

SUMMARY

1982

- \* CRIME INDEX OFFENSES DECREASED FROM 128,370 IN 1981 TO 119,133 IN 1982, A DECREASE OF 7.2%.
- \* VIOLENT CRIMES DECREASED BY 8.3%, FROM 8,814 IN 1981 TO 8,081 IN 1982.
  - MURDER AND NON-NEGIGENT MANSLAUGHTER DECREASED 7.4%, FROM 149 TO 138.
  - RAPE REFLECTED A DECREASE OF 18.1%, FROM 729 IN 1981 TO 597 IN 1982.
  - ROBBERY DECREASED FROM 2,605 IN 1981 TO 2,094 IN 1982, OR 19.6%.
  - AGGRAVATED ASSAULT WENT DOWN FROM 5,331 IN 1981 TO 5,252 IN 1982, A SLIGHT DECREASE OF 1.5%.
- \* PROPERTY CRIMES DECREASED BY 7.1% IN 1982, FROM 119,556 TO 111,052.
  - BURGLARY DECREASED FROM 36,656 TO 32,338, AN INCREMENT OF 11.8%.
  - LARCENY (THEFT) DECREASED FROM 76,845 TO 73,366, A DECREASE OF 4.5%.
  - MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT DECREASED FROM 6,055 TO 5,348, OR 11.7%.
  - ARSONS REPORTED TO UCR INCREASED FROM 985 IN 1981 TO 1,006 IN 1982, AN INCREASE OF 2.1%.
- \* THE VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN IN 1982 TOTALED \$52,925,959, A DECREASE OF 7.3% COMPARED TO \$57,074,478 IN 1981.
- \* THE VALUE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED IN 1982 AMOUNTED TO \$16,745,820, A 2.4% INCREASE FROM 1981.
- \* ARRESTS TOTALED 77,463 IN 1982 COMPARED TO 75,499 IN 1981, AN INCREASE OF 2.7%.
  - THERE WERE 18,747 ARRESTS FOR CRIME INDEX OFFENSES.
  - THERE WERE 58,716 ARRESTS FOR CLASS II OFFENSES.

\* TWO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WERE KILLED FELONIOUSLY IN THE LINE OF DUTY IN 1982.

ONE OFFICER WAS KILLED ACCIDENTALLY IN THE LINE OF DUTY IN 1982.

\* ASSAULTS ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TOTLED 1,130 IN 1982, A DECREASE OF 15.8% OVER 1981.

\* LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES EMPLOYED 5,266 FULL-TIME PEOPLE IN 1982.

THERE WERE 4,030 FULL-TIME SWORN OFFICERS.

IN MEMORIAM

One law enforcement officer was killed accidentally while responding to a disturbance call at a club in Wichita, Kansas. On January 5, 1982, Officer Danny D. Laffey, age 30, was struck and killed by a car during the investigation of the incident.

The driver of the vehicle was arrested and charged with manslaughter.

Two Kansas law enforcement officers were killed feloniously in 1982.

On April 19, 1982, a four-year veteran of the Butler County Sheriff's Office was killed in the line of duty. Tom Wolf, Jr., age 28, was in pursuit of a semi-trailer truck that had been involved in numerous hit and run accidents in Wichita, Kansas. After going through a roadblock near Towanda, the truck ran over Sgt. Wolf's police vehicle, subsequently killing the officer.

The driver of the truck was arrested and charged with first degree murder.

On August 9, 1982, while responding to a call of suspicious activity in a pawn shop, Patrolman Don Harbour, Senior Patrol Officer with the Riley County Police Department, was shot and killed by one of three suspects involved in the incident.

The subject responsible for shooting Officer Harbour committed suicide after wrecking a stolen vehicle. The other two subjects were apprehended that same day by fellow officers and taken into custody.

Officer Harbour had been with the Riley County Police Department twenty-two years.

The efforts and contributions of these officers to their communities and to law enforcement in general should serve as a reminder of the integrity and dedication afforded this profession. Their endeavors and their sacrifice will long be remembered.



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## INTRODUCTION

## CHAPTER 1

### INTRODUCTION

The need for uniform statistical crime data became apparent to the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) in 1930, at which time the FBI was mandated by Congress to serve as the national clearinghouse for this data. Kansas has maintained a State Uniform Crime Reporting program within the Kansas Bureau of Investigation since 1974 and is still an active contributor to the federal program.

