U.S. COURTS OF APPEALS

FEDERAL CIRCUIT

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit docketed a total of 1,000 new appeals. More than half of these new filings arose from the combined decisions of the Merit Systems Protection Board (378 cases) and the U.S. district courts (220 cases). Large numbers of appeals were also received from the U.S. Claims Court (148 cases) and the Patent and Trademark Office (145 cases).

A total of 896 case dispositions were reported by the Federal Circuit during the year. Approximately one-third of the overall terminations involved appeals from the Merit Systems Protection Board. The majority of the yearly case dispositions were decided by the court. Of the 636 appeals decided by the court, 79.1 percent were affirmed, 11.0 percent were modified, and 9.9 percent were reversed. The remaining 260 terminations were withdrawn prior to decision or dismissed after consideration of the court.

As of March 31, 1984, the number of cases pending on the docket of the Federal Circuit totaled 519 appeals. Almost 65 percent of the pending caseload consisted of appeals from the Merit Systems Protection Board (209 cases) and the U.S. district courts (126 cases).

Table 1 provides a summary of the workload of the Federal Circuit during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984.

TWELVE CIRCUIT COURTS OF APPEALS

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, the workload in the U.S. courts of appeals rose to record levels. A total of 31,125 new appeals were entered on the dockets of the twelve circuit courts, up 7.3 percent from the 29,011 appeals docketed in 1983. For the first time ever in a reporting period, the total number of case dispositions in the appellate courts exceeded 30,000. During 1984, the U.S. courts of appeals disposed of 30,911 appeals, up a sizable 8.1 percent from the 28,589 appeals disposed of in 1983. Even with the substantial increase in case terminations, the overall pending caseload grew by 0.9 percent during the year. As of March 31, 1984, a total of 22,757 appeals were pending on the dockets of the twelve circuit courts, up slightly from the 22,543 appeals left pending one year ago. Table 2 provides a comparison of the workload in each circuit court during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984. Appendix Tables B-1 and B-3 provide more detailed data on the appellate workload during 1984.

Filings Up 7.3 Percent

During 1984, 9 of the 12 circuit courts reported increases in their docketing activity. The largest increases in new filings occurred in the Fifth and Ninth Circuits, up 20.8 percent and 18.5 percent, respectively. Most of the filing growth in the Fifth Circuit was caused by a sizable 57.7 percent increase in new state prisoner petitions. A large portion of the Ninth Circuit's growth was the result of a 34.8 percent rise in new U.S. civil appeals (exclusive of prisoner petitions). Both of these courts also experienced a substantial increase (229 cases in each court) in the number of new non-prisoner private civil appeals docketed during the year. In the remaining seven circuit courts with increases, the rate of growth varied considerably from a high of 13.0 percent in the Eleventh Circuit to a low of 3.8 percent in the Sixth Circuit.

Three circuit courts (District of Columbia, Fourth, and Tenth) experienced declines in case filings during the past twelve months. Among these courts, the greatest drop (12.7 percent) was in the District of Columbia Circuit. The reduction in this circuit can be attributed mainly to declines in new administrative agency appeals (down 108 cases) and non-prisoner U.S. civil appeals (down 107 cases).

Nationwide, all categories of appeals except for administrative agency cases reported increases in new filings during the year. By far, the greatest numerical increases were in non-prisoner private civil appeals (949 cases) and state prisoner petitions (680 cases). A good portion of the growth in these categories can be attributed to substantial increases in appeals of both prisoner and non-prisoner civil rights cases. On a percentage basis, the largest growth was shown in bankruptcy type appeals, up 47.2 percent from 632 cases in 1983 to 930 cases in 1984. Only administrative agency type appeals declined during 1984, dropping 8.9 percent to 2,891 cases. The agency showing the most significant reduction was the National Labor Relations Board, where new appeals dropped from 872 cases in 1983 to 520 cases in 1984. Table 3 provides a comparison of the types of appeals filed during each of the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984.

Quarterly Comparison of Filings

Table 4 provides a comparison of appeals commenced, by quarter, during each of the twelve month periods ended June 30, 1978 and the first three quarters of statistical year 1984. In the January through March 1984 period, the 12 circuit courts docketed a total of 7,966 appeals, up 4.5 percent over the 7,620 appeals docketed during the same period last year. A total of 22,970 new appeals were filed in the appellate courts during the nine month period ended March 31, 1984, up 7.0 percent over the 21,475 appeals filed during the comparable period in 1983.

