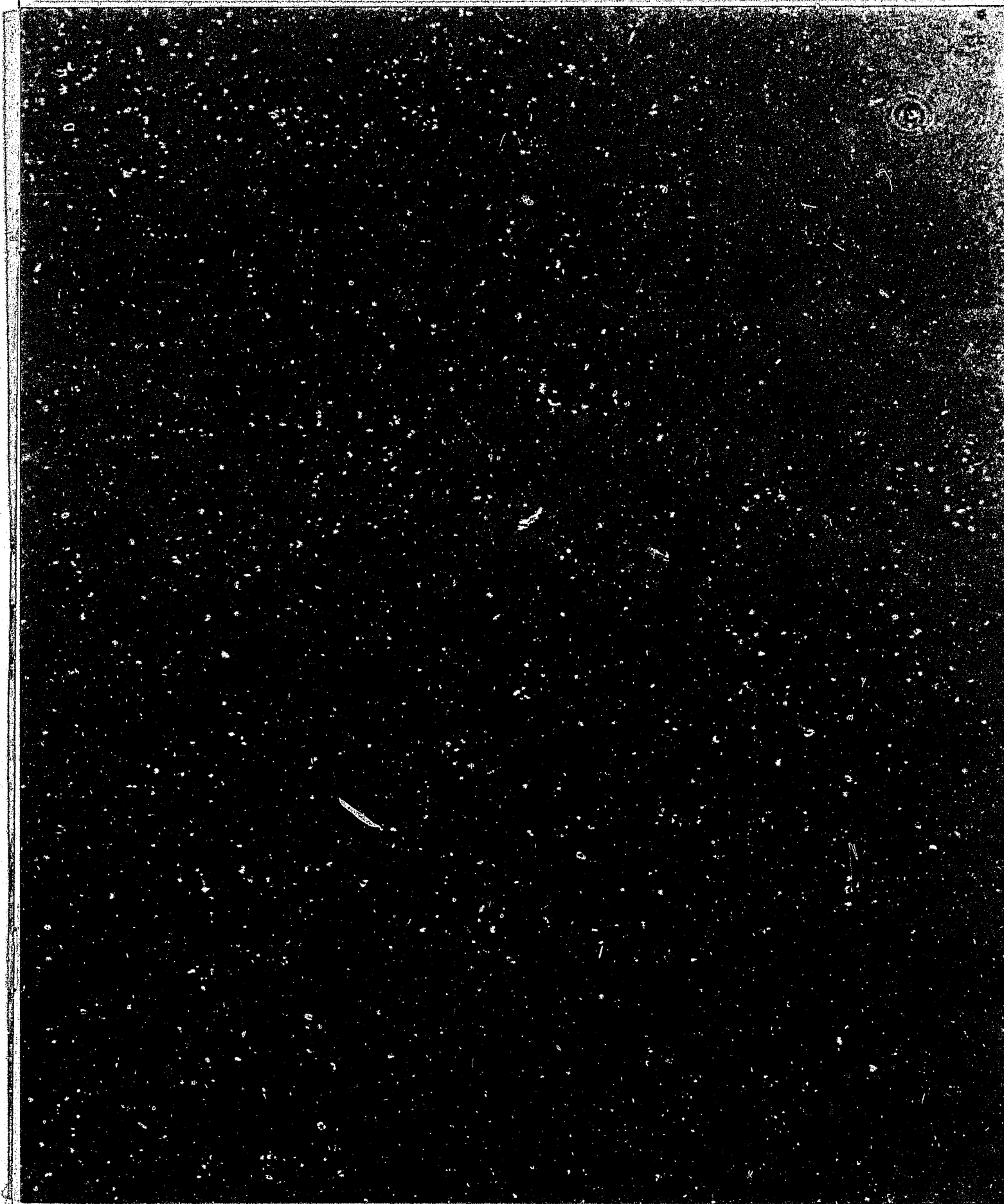