The Crime Index for which statistics are collected is comprised of two categories, Violent Crimes and Property Crimes. Violent crimes include murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery and aggravated assault. These crimes are all committed within the presence of a victim. Property crimes consist of burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft. Arson became the eighth crime index offense in 1980; however, arson statistics are collected in a supplemental manner and are shown separately.

The above mentioned crimes were selected to serve as the Crime Index (also referred to as Part I Crimes) because of their severity, frequency of occurrence and the likelihood of their being reported to law enforcement agencies. All other crimes are considered Part II crimes for which arrest statistics only are collected.

In the event more than one crime is committed within a single instance only the most serious crime is reported. Such is the case also when one person is arrested for multiple charges, only the most serious charge is recorded. These procedures are in accordance with the FBI's "hierarchy rule." However, if a person is arrested more than once in a reporting period, each separate arrest would be tallied. If several persons are arrested for one crime the arrest of each person is tabulated.

Offenses are cleared when at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court or when law enforcement officers have the basis for taking such action, but circumstances prevent them from physically arresting the subject. This type of situation is referred to as an "exceptional clearance." Under the Uniform Crime Reporting program, agencies are to report to the state program only those arrests for crimes committed within their jurisdiction.

When using any of the tables in this publication, the reader is asked to take into consideration the many variables involved in measuring crime; thus, agency-to-agency comparisons are discouraged. Some of those variables include:

Strength and effectiveness of law enforcement agencies;  
Administrative and investigative emphases and law enforcement policies of an agency;  
Prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational policies;  
Socioeconomic factors;  
Seasonality.

Other factors might include changes in record-keeping over a period of time which will contribute to inaccuracies in trend data, even though the changes may reflect an improvement in maintaining these records.

Kansas currently has two statutes which require local law enforcement agencies to report statistical and offense data. K.S.A. 21-2501(a) mandates local agencies to submit Standard Offense Reports to the KBI on all felonies and all misdemeanors or other offenses pertaining to narcotics violations. K.S.A. 21-2504 empowers the Attorney General to collect statistical data from the clerks of district courts, sheriffs, police departments, and county attorneys in order to determine the true crime situation. A copy of these statutes may be found on page 149.

It is through the merits and efforts of the approximately 240 law enforcement agencies in the state of Kansas that this publication is presented. Their efficiency and cooperation in providing the information available in this publication allows the state program to provide valuable data to the criminal justice community, other governmental agencies and most importantly to the general public concerning crime in Kansas.

## CHAPTER 2

### CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

The Crime Index, as referenced in this publication, consists of seven offense categories, murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. Arson is considered the eighth crime index offense; however, arson offense data is collected and presented in a supplemental manner. The Committee on Uniform Crime Reports of the International Association of Chiefs of Police selected these offenses because of their severity, frequency of occurrence, and the likelihood of them being reported to law enforcement agencies.

In 1982 there were 119,133 Crime Index offenses resulting in a property loss of \$52,925,959; recovered property totaled \$16,745,820. There were 35,229 reports of clearances of Crime Index offenses in 1982; however, it should be noted that clearances may be shown for previously reported offenses and therefore will not reflect which particular offense is being cleared.

1975 - 1985



1982




FIGURE 3

1982



## CHAPTER 3

### VIOLENT CRIMES

Violent crimes consist of four offenses: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. These offenses are unique in that the victim is present as well as there being a threat of force by the perpetrator.

All violent crime categories once again experienced a decrease in 1982 over 1981. There were 8,081 violent crimes in 1982, with a property loss amount of \$963,158. Violent crime clearances totaled 4,450, a slight decrease from 4,664 in 1981.

Figure 4 shows the trend of violent crime in Kansas from 1975 to 1982 with projections through 1985.

Figure 5 shows the frequency of occurrence of each violent crime category in 1982.

1975 - 1985




## CHAPTER 4

### MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Kansas Statutes define murder and non-negligent manslaughter as follows:

"Murder in the first degree is the killing of a human being committed maliciously, willfully, deliberately and with premeditation or committed in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any felony," (K.S.A. 21-3401).

"Murder in the second degree is the malicious killing of a human being, committed without deliberation or premeditation and not in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate a felony," (K.S.A. 21-3402).

"Voluntary manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice, which is done intentionally upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion," (K.S.A. 21-3403).

Under UCR definitions, murder is defined as "the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 6).