Dispositions Up 8.1 Percent

During the past 12 months, the appellate courts disposed of a record 30,911 appeals. In 1984, 8 of the 12 circuit courts increased their overall termination activity. The greatest rise in case dispositions occurred in the Eleventh Circuit, up a dramatic 35.4 percent to 3,406 appeals. In this circuit, the number of terminations increased in all types of appeals except for administrative agency cases, with the most significant growth being reflected in state prisoner petitions (up 302 cases) and criminal type appeals (up 261 cases). Substantial increases in case dispositions were also reported in the Fifth Circuit (up 24.1 percent); the Eighth Circuit (up 20.5 percent); the Seventh Circuit (up 13.5 percent); and the Ninth Circuit (up 10.6 percent).

During the year, four circuit courts reported decreases in their appellate terminations. The Third Circuit showed the largest reduction in total dispositions, down 11.0 percent from 2,720 cases in 1983 to 2,420 cases in 1984. Most of the decrease in this circuit was caused by sizable drops in terminations of both administrative agency appeals and state prisoner petitions.

Pending Caseload Up 0.9 Percent

Despite the record number of cases being terminated during the year, the pending appellate caseload grew slightly to 22,757 appeals. Over the past year, 5 of the 12 circuit courts were able to reduce the number of appeals pending on their dockets. The most significant decrease in pending caseload was reported by the District of Columbia Circuit, down 11.7 percent to 1,242 appeals. The drop in this circuit was the direct result of a 12.7 percent reduction in docketing activity during the year. Other courts showing reduced pending caseloads on March 31, 1984 were the Fourth Circuit (down 6.1 percent); the Seventh Circuit (down 4.4 percent); the First Circuit (down 3.8 percent); and the Eleventh Circuit (down 1.4 percent).

Seven appellate courts increased the number of cases pending on their dockets during the past twelve months. However, the rates of increase for all of these courts were less than 9.0 percent. The Third Circuit, which reported the greatest drop in pending caseload one year ago, showed the highest growth rate of 8.6 percent. Other notable increases in pending caseload were recorded in the Second Circuit (up 7.1 percent) and the Tenth Circuit (up 6.6 percent).

Cases Disposed of After Hearing or Submission

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, a total of 14,136 appeals were terminated after oral hearing or submission on briefs in the 12 circuit courts. This figure represents an 8.5 percent increase over the 13,024 appeals terminated in this manner during 1983. These 14,136 dispositions represent 45.7 percent of the total appellate terminations for 1984, up slightly from the 45.6 percent recorded last year.

CASES UNDER SUBMISSION

The overall number of cases under submission for more than 90 days on March 31, 1984 was 10.3 percent less than the 828 cases reported in March 1983. The U.S. courts of appeals, Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, and the Temporary Emergency Court of Appeals reported 743 cases held under submission for the quarter ended March 31, 1984 as provided in Table 5. A total of 505 cases (67.9 percent) were held more than three but less than six months; 116 cases (15.6 percent) were held more than six but less than nine months; 48 cases (6.5 percent) were held more than nine months but less than one year; and 74 cases (10.0 percent) were held more than one year. The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals reported 156 cases, 21.0 percent of the total cases under submission. Cases awaiting the submission of additional memoranda or awaiting an opinion in another case are not included in the totals.

U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

CIVIL WORKLOAD

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, the volume of civil cases filed, terminated, and pending in the U.S. district courts continued to increase. The number of civil cases filed during this period reached 259,798, an 11.5 percent rise over the 232,945 cases filed during the same period last year. Correspondingly, the number of civil cases terminated also rose. A total of 234,969 cases were terminated, representing an increase of 12.4 percent over the 209,056 cases disposed of last year. Because the increase in the number of filings outweighed the increase in terminations, the volume of the civil pending caseload also increased. There were 248,775 cases pending as of March 31, 1984 representing an increase of 11.1 percent, or 24,829 more than the 223,946 cases pending at the same time last year. Table 6 is a comparison, by district, of the number of civil cases filed, terminated, and pending during each of the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984. Appendix Table C-1 provides more detailed data on civil cases filed, terminated, and pending, by district.

