



P R E F A C E

The information in this publication was compiled by the Research and Reporting Unit, Division of Program Development and Evaluation. The report was prepared by Marilyn P. Davis, Statistician. Typesetting and graphics were done by Sharon S. O'Keefe and Carol L. Thompson, Graphic Artists. Coordination and review were provided by Helen S. Hinshaw, Reporting Supervisor.

In fiscal year 1982, this annual report was expanded to two sections (previously only commitments were reported) and has been prepared in a similar manner this fiscal year. The first section, "Commitments", contains statistics pertaining to persons who were received at the county and city jails and city jail farms during the fiscal year of the report (July 1 through June 30). The second section, "Confinements", contains statistics pertaining to all persons who were incarcerated in the local jails, although some were committed to jail in a previous fiscal year and not released prior to the beginning of the current year.

It should be noted that incarceration of a person is not indicative of whether the person has been judged innocent or guilty. Persons may be admitted and confined in jail for various reasons, such as: charged with violation of a law or an ordinance, being inebriated, material witness in a criminal case, held for investigation or protection, or held for a State hospital or other authority. Also, a person may be placed in jail before or after adjudication of the case in which he or she is involved. Each time a person is admitted and confined in jail, a separate commitment/confinement is reported, regardless of whether the person was previously confined and released for any reason.

The statistics in this report were obtained from DC-J6 forms, Record of Prisoners Confined, that were submitted monthly by the individual jails and jail farms to the Virginia Department of Corrections. In fiscal year 1983, block grant funding was implemented as the method of providing State financial assistance for the operation of local jails and the DC-J6 forms were not used to determine reimbursement payments due the localities. However, the DC-J6 forms have always served an important function of providing statistical data. Therefore, the Electronic Data Processing Unit assumed responsibility of receiving, editing, and computer processing these forms.

Commitment data from similar annual jail reports since 1943 are available and copies are available of more recent annual jail reports (fiscal years 1970 through 1982). All questions, remarks, or requests relating to this report should be directed to the following agency:




SECTION ONE: COMMITMENTS

**Commitments to County and City Jails and City Jail Farms
Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1983**


During fiscal year 1983, there were 199,250 commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms. This represents a 0.02% increase over commitments during fiscal year 1982 (199,206).

RACE AND SEX
Among the jail commitments, 64.2% were white and 35.8% were nonwhite. The number of males received was 179,353 or 90.0%. The number of females was 19,897 or 10.0%.



AGE

During fiscal year 1983, there were 2,498 commitments of persons under age eighteen, representing 1.3% of the total commitments. This was a 29.1% decrease from last fiscal year when 3,523 or 1.8% of the commitments were in this category.





OFFENSE

An analysis of offense groups for fiscal year 1983 shows that Offenses Against Decency, Peace, and Good Order were the most frequent (57,474 or 28.8%); Traffic Offenses ranked second, with 47,256 or 23.7% of all commitments.


Specifically, the most common offense was Drunkenness/Drunk and Disorderly, which comprised nearly one quarter of all commitments (47,762 or 24.0%). The second most frequent offense was Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (15.8% or 31,405 commitments). Commitments for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants increased again this year, exceeding the 30,099 commitments for this offense in fiscal year 1982 by 4.3%.

Incarceration for Violations of the Narcotic Laws accounted for 6,895 commitments or 3.5%. This represents a decrease of 5.9% from the number of commitments last fiscal year for this offense (7,330).



TYPE OF OFFENSE

Misdemeanants accounted for well over half of the total commitments again this year. Percentage breakdowns by type of offense were: misdemeanors - 60.7% or 120,998; felonies - 20.6% or 40,999; and "other offenses" - 18.7% or 37,253. There were only slight percentage changes from the previous fiscal year, with misdemeanor charges comprising 3% more of the commitments and felony and "other" charges comprising 1% and 2% fewer, respectively, than in the previous fiscal year.



PLACE COMMITTED FROM

Although Virginia cities accounted for 37.2% of the projected July 1, 1982 State population, 100,775 or 50.6% of all commitments in fiscal year 1983 were made by the cities. There were 62.8% of the projected State population residing in Virginia counties; however, only 49.4% or 98,495 of the commitments were made by the counties. Among the county courts, Fairfax, Arlington and Henrico had the largest number of commitments with 13,645, 6,111, and 5,097, respectively. The greatest number of commitments by city courts were made by Richmond, Norfolk, and Roanoke, with 15,099, 12,784, and 10,901, respectively.

AVERAGE CAPACITY AND NEW COMMITMENT ANALYSIS

The total rated capacity for all jail facilities in Virginia increased from 5,634 on June 30, 1982 to 5,664 on June 30, 1983. This was due to an increase of 30 in the Roanoke City Jail rated capacity.

For the 99 jail facilities, the average rated capacity was 57 beds per jail. The average rated capacity for jail facilities in each of the 5 regions was:

Region I	Western	28 facilities / 38 beds
Region II	Central	20 facilities / 35 beds
Region III	Northern	24 facilities / 48 beds
Region IV	East Central	13 facilities / 103 beds
Region V	Southeast	14 facilities / 101 beds

The largest rated capacity of any jail was 629 beds (Richmond City) and the smallest rated capacity was 2 beds (Essex County).

The average number of commitments per jail was 2,013 in fiscal year 1983, which was an increase of only 1 over last fiscal year's average of 2,012 commitments per jail. New commitments to all Virginia jails averaged 546 persons per day or 5.5 persons per day, per jail.