Of the 138 murders in 1982, 27.5% were family related and 13.0% were committed during the act of another felony, such as rape, robbery, etc. Some type of firearm was used in 59.4% of the murders in 1982. Characteristics such as age, sex and race of victim and offender are collected if it is known at the time of reporting to the KBI. This data is reflected in the tables following.

## JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE

Justifiable homicide is defined as:

- "1. The killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty,
  2. The killing (during the commission of a felony) of a felon by a private citizen."
- (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 6)

Seven justifiable homicides occurred in 1982, all involving one victim-one offender situations. Victims' ages ranged from 16 to 43; all were male. Four victims were white and three were black. Offenders' ages ranged from 22-52 with six males and one female. Six of the offenders were white, one was black. Of the seven justifiable homicides, three were committed by law enforcement officers in the line of duty and four were committed by private citizens. Four of the victims were killed while in the commission of a felony, one was attacking a police officer, one was killed while police were responding to a domestic disturbance, and one was killed resisting arrest. Six were strangers to their victims and one was an acquaintance. Firearms were used in all seven instances.

## NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Negligent manslaughter is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as "the killing of another person through gross negligence," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 9).

There were no manslaughters by negligence reported in 1982.

1975 - 1985



CHAPTER 5

RAPE

K.S.A. 21-3502 defines rape as:

"...the act of sexual intercourse committed by a man with a woman not his wife, and without her consent..."

The Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook defines rape as "the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will."

Rapes reflected an 18.1% decrease in 1982 from 1981. Of the 597 rapes reported to law enforcement agencies, 443 (74.3%) were actual rapes, while 154 were classified as attempted rapes.

Tables 18 through 24 represent data concerning rape by month, hourly trend, victim and offender characteristics, weapon used, and other pertinent information.

1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 6

### ROBBERY

Kansas Statute 21-3426 defines robbery as:

"the taking of property from the person or presence of another by threat of bodily harm to his person or the person of another or by force."

This definition corresponds with UCR guidelines for robberies.

In 1982 robberies reflected the largest decrease (19.7%) of any other violent crime category, dropping from 2,605 in 1981 to 2,094 in 1982. The property loss to the above robberies totaled \$936,319. Table 1 reflects seven breakdowns of robbery and their total loss per category.

1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 7

### AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3410 as:

- "(a) Unlawfully assaulting or striking at another with a deadly weapon; or
- (b) Committing assault by threatening or menacing another while disguised in any manner designed to conceal identity; or
- (c) Willfully and intentionally assaulting another with intent to commit any felony."

Aggravated assault is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as:


"An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 15).

Of the violent crimes, aggravated assault is consistently the most frequently occurring offense. Aggravated assaults decreased a slight 1.5% from 5,331 in 1981 to 5,252 in 1982. Of the 5,252 aggravated assaults, 1,367 were committed with a firearm, 1,123 were with a knife or cutting instrument, 1,184 were by use of hands, fists, or feet and 1,578 were by means of another type of dangerous weapon. There is no property loss associated with aggravated assault; if property is involved, the offense is initially classified as a robbery. Statistics are also collected for simple assaults; however, simple assaults are considered a Part II crime and therefore, are not reflected in the Crime Index totals.

"Simple assaults do not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and are those assaults where there were no serious or aggravated injuries to the victims," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 16-17).

There were 14,333 incidents of simple assault reported in 1982.

1975 - 1985




CHAPTER 8

PROPERTY CRIMES

Burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft comprise the property crime category offenses, where there is no victim at the scene of the crime.


In 1982 there were 111,052 property crimes, a decrease of 7.1% over 1981, resulting in property loss of \$51,962,801.

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## CHAPTER 9

### BURGLARY

Burglary in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3715 as:

"...knowingly and without authority entering or remaining within any building, mobile home, tent or other structure, or any motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, railroad car or other means of conveyance of persons or property, with intent to commit a felony or theft therein."

For the Uniform Crime Report, burglary is defined as "the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 20), and includes concealment within a building. UCR guidelines rule out illegal entry of a tent or vehicle used for recreational purposes. Burglary is tabulated according to the provisions of the "Hotel Rule." This "Rule" holds that multiple burglaries of transient dwellings or commercial spaces under a single manager, incidents most likely to be reported to a law enforcement agency by the manager rather than the lessees, are counted as one offense.