Civil Filings - Twelve Month Period

The number of civil cases filed reached 259,798 during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984. The number of filings litigated this year is 11.5 percent more than the 232,945 cases filed last year and 72.8 percent more than the 150,373 filed five years ago.

Seventy-four of the 94 U.S. district courts experienced increases in the number of civil cases filed during 1984. Four districts experiencing the most substantial increases in the number of cases filed were Illinois, Northern (up 1,952); Texas, Southern (up 1,826); Texas, Western (up 1,739); and Michigan, Eastern (up 1,709). The efforts of the Federal government to recover overpayments of veterans' benefits are responsible for much of the rise in Illinois, Northern; Texas, Southern; and Texas, Western. The rise in filings in Michigan, Eastern can be attributed to the growing number of claims for Social Security benefits. Recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits cases and Social Security cases are discussed in further detail below.

The most significant reductions in the number of civil cases filed were in California, Northern (down 596); Minnesota (down 551); and Utah (down 287). The decrease in filings for recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits (in addition to reduced filings for recovery of defaulted student loan cases in Minnesota) are responsible for much of the decline in these districts. More detailed data on civil filings, by district and type of case, are provided in Appendix Table C-3.

Civil Filings by Quarter

A summary of civil cases commenced in the U.S. district courts during each quarter from July 1, 1977 through March 31, 1984 is provided in Table 7. The 65,205 cases filed during the three month period January through March 1984 is 4.0 percent higher than the 62,726 cases filed during the period October through December 1983, and 7.0 percent higher than the 60,960 cases filed during the same period one year ago.

Civil Filings by Jurisdiction and Nature of Suit

A total of 110,924 civil cases filed during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984 involved the U.S. government as either a plaintiff or a defendant. Those cases filed by the U.S. government reached 62,896, up 9.5 percent from the 57,418 cases filed last year. The number of suits filed against the U.S. government also rose, up 49.8 percent from 32,054 cases filed last year to 48,028 filed this year. Civil cases filed under Federal question jurisdiction increased from 85,985 to 91,353 cases. Only marginal increases were reported for diversity of citizenship cases and local jurisdiction cases (cases commenced in the U.S. territorial courts) this year.

Most of the civil suits filed by the U.S. government were actions to recover overpayments of veterans' benefits. During the year, 39,510 recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits cases were initiated. Four districts with large numbers of these cases include Texas, Southern (2,608); California, Northern (2,100); Illinois, Northern (1,982); and Texas, Western (1,898). Social Security cases accounted for 31,180 filings or 64.9 percent of all civil cases involving the U.S. government as a defendant. Cases involving claims for disability insurance under Title II of the Social Security Act more than doubled, from 11,947 in 1983 to 25,097 in 1984. Five districts which experienced the greatest number of Social Security filings were Michigan, Eastern (2,712); Ohio, Southern (1,449); and Ohio, Northern (1,419). New York, Eastern and Puerto Rico also reported a large number of these cases, 1,241 and 1,143, respectively.

Other nature of suit categories which grew substantially over the past year were bankruptcy appeals cases (up 43.7 percent), employment civil rights cases (up 16.8 percent), and negotiable instruments cases (up 15.8 percent). Notable declines in filing activity occurred in land condemnation cases (down 50.5 percent), marine contract cases (down 8.8 percent), and real property foreclosure cases (down 7.8 percent). Additional data on civil cases filed, by jurisdiction and type case, are provided in Appendix Table C-2.

Civil Terminations

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984 there were 234,969 civil cases terminated. This rise of 12.4 percent over the 209,056 cases terminated last year can be attributed to an increase in case dispositions in 70 districts. Three districts, Texas, Southern; Ohio, Northern; and Ohio, Southern, experienced the most significant rises in termination activity, with respective increases of 2,387, 2,283, and 1,901 in dispositions over last year. The rise in terminations in all of these districts resulted from increased disposition activity for recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits cases.

The largest reductions of civil cases terminated occurred in Minnesota (down 831 cases); Indiana, Southern (down 686 cases); and California, Northern (down 656 cases). The declines in these districts are largely a result of reduced terminations for recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits; the reduction of terminations for defaulted student loans also contributed to the overall decrease in Minnesota.