Figure 1: Commitments by Month




Figure 2: Commitments – Ten Year Comparison


**Confinements in County and City Jails and City Jail Farms
Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1983**

During fiscal year 1983, there were 205,772 occurrences of confinement of persons in Virginia jails. This is a 0.2% increase over the 205,280 confinements in fiscal year 1982.


RACE AND SEX

Of the total confinements, 63.7% were white and 36.3% were nonwhite. There were 185,484 (90.1%) males and 20,288 (9.9%) females. The percentage of females has increased slightly from the 9.4% confined in the previous fiscal year.

MALES




FEMALES



AGE

The number of confinements in jails of persons who were under age eighteen was 2,723 or 1.3% of the total confinements. This represents a 27.3% decrease in the number in this age category since last fiscal year when 3,747 confinements were of persons under eighteen.

As expected, the age percentage distribution for persons confined was the same as for persons committed. The average age of persons confined during fiscal year 1983 was 31 years, which is the same as the average age last fiscal year.





OFFENSE

Of those confined in fiscal year 1983, 57,842 or 28.1% were committed for Offenses Against Decency, Peace and Good Order; Traffic Offenses ranked second, with 47,701 or 23.2%.


Drunkenness/Drunk and Disorderly was the most frequent offense, comprising nearly one quarter of all confinements (23.3% or 47,863). Driving under the Influence of Intoxicants was the second most common offense, accounting for 15.3% or 31,547 confinements. The number of confinements for driving while intoxicated increased 4.5% over the 30,188 confinements in fiscal year 1982 for this offense.

A decrease of 5.3% occurred in incarcerations for Violations of the Narcotic Laws. There were 7,333 confinements or 3.6% of the total, compared with 7,747 or 3.8% for this category last year.



TYPE OF OFFENSE

There were 122,708 or 59.6% of all confinements during fiscal year 1983, that were charged with misdemeanors, compared with 117,936 or 57.4% in fiscal year 1982. The increase in misdemeanor confinements was offset by a decrease in the number of confinements for "other offenses". There were 37,419 or 18.2% of the total confined who were charged with "other offenses" in fiscal year 1983, compared with 20.3% or 41,596 in fiscal year 1982. The percentage for felony confinements remained fairly constant at 22.2% or 45,645, decreasing slightly from the 22.3% in fiscal year 1982.



PLACE COMMITTED FROM

Of the 205,772 confinements in Virginia jails during fiscal year 1983, 49.3% or 101,504 were committed from counties and 50.7% or 104,268 were committed from cities. The counties committing the largest number of those confined during the year were: Fairfax (14,067), Arlington (6,300), and Henrico (5,302). Of the cities, Richmond committed the greatest number (15,810), followed by Norfolk (13,308) and Roanoke (11,087), which ranked second and third, respectively.

CAPACITY AND CONFINED POPULATION ANALYSIS

The daily average number of persons confined in a Virginia jail facility in fiscal year 1983 was 65.1 persons. This was 14.2% more than the average rated capacity of 57 beds. In comparison with the fiscal year 1982 daily average of 69.7 persons per jail, there was a decrease of 6.6% or 4.6 persons per day.

Prisoner days in the 99 facilities during the current fiscal year totaled 2,351,442, which was 168,399 less than the 2,519,841 prisoner days recorded in fiscal year 1982. The average per jail was 23,752 prisoner days, as compared to 25,453 days in fiscal year 1982. Although there was a slight increase in the number of confinements (0.2%), there was a shorter length of stay in fiscal year 1983 (11.4 days) than in fiscal year 1982 (12.3), which accounted for the fewer number of prisoner days.

There were 52 jails that recorded more total prisoner days than rated capacity days available for the year. Daily statewide jail population exceeded the rated capacity of 5,664 and averaged 6,442 persons. The maximum number of persons confined on any given day during fiscal year 1983 was 7,240 persons.





Figure 3: Confinements - Five Year Comparison




Figure 4: Prisoner Days - Ten Year Comparison




Figure 5: Confinements — First Tuesday of Each Month

DESCRIPTION

Total Confined is the number of confinements in each jail during the fiscal year, regardless of when they were committed.

Rated Capacity is extracted from the Population Survey of Local Correctional Institutions. It is the design capacity of each jail and does not necessarily represent the number of beds in the jail.

Maximum is the highest recorded population for each jail during the fiscal year.

$$40 \times 365 = 14,600$$

Capacity Days are determined by multiplying the rated capacity of each jail by 365, the total days in a year.

Actual Prisoner Days are the total number of prisoner days recorded by each jail for the entire fiscal year.

$$14,600 - 14,103 = 497$$

Net Difference is recorded as positive when the rated capacity is greater than the total prisoner days. Jails with negative numbers are, therefore, overcrowded.

$$497 \div 14,600 = 3.4\%$$

Percentage Difference is the net difference divided by the capacity days.

$$146 \div 365 = 40.0\%$$

Days Above Rated Capacity are the number of days during the fiscal year that the number of prisoners being held exceeded the rated capacity.

Percent of Year Over Capacity is the number of days over capacity divided by 365 days.

Average Daily Population is actual prisoner days divided by 365 days.

1982 County/City Population is the projected population of Virginia counties and cities on July 1, 1982, provided by the Virginia Department of Planning and Budget. Where more than one county or city use the same jail, their populations are combined.

$$\frac{38.6 \times 100,000}{31,297} = 123.3$$

Rate of Incarceration is expressed as average daily population divided by the population of the areas served. The rate is expressed per 100,000 residents.

$$\frac{40 \times 100,000}{31,297} = 127.8$$

Capacity/Population Ratio is the rated capacity of the jail divided by the population of the areas served. The rate is expressed per 100,000 residents.