There were 32,338 burglaries in 1982, an 11.7% decrease over 1981. Of the total burglaries, 75.4% were forcible entry, 17.7% were entry by no force, and 6.9% were attempted burglaries (no entry gained). The property loss to all burglaries totaled \$15,729,078 with 64.2% of that figure coming from residential burglaries.

1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 10

### LARCENY (THEFT)

Kansas Statute K.S.A. 21-3701 defines theft as:

"...any of the following acts done with intent to deprive the owner permanently of the possession, use, or benefit of the owner's property:

- (a) Obtaining or exerting unauthorized control over property; or
- (b) Obtaining by deception, control over property; or
- (c) Obtaining by threat, control over property; or
- (d) Obtaining control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another."

For the Uniform Crime Report larceny (theft) is "the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 23). Attempts to commit larceny are included in the definition.

Larcenies reported in 1982 were down 4.5% over 1981, from 76,845 to 73,366, resulting in a total property loss of \$19,068,430. Larcenies are broken down by eight specific categories of occurrences as well as by three monetary categories in Table 1.

1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 11

### MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor vehicle theft in Kansas is included within the theft statute, K.S.A. 21-3701. Because of the large monetary loss due to motor vehicle theft, the offense is tabulated separately from larceny of other types of property for the Uniform Crime Report. Motor vehicle theft is "the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle"; a motor vehicle is defined as "a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 27).

In 1982 there were 5,348 incidents of motor vehicle theft with property loss amounting to \$17,165,293. The total value of stolen motor vehicles, however, was \$18,046,665. This apparent discrepancy is explained by the Hierarchy Rule: when motor vehicles are stolen concurrently with commission of a higher offense, the value of the stolen vehicle is entered with the higher offense. Recovered vehicles totaled 3,542.

1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 12

### ARSON

Arson is defined in K.S.A. 21-3718 as:

- "...knowingly, by means of fire or explosive:
- (a) Damaging any building or property in which another person has any interest without the consent of such person; or
  - (b) Damaging any building or property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder."

Arson is defined under the Uniform Crime Reporting program as "any malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc." (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 58). The Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson; therefore, an arson will be scored in addition to any other higher ranking Part I offense.

There were 1,006 arsons reported to the UCR program in 1982, a 2.1% increase from 1981. Of the total number of arsons, 574 or 57.1% involved structural property, 237 or 23.6% involved mobile property, and 195 (14.6%) involved other property. "Other" property will include crops, timber, fences, signs and any property stored outside structures. Only 8.7% of the structural property which was burned was uninhabited, abandoned or not normally in use. Property damage due to arson totaled \$8,754,785, a 6.6% decrease over 1981.

Tables 32-34 reflect data collected by the KBI under Uniform Crime Reporting guidelines. Data shown in Tables 35-40 represent statistical data reported to the State Fire Marshal's Office under the Kansas Fire Incident Reporting System.

1980 - 1982



## SECTION II ARRESTS

## CHAPTER 13

### ARRESTS

Arrest data is provided on the number of persons arrested, cited or summoned for criminal acts for both Crime Index and Class II Offenses. The age, sex, race, and ethnic origin of persons arrested each month are tabulated. Additionally, the disposition of juveniles taken into custody is noted. Agencies are to report to the UCR program only those arrests for crimes which occur within their jurisdiction.

In 1982 there were 77,463 total arrests for criminal offenses, compared to 75,499 in 1981. Crime Index arrests constituted 24.2% of the total arrests. Juveniles arrested totaled 16,665, or 21.5% of all arrests. This figure represents a 6.7% decrease from 1981.

Tables 41 through 48 reflect arrests by age, sex, and race; juvenile and adult arrests; arrests by type of offense and total arrests by agencies.

"Depending on the seriousness of the offense and the offender's prior criminal record, a juvenile may be warned by the police and released to parents, relatives, friends, or guardians," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 71); thus, an actual arrest is not always tallied. Table 48 shows actual arrests as well as those processed in one of five ways and will include juveniles taken into custody where an arrest was not actually counted.

1975 - 1985



1975 - 1985



## CHAPTER 14

### LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Law enforcement officers may become victims of assault as a consequence of their occupations. The Uniform Crime Report addresses all assaults on officers which involve "more than mere verbal abuse or minor resistance to an arrest," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 62).

Two sworn officers were killed in the line of duty in 1982, one pursuing a speeding semi-trailer truck and the other while investigating suspicious activity. One law enforcement officer was killed accidentally during the course of an investigation.