Civil Pending Caseload

As of March 31, 1984, the number of civil cases pending reached 248,775. This is an increase of 11.1 percent more than the 223,946 cases pending last year. This overall increase is a result of rises in the pending caseloads of 78 districts. The largest increases in civil pending cases occurred in Illinois, Northern (up 1,428); Michigan, Eastern (up 1,424); Texas, Southern (up 1,144); and Massachusetts (up 1,092). The rises in Illinois, Northern and Texas, Southern were caused by increases in the number of pending recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits cases. Michigan, Eastern reported a substantial rise in pending Social Security disability insurance claims. The increased pending caseload in Massachusetts resulted from a growth in the number of pending cases involving personal injury product liability (mostly asbestos-related cases) and suits falling under Titles II and XVI of the Social Security Act.

The types of pending civil cases which increased most significantly over the past year were recovery of overpayment of veterans' benefits cases (from 10,521 to 15,018) and Social Security disability insurance cases (from 11,872 to 23,361). Other categories of substantial increase were civil rights suits (from 24,743 to 27,329) and personal injury product liability, including asbestos-related cases (from 13,789 to 16,206). Additional data on civil cases pending, by nature of suit and district, is provided in Appendix Table C-3A.

Civil Cases Pending Three Years or More

The number of civil cases pending three years or more, excluding land condemnation, continued to increase during the past year. As of March 31, 1984 there were 16,887 civil cases pending for three years or more. This total is 9.1 percent more than the 15,473 cases pending last year. Despite the overall increase in three-year-old civil cases, ten districts were able to reduce the number of these cases pending on their dockets during the period June 30, 1983 through March 31, 1984. Those districts able to reduce their caseloads most were Kentucky, Eastern (down 179); New York, Southern (down 87); and the Virgin Islands (down 84). A decrease in the number of pending black lung cases is responsible for the reduction in Kentucky, Eastern. The decline in New York, Southern is due, in part, to a decrease in the number of pending contract actions, while the decline in the Virgin Islands resulted from the reduction of pending insanity cases. Table 8 provides a comparison of civil cases pending three years or more (excluding land condemnation), by district, as of June 30, 1983 and March 31, 1984.

There were significant increases in the number of cases pending three years or more during the nine month period ended March 31, 1984. The largest increases in such cases occurred in Massachusetts (up 251); Mississippi, Southern (up 149); Colorado (up 124); New York, Eastern (up 123); Texas, Eastern (up 118); and Illinois, Northern (up 100). The increases experienced in these districts are highlighted by increases in several nature of suit categories. The most substantial increases occurred in personal injury product liability cases (including asbestos-related cases), habeas corpus prisoner petitions, and prisoner civil rights suits. Additional data on civil cases pending three years or more, by age and district, as of March 31, 1984, is provided in Appendix Table C-6A and C-6B.

CRIMINAL WORKLOAD

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984 criminal cases filed in the U.S. district courts increased 3.3 percent. There were 36,257 cases filed this period compared to the 35,082 cases filed during this same period last year. Case terminations increased 4.3 percent this period to 34,295 from 32,886 terminations in 1983. Table 9 is a summary of case filings and terminations during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1980 through 1984.

Case filings exceeded case terminations this period by 1,962 cases, causing the pending caseload as of March 31, 1984 to be 10.2 percent over the pending caseload for the same twelve month period in 1983. This rate of increase, however, is not as high as the 12.7 percent increase in pending cases reported last year for this period. Appendix Tables D-1 provide, by district, the number of cases and defendants filed, terminated, and pending for the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984.

For the nine month period from July 1, 1983 to March 31, 1984 there were 26,325 cases filed, an increase of less than one percent over the 26,210 criminal cases filed during the same period last year. Case terminations increased to 23,886 cases this year compared to 23,835 cases terminated during the same nine month period last year.

Criminal Case Filings and Terminations by Quarter

Case filings for the quarter ended March 31, 1984 increased 17.9 percent or 1,485 cases over the filings last quarter. Case terminations were up 23.4 percent from 7,329 cases last quarter to 9,045 cases this quarter. Table 10 provides, by quarter, the number of filings and terminations for cases and defendants for the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984.

