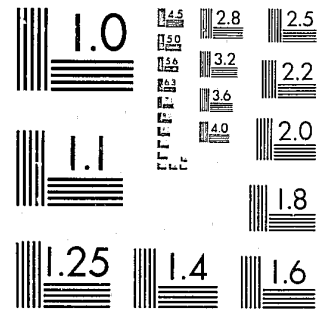


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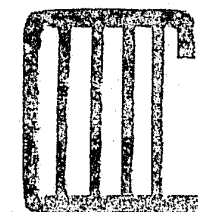

The Detention Standards and Services Section, Department of Corrections, establishes minimum standards for the physical condition of county jails, municipal jails, and county juvenile detention and shelter care facilities for the treatment of inmates with respect to their health and safety and security of the community and makes recommendations to such institutions to ensure compliance with the requirements of the minimum standards. The Section provides consultation services for the design, construction, and administration of detention facilities, makes studies and surveys of programs and administration of such facilities, inspects each institution at least once annually, and gives notice to the county board and sheriff or to corporate authorities of the municipality of any non-compliance with minimum standards. In addition to the sheriff, a copy of the county detention facility inspection report is forwarded to the county clerk, county board chairman, chief circuit judge, county resident judge, state's attorney, and the regional director of the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission (ILEC). Municipal jail inspection reports are forwarded to the chief of police, mayor, city clerk, and ILEC regional director.

The legal authority which governs the Section's activities is contained in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38 - Criminal Law and Procedure, Section 1003-15-2.

Appendix I reflects noncompliances with the Illinois County Jail Standards. Of 102 counties, four do not operate a jail. There were 1,096 noncompliances and 519 recommendations to improve jail operations. Nine county jails and two county work release centers had no noncompliances.

The 1,096 noncompliances identified during the inspections of county jails were grouped into two categories: administration, including operations and support services, (610); and building and equipment (486). The 519 recommendations cover the full spectrum of facility operations.

County jails continue to provide programs for detainees. Sixty-eight counties have a work release program; 97 have counseling services that assist in family, religious, and/or employment problems; 90 provide counseling treatment for drug abuse and alcohol addiction; 84 offer library services; 91 offer religious services; and 73 have recreational programs that provide out-of-cell activity, either indoor or outdoor. In two of the counties operating a work release program, housing accommodations are separate geographically from the jail complex.

Appendix II reflects population statistical data, including those in the sentenced category, and the bed capacity of county jails. It is noted that Cook County figures include the county jail complex and the Maywood Branch facility. Cook County had 105,231 inmates for FY1981, totaling 1,409,210 inmate days; an average daily population of 3,861; and an average of 13 jail days per inmate. The remainder of the county jails had 108,644 inmates for 943,845 jail days; an average daily population of 2,585; and an average of 8 jail days per inmate.

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Appendix III depicts both the noncompliances with the Municipal Jail and Lockup Standards and the population statistical data. As in county inspections, the 259 noncompliances identified were grouped into two categories: administration (121) and building and equipment (138). One hundred and seventy cities had no noncompliances. A total of 239 recommendations were offered with a view toward improving jail operations.

The number of active municipal jails and lockups fluctuated throughout the year. At the end of the reporting period, there were 271 active facilities. There were 391,168 persons (adults and juveniles) processed through Illinois municipal jails or lockups during this reporting period.

Appendix IV depicts the noncompliances noted during inspections of 13 independent county juvenile detention facilities. An independent facility is one which is not part of the county jail operation. The 118 non-compliances with the County Juvenile Detention Standards were grouped into four categories: administration (49); operations (14); building and equipment (45); and programs (10).

Appendix V reflects population statistical data for the county juvenile detention facilities. There were 11,343 juveniles held in the 13 county detention centers with an average daily detainee population of 320. Additionally, 58 county jails processed 1,928 juveniles and municipal jails processed 5,362 juveniles during the reporting period.

In addition to inspecting county and municipal detention facilities, the Section conducted 42 inspections of State-operated facilities, including adult correctional centers, adult community correctional centers, juvenile residential centers, and youth centers. During this period, the responsibility for inspection of State facilities was transferred to the Department's Operation and Program Audit Unit.

In FY1981, Section personnel conducted 426 inspections; 67 special investigations; 102 unusual occurrence investigations; 1,096 consultation and assistance visits, as well as 1,639 telephone consultations; 24½ days of on-site training for county and municipal jail officers, which included 31 on-site training workshop sessions; and reviewed 34 blueprints on new jail construction or remodeling of existing facilities. During this period, the responsibility for blueprint review was transferred to the Department's Capital Programs Unit.

Six-month notices were sent to six county and one municipal jail. Departmental action on four of the county jails and the one municipal jail will be considered pending reinspection of the facilities. No further action was taken on one county jail as a result of a reinspection, and the other county is constructing a new jail.

The Attorney General was requested to file petitions in the appropriate court to require three county jails and two municipal jails to comply with the Standards established by the Department or for other appropriate relief. One of the counties is constructing a new jail and another is preparing plans to renovate and enlarge the facility.

One county (Pope) which voluntarily closed its jail in 1974 as a result of adverse inspection reports, renovated the detention area and reopened their jail.

The revised County Jail, Municipal Jail and Lockup, and County Juvenile Detention Standards were printed and distributed. Respective inspection checklists were revised to conform with the Standards. County Shelter Care Standards were developed, approved by the Joint Legislative Committee on Rules, filed with the Secretary of State, printed, and distributed.
