STUDY DESCRIPTION

This survey of local jails was conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census for the Law Enforcement Assistance as a part of the larger study entitled, "Survey of Inmates of Local Jails."

The objective of the study was to obtain information concerning local jail facilities, services, and programs. Specific variables include: number of inmates held; types of accommodations, number of different types of staff personnel, procedures for segregating certain types of inmates, selected facilities, and programs and services.

The jail is defined as a locally administered institution that has authority to retain adults for 48 hours or longer. The local jail is the "intake point for the entire criminal justice system." This census included all locally operated jails that had been found in the National Jail Census, 1970, and which were authorized to confine inmates for 48 or more hours. The following facility types were excluded from the survey: federal and state correctional institutions; facilities used exclusively for juveniles; drunk tanks; lockups, and all other accommodations that retain persons for less than 2 full days; state-operated jails; hospitals for the criminally insane. An individual facility that was administratively dependent upon a parent institution was considered a separate jail only if it was geographically separated from the parent institution and held inmates for 48 or more hours. Information was obtained for 3,580 jails.

SAMPLE AND DATA COLLECTION

The data were collected by means of three procedures: mailed questionnaires, telephone, and field interview. The initial questionnaire was mailed in June, 1972, with follow-ups to nonresponding facilities being sent in late June and July of 1972. In October those facilities which had still not responded, and which held 250 or more inmates were visited by interviewers. In addition, half of the nonresponding institutions with 250 or fewer inmates were contacted by telephone. After these collection procedures were employed, information was available from 3,580 jails; no information was obtained from 334 facilities. All of the nonresponding institutions had fewer than 250 inmates; these jails represented 8.5% of all jails that were operating in the summer of 1972.

1. The OSIRIS variable number. The variable number is used as the SPSS variable name when an OSIRIS file is processed by SPSS.
2. The abbreviated (24 characters maximum) variable label used within the OSIRIS or SPSS systems to identify the variable for the user.
3. The starting location and width of this variable in the data as stored on a magnetic tape. This information and the number of decimal places, if any, is the format information needed to read the data into other systems.
4. The designation of missing data. In the example, code values for START SALARY CH JAILER are equal to nine, or less than or equal to minus one. These values are designated as missing data. Some analysis software packages (including the OSIRIS and SPSS packages) require that certain types of data which are usually excluded from analysis be designated as "missing data;" e.g., inappropriate, unascertained, unascertainable or ambiguous data categories. If need be, this designation can be changed by the user and the values used in a substantive manner.
5. The OSIRIS reference number. The LEAA Data Archive has adopted the OSIRIS III convention of assigning both a variable number and a reference number to each data item when a file is created. In the archive file, they are the same. Should the data be subsetted or rearranged, the variable numbers would change to reflect the order of the new data file, while the reference numbers would remain to reflect the variable numbers in the codebook describing the archived data file.

6. The three-column identification number unique to this data file.
7. The storage mode of the variable. All data in this file are in numeric character form.
8. The unabbreviated variable label or the text of the question from the survey form.
9. The frequency of occurrence of each code value.
10. The code values occurring in the data for a variable.
11. The textual definitions of the codes. The first 20 characters form a short label which is sometimes used to document the output of analysis programs. A longer description follows the short label when necessary.

APPENDIX 1: Definition of Terms

Following is a glossary of terms, concepts, and categories used in collecting the Survey of Inmates Institutional Data. This glossary was taken from the above cited publication, The Nation's Jails.

Concerning the employees of the institutions surveyed, administrative personnel includes the chief jailer (or sheriff or chief of police) and any of his deputies or assistants. Clerical and maintenance personnel includes typists, secretaries, janitors, cooks, groundskeepers, etc. Custodial officers includes guards and jailers. Part-time jail employees are persons who spend part of their time on other duties, such as police duties, or on other work not connected with the jail. Sworn officers are employees with full or limited powers of arrest.

Concerning the institutions surveyed, the following terms apply. A jail is any individual facility operated by a unit of local government (that is, a municipality or township with a 1970 population of 1,000 or more persons, or a county) for the detention or correction of adults suspected or convicted of a crime. Hospitals for the criminally insane are not included. Detention authority is defined as a minimum of 48 hours duration.

A lower limit of 1,000 population for cities and townships was set because few smaller places have jails that hold persons for 48 hours or more. In the course of the 1970 National Jail Census, no township of any size were identified that had jails meeting this 48 hour criterion.

A large jail is an institution accommodating 21 to 249 inmates. A small jail is an institution accommodating 20 or fewer inmates.

Concerning the regions of the U.S. surveyed, regions are defined as follows: The Northeast consists of the states of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. The North Central Region is made up of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. The South consists of Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia. The West includes Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

U.S. Government-funded programs mentioned in this study include the following: Community Action Program (CAP) -- conducts antipoverty development programs.

Concentrated Employment Program (CEP) -- refers the unemployed to jobs and maintaining supportive services.

Job Corps -- offers vocational training and employment on special projects for unemployed youth.

- Job Opportunity in the Business Sector (JOBS) -- provides job opportunities and vocational training for the unemployed.
- Manpower Development Training Act (MDTA) -- establishes classes in occupational training, remedial education, and supportive services for the unemployed.
- Public Service Careers -- provides employment in federal, state, and local government agencies for disadvantaged persons.
- Operation Mainstream -- offers vocational training and work experience for unemployed adults in towns and rural areas.
- Special Impact -- operates development projects in low-income communities.
- Work Incentive (WIN) -- trains and employs members of families receiving Aid to Families with Dependent Children.

APPENDIX 2: Data Deficiencies

The following collection of memoranda discuss several deficiencies found in these data. The first suggests the need for caution when dealing with the characteristics of jail employees, especially when the figures for inmates are small. The remaining memoranda concern questions raised about the count of jail cells in the 1972 survey.

There are two basic questions with these variables. The first and most serious concerns a difficulty with the record layout which does not allow sufficient space for five of the larger jails. The second problem concerns differences between the 1970 and 1972 data. In 1972 the manner in which the cells were enumerated was subdivided to differentiate holding capacity of cells. This virtually eliminates comparability of the data for 1970 with 1972 on the number of cells.