Criminal Case Filings by Major Offense

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984 case filings, excluding transfers, increased 4.1 percent compared to the 8.3 percent increase this time last year. There were 35,303 cases filed compared to the 33,920 cases filed in 1983. Filings increased in 6 of the 15 major offense categories with the largest increase (18.9 percent) in filings for violations of immigration laws. This increase reflects an enhanced effort by the Justice Department in controlling the national borders. In 1983, this effort resulted in apprehension of illegal aliens at the highest level recorded (statement by Associate Attorney General D. Lowell Jensen before the Committee on the Judiciary of the U.S. Senate, May 7, 1984).

Violations under the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act (DAPCA) were up 9.8 percent during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984. This overall increase resulted from a 23.2 percent increase in narcotics filings and a 3.3 percent increase in marihuana filings. Filings for controlled substances violations, however, decreased by 16.7 percent. Other major offense categories with increases were burglary (up 5.5 percent) and larceny and theft (up 4.7 percent).

Filings for auto thefts decreased significantly by 27.8 percent, while other major categories with a decrease in filings were less than 15 percent. Appendix Table D-2 (cases) provides a summary, by major offense, of criminal case filings during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1980 through 1984.

Criminal Case Filings by District

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984 case filings increased in 49 district courts, decreased in 44, and remained the same in one district. Only three districts had an increase over 50.0 percent: Oklahoma, Western (72.3 percent or 319 cases); Vermont (69.2 percent or 27 cases); and North Carolina, Eastern (52.9 percent or 182 cases).

In Oklahoma, Western, the majority of the increase was in traffic violations which were up 129.9 percent (243 cases). In addition, filings for narcotics violations were up 266.7 percent (16 cases). The majority of the increase in Vermont was in filings for violation of immigration laws, up 140.0 percent (7 cases) and fraud, up 216.7 percent (13 cases). In North Carolina, Eastern 175 cases were filed for traffic violations which was 224.1 percent (121 cases) over the 54 cases filed last year. This increase is partially a result of more persons choosing to appear in court for the traffic violations rather than paying the ticket. These filings also include violations for "no financial responsibility" (a citation for no liability insurance).

Filings in five districts decreased more than 25.0 percent. Those districts were Northern Mariana Islands (75.0 percent or 9 cases); Rhode Island (33.0 percent or 29 cases); Nevada (31.7 percent or 98 cases); Maryland (30.7 percent or 379 cases); and Indiana, Northern (28.0 percent or 30 cases).

Criminal Cases Pending

The number of cases pending March 31, 1984 increased 10.2 percent to 21,057 cases from 19,111 cases in 1983. Alabama, Northern and Pennsylvania, Middle had no change in the number of cases pending this year, while 61 districts had an increase in cases pending and 31 districts had decreases in cases pending compared to last year. Two districts had an increase of 50.0 percent or more: Alabama, Middle, up 50.0 percent (36 cases) and North Carolina, Western, up 55.7 percent (49 cases). An equal number of districts had a decrease of 50.0 percent or more. Those districts were: Georgia, Middle down 55.4 percent (72 cases) and the Northern Mariana Islands down 63.6 percent (7 cases).

CASES AND MOTIONS UNDER ADVISEMENT IN U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

For the first quarter of calendar year 1984, U.S. district judges reported 1,450 matters held under advisement over 60 days, a 24.3 percent increase over the 1,167 matters reported last year. There were 527 district judges, including 118 senior judges, who reported on the status of matters before the court, compared to 503 district judges for the same quarter last year (see Table 11). While 319 judges (60.5 percent) reported no matters held under advisement over 60 days, 208 judges (39.5 percent) reported matters held under advisement on March 31, 1984.

The 208 judges having matters held under advisement reported a total of 1,450 cases and motions. Of these, 867 cases and motions (59.8 percent) were held under advisement over 60 days but not more than six months; 358 cases and motions (24.7 percent) were held under advisement over six months but not more than one year; and 225 cases and motions (15.5 percent) were held over one year. The district judges of the Sixth Circuit reported the largest number of matters held under advisement with a total of 335 matters or 23.1 percent, in comparison with the Third Circuit, which reported 37 matters held under advisement or 2.6 percent of the total. District judges in the District of Columbia Circuit reported 27 cases or 1.9 percent of all matters reported.

