Statistical Yearbook of the Netherlands 1982

The judicial and criminal statistics contain data on the upholding of justice. They elucidate the activities of police and justice, and give particulars on criminality and offenders. Attention is also paid to the infliction and the execution of penalties.

Police

Every month the State and Municipal Police submit reports of the crimes brought to their notice and of the known suspects per municipality; they also report the confirmed non-indictable offences. The Royal Marechaussee furnish similar reports for their territory. From these data criminality and the activity of the police can be followed closely. The police authorities also state the number of personnel employed per municipality (Criminal Police Statistics).

Victims of crime

Data on victims of crime have been derived from a sample survey among dutch people aged 15 years and over. The survey included questions about 16 crimes.

Shop-lifting

Since 1977 the Netherlands Central Bureau of Statistics compiles information about shop-lifting at department stores and large textile and clothing stores. The data are supplied by about 300 establishments.

A survey planned for the future will cover all branches of retail trade.

Justice

Criminal cases: As soon as a case is sent by the police to the Public Prosecutor, the Public Prosecutor's department sends a duplicate of the information sheet to the CBS. The information sheets, which contain particulars on offence and suspect, are followed by reports on the disposal of the case, wherever required for each judicial body (District Court, Court of Appeal, High Court) involved. The Cantonal Courts deal with the non-indictable offences and give annual reports on the disposal of the cases. Appeals are brought before the District Court, which also sends in corresponding data every year.

Each quarter these authorities furnish summarizing reviews on the disposal of economic and tax offences.

Civil cases: each quarter the District Courts submit reports on civil cases; the other authorities do so once a year.

Administration actions: the authorities entrusted with administrative jurisdiction (Council of Appeal and Central Council of Appeal for social insurance acts, Official's Courts, the Tax judges of the Courts of Appeal and the Court of Appeal for business and industry) report yearly.

From the above material the activities (type and scope) of the various judicial bodies are published yearly in: Judicial Statistics.

Criminality

The yearly Criminal Statistics contain surveys on character, scope, development and geographical distribution of criminality, based on the above mentioned reports and annual surveys. Moreover personal particulars of the offenders, such as age, sex, occupation, residence, recidivism, are shown.

Separate publications are issued on juvenile and road traffic criminality.

In the above mentioned publications much attention is paid to the penalties imposed.

The penal institutions report annually on capacity, personnel, and prisoners. The Statistics of prisons give information about the kind of imprisonment and some particulars of the prisoners (age, sex, religious denomination, release on probation) as well as their provenance (free society or other institution).

Some surveys are devoted to those ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's Pleasure.

Child care and protection measures

The data on children placed under supervision and children provisionally committed to the care of the Child Care and Protection Board are obtained from the Ministry of Justice.

The District Courts furnish reports on adoption.


The Child Care and Protection Boards submit individual data on the cases of release or removal from parental authority and guardianship. Annually the government institutions for judicial child protection report on the admitted and departed children (Statistics of judicial child protection).

Suicide

The District Courts submit data on the confirmed suicides. They include i.a. municipality residence, age, sex, marital status etc. of the victims, the manner in which suicide was committed, and the motives.

Bankruptcies

The District Courts furnish data on each adjudication order. Afterwards a report is sent in on the way in which the bankruptcy proceedings were terminated, i.a. the debts, the assets, and the costs of the proceedings (Statistics of bankruptcies).