There were 1,130 non-fatal assaults on law enforcement officers in 1982, a 15.8% decrease from 1981. In 290 instances, officers sustained injury as a consequence of the attack. Tables 49-52 reflect the type of weapon used, the activity of the officer and the time of assaults.

1982



## CHAPTER 15

### LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

Full-time law enforcement employee data is collected on an annual basis under the Uniform Crime Reporting program. This data precludes part-time employees, reserve officers, or employees paid from funds other than law enforcement.

Data from 240 police and sheriffs agencies reflect a total of 5,266 full-time employees in the state of Kansas. Of that figure, 4,030 are sworn personnel and 1,236 are non-sworn or civilian employees.

Table 53 includes a breakdown of this data by age, sex, race, and ethnicity, as well as levels of education of those employed. Years of service with an employee's current agency and total years in law enforcement are also included.

The number of law enforcement employees by each agency is presented in Table 54.

**GLOSSARY**

**ACTUAL OFFENSE:** An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.

**ALL OTHER OFFENSES:** State and local offenses not otherwise specified.

**ARREST:** The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law, to charge him or her with a criminal offense or to initiate juvenile proceedings.

**ARSON:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud.

**ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

**ASSAULT, OTHER:** An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

**BURGLARY:** The unlawful entry of or concealment within a structure to commit a felony or theft.

**CLASS I:** Classification of offenses including the Crime Index and negligent manslaughter.

**CLASS II:** Classification of offenses encompassing all crimes not included in Class I. However, for purposes of this publication negligent manslaughter is included with the Class II offenses.

**CLEARANCE:** An offense for which at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for adjudication; or for which said procedure would be completed were it not for reasons preventing law enforcement officers from acting. Such reasons might include death of the offender, confession by an offender for another offense under different jurisdiction, denial of extradition, refusal of victim to cooperate, prosecution of offender for a lesser charge, and policy regarding handling of juveniles, etc.

**CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault.

**CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

**CRIME INDEX:** Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.

**CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS:** Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag; and refusing to assist an officer.

**DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE:** The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

**DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION:** Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

**DRUNKENNESS:** All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorderly, common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.

**EMBEZZLEMENT:** Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

**FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING:** All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

**FRAUD:** Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

**GAMBLING:** Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.

**INCENDIARY:** Involving a deliberate burning of property.

**JUVENILE:** Person under the age of eighteen.

**LARCENY (THEFT):** The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

**LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION:** Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT:** The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

**MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER:** The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

**OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN:** All charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family or children.

**PROPERTY CRIMES:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

**PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE:** Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

**RAPE:** The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

**REPORTED OFFENSE:** An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

**ROBBERY:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

**RUNAWAY:** Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

**SEX OFFENSES:** Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.

**STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING:** Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

**SUSPICION:** Arrests for examination by police, after which persons arrested are released.

**UNFOUNDED OFFENSE:** An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.

**VAGRANCY:** Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."

**VANDALISM:** The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

**VIOLENT CRIMES:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

**WEAPONS OFFENSES:** Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.

**STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS**

**21-2501a.** Maintenance of records of felony offenses and certain misdemeanors by law enforcement agencies; reports to bureau of investigation; form. (a) All law enforcement agencies having responsibility for law enforcement in any political subdivision of this state shall maintain, on forms approved by the attorney general, a permanent record of all felony offenses reported or known to have been committed within their respective jurisdictions, and of all misdemeanors or other offenses which involve the violation of the uniform controlled substances act.

(b) All law enforcement agencies having the responsibility of maintaining a permanent record of offenses shall file with the bureau of investigation, on a form approved by the attorney general, a report on each offense for which a permanent record is required within seventy-two (72) hours after such offense is reported or known to have been committed.

**21-2504.** Attorney general may call upon designated officers for information; forms. (a) For the purpose of controlling crime and obtaining reliable statistics about crime and criminals, the attorney general may call upon and obtain from the clerks of district courts, sheriffs, police departments and county attorneys all information that said attorney general may deem necessary in ascertaining the true condition of the crime situation; and it shall be the duty of the above-mentioned officers to furnish the information so requested by the attorney general.

(b) The attorney general shall provide, upon request, forms for fingerprint impressions, for the permanent record of offenses, and for the reports of offenses required by K.S.A. 21-2501 and 21-2501a.