U.S. BANKRUPTCY COURTS

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, there were 490,717 bankruptcy estates filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts, a decline of 53,225 or 9.8 percent from the 543,942 estates filed a year ago. However, the number of bankruptcy terminations rose slightly, up 8,211 or 1.9 percent compared to the same period last year. Despite the increase in terminations, the number of bankruptcy estates pending increased slightly to 842,299 or 5.2 percent above the 800,786 pending in 1983.

Table 13 is a comparison of the workload in the U.S. bankruptcy courts during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984. Additional data is provided in Appendix Tables F-1, F-3A, and F-3B.

Bankruptcy Filings Decline

The decline in bankruptcy filings this year was the most significant drop since the enactment of the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978 (P.L. 95-598 STAT, 2549). While the overall filing activity fell 9.8 percent, 21 districts experienced increases in the number of estates filed. The largest increases were in Texas, Southern (up 1,297) and Oklahoma, Western (up 855). The largest decreases occurred in Michigan, Eastern (down 2,762); Ohio, Northern (down 2,635); and California, Northern (down 2,315). Table 14 is a comparison, by district, of bankruptcy cases filed during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984.

Business and Non-Business Filings by Chapter

Declines in filing activity were reported in all chapter classifications during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984. Overall, the total number of Chapter 11 filings decreased slightly, down 2.1 percent in 1984. Non-business reorganizations under Chapter 11, however, rose to 5,294 or 41.7 percent above the 3,737 filed during the same period last year. Between 1983 and 1984, a substantial drop occurred in Chapter 7 business liquidations, from 65,138 estates last year to 47,041 in 1984, a decrease of 27.8 percent. Similarly, non-business Chapter 13 debt adjustments declined 11.3 percent, from 139,103 to 123,432 in 1984.

Table 15 summarizes the number of estates filed, by chapter of the Bankruptcy Code, during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1983 and 1984.

Bankruptcy Filings by Quarter

During the three month period January through March 1984, a total of 124,613 estates were filed, a decrease of 4,301 or 3.3 percent, compared to the 128,914 estates filed in the same period last year. However, filings during the period January through March 1984 are up 6.0 percent over the 117,589 filed in the preceding quarter. Table 16 provides a comparison of bankruptcy estates filed by quarter, from July 1, 1978 through March 31, 1984.

Terminations Up Slightly

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, a total of 449,204 estates were terminated in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. This represents an increase of 1.9 percent (or 8,211 estates) over the number terminated during the same period last year. Although nationally the number of estates terminated rose slightly, 51 districts experienced decreases in dispositions over last year, while 42 districts showed increases compared to last year. The most significant increases were reported in Texas, Southern (up 5,843); California, Central (up 4,369); and Pennsylvania, Eastern (up 4,378). The largest declines were in Indiana, Southern (down 4,992); North Carolina, Eastern (down 2,542); and Minnesota (down 2,390).

Pending Estates Continue to Climb

The pending workload in the U.S. bankruptcy courts reached an all-time record high of 842,299 estates as of March 31, 1984, up 5.2 percent from the 800,786 pending one year ago. This rise of 41,513 estates is less than one-half the numerical increase recorded a year ago in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. The 5.2 percent increase is the smallest since before implementation of the Bankruptcy Reform Act. This suggests that the dramatic rates of increase in pending estates over the past few years is beginning to level off.

Adversary Proceedings

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1984, a total of 97,509 adversary proceedings were filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts, and 114,566 were terminated. The number of adversary proceedings pending in the U.S. bankruptcy courts on March 31, 1984 was 123,442. Data on the number of adversary proceedings filed, terminated, and pending in each district is provided in Appendix Table F-AP.

Effective August 1, 1983, the **Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure** were amended to change the manner by which requests for relief from automatic stay and for lien avoidance are brought in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. These matters are now brought by motion rather than complaint. Because of this change, these matters are no longer classified as adversary proceedings. Since the implementation of the revised procedure, 66,778 requests for relief from stay and 14,232 requests for lien avoidance have been filed with the courts. Table 17 provides a summary of adversary proceedings, requests for automatic stay and requests for lien avoidance filed during each of the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1982 through 1984.
