

H I G H L I G H T S

- * A total of 802 children, 729 boys and 73 girls were admitted to Wisconsin's juvenile correctional institutions in calendar year 1982 as compared with 806, 741 boys and 65 girls, in 1981. This decrease, which is 0.5 percent is the smallest reported since 1979 when admissions began to drop following adoption of Wisconsin's revised Children's Code in November, 1978. The revised code provides that children can be placed in Division of Corrections juvenile institutions only if (1) adjudged delinquent because of an act which would be punishable by a sentence of six months or more if committed by an adult and (2) found to be a danger to the public and in need of restrictive, custodial care and treatment.
- * Seven hundred and twenty nine boys were admitted to Wisconsin's juvenile institutions in calendar year 1982: 530 new admissions, 87 returns from aftercare supervision, 106 returns pending aftercare revocation hearing, and 6 without a Wisconsin disposition. These non-Wisconsin cases are excluded from all tables in this publication. The seventy three girls admitted during the same time period included 55 new admissions, 7 returns from aftercare supervision, and 11 returns pending aftercare revocation hearing. (Tables 1, 1-A)
- * Seven counties, Milwaukee (Milwaukee Region) and Kenosha, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha (Southeastern Region) accounted for over one-half (58.1 percent) of all admissions during calendar year 1982. The Milwaukee Region accounted for 42.8 percent of all admissions; the Southeastern Region for 15.3 percent. (Table 3)
- * Boys admitted to juvenile institutions during 1982 were reported to have a median age of 16.5 years; girls, a median age of 16.4 years. (Table 4)
- * The median age for boys received as new admissions was 16.4 years while boys entering the juvenile institution as returns from aftercare supervision were reported as having a median age of 16.6 years. Girls reported as new admissions during calendar year 1982 had a median age of 16.3 years; girls returned from aftercare during the same period were found to have a median age of 16.6 years. (Tables 5, 6)
- * Somewhat less than three-fifths (58.2 percent) of the boys and two-thirds (67.1 percent) of the girls admitted during 1982 were white. One-third (32.9 percent) of the boys were black as were slightly less than one-fifth (17.8 percent) of the girls admitted during the same time period. (Table 7)
- * Newly-admitted boys were most often reported to have been involved in burglary (34.5 percent), other types of theft (17.2 percent), and auto theft (14.5 percent) just prior to institutionalization. Other theft (32.8 percent), auto theft (21.8 percent), and aggravated assault, battery (10.9 percent) were reported most frequently as delinquent acts committed by newly-admitted girls. (Table 10)

* Slightly more than two-thirds (67.9 percent) of the boys returned from aftercare supervision during 1982 were reported to have been involved in law violations. Seven girls were returned from aftercare, 6 because of absconding from supervision and 1 because of other problems. (Table 11)

* Nine out of 10 boys and girls received as new admissions during 1982 were reported to have had some type of prior official probation experience. (Table 13)

* Over two-thirds (68.7 percent) of the boys and 52 of the 55 girls received as new admissions had some degree of involvement with child guidance clinics or other public or private child caring agencies prior to institutionalization. (Table 14)
