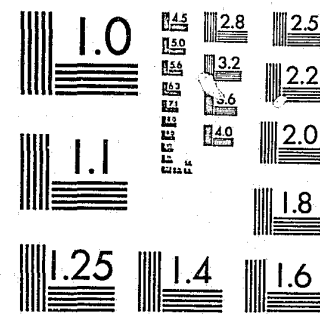

## STUDY DESCRIPTION

The Juvenile Detention and Correctional Facility Census of 1975 was the fourth in a series of surveys of state and local public facilities in the juvenile justice system. The first of these major surveys was designed by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW). The data collection for the four surveys (1971, 1973, 1974 and 1975) was performed by the Bureau of the Census. The 1975 census was the second one in the series to cover both public and private juvenile detention and correctional facilities. Data in this study are the results of the public sector survey.

Documentation for the Juvenile Detention and Correctional Facility Census is comprised of three parts: an introduction (this document), an OSIRIS dictionary-codebook and a glossary of terms and concepts use in the survey.

The Census surveyed the number and kinds of juvenile detention facilities with a resident population of at least 50 percent juveniles. (This last criterion did not apply to facilities that held youthful offenders in addition to juveniles. A facility was included if it was considered a juvenile facility, even though the youthful offenders outnumbered juveniles at the time of the census. Specifically excluded were juvenile detention centers operated as part of a jail and without a separate staff or budget, nonresidential facilities, facilities exclusively for drug abusers or for dependent and neglected children, foster homes and federal juvenile correctional facilities.

On June 30, 1975, the 874 public facilities were surveyed. Distributed by type of facility, there were 347 detention centers; 23 shelters; 17 reception or diagnostic centers; 189 training schools; 103 ranches, forestry camps and farms; and 195 halfway houses and group homes.

Included in the survey are the total number of juveniles held as of June 30, 1975 as well as the breakdown of the numbers in each type of facility. Also included are numbers and breakdown (by sex) of detention and status offenses for juveniles; numbers of full-time/part-time, payroll/nonpayroll staff; capital, total operating and per capita expenditure. (Capital expenditures frequently do not reflect the original cost of newly constructed facilities, however; such costs are incurred before the facilities become operational.)

## DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

The 1975 census was conducted by mail and questionnaires were mailed in November of 1975 to the facilities. The questionnaires were sent to central reporters (state/local agencies). The remaining questionnaires were mailed directly to the individual facilities.

The mailing list used in the 1975 census was that which was used in the 1974 census, updated from the 1974-75 edition of the Directory of Correctional Institutions and Agencies, published by the American Correctional Association and the 1975 State Comprehensive Law Enforcement Plans prepared by each state for LEAA. The updated list was then sent to juvenile correctional authorities in the respective states for review and correction.

The 1975 survey had a 100% response rate and is the universe. There is then no sampling or weighting information needed for this survey.

## CODEBOOK INFORMATION

The example below is a reproduction of information appearing in the machine-readable codebook for a typical variable. The numbers in brackets do not appear, but are references to the descriptions which follow this example.

[1] Indicates the variable and reference numbers. A variable and reference number are assigned to each item in the study. In this codebook, documenting the archived dataset, these numbers are identical. Should the data be formed into a fixed length record file, new variable numbers may be assigned or created. The reference number would remain unchanged and correspond to those in this codebook.

[2] Indicates the abbreviated (24 character maximum) variable label used within OSIRIS to identify each variable description list.

#### IV

[3] Indicates the designation of missing data. In this example, a code value equal to nine (MD=9). Although these values are defined as within the missing data categories, this does not mean that the user should not or can not use these code values in a substantive role if he/she so desires.

[4] Indicates the sequential location and width of this variable within the record when the data are stored on magnetic tape. In this example, the variable named "LEVEL OF GOVERNMENT" is one column wide and located in the 12TH column within the record.

[5] Indicates the location by deck and column(s) of this variable when the data are on cards or in card image form.

[6] A variable containing data with implied decimals is denoted by the message, "XX DEC PLACE(S)", where XX is the number of decimal places implied (not punched) in the variable.

[7] Indicates the full text of the question supplied by the original collectors of the data. This is the wording used on the original questionnaire.

[8] Indicates an additional comment or explanation appended to the variable description.

[9] A variable which has a footnote associated with it is denoted by the message, "SEE NOTE(S) X", where X is the number of the footnote referenced.

[10] Indicates the code values occurring in the data for this variable.

[11] Indicates the textual definitions of the codes.

#### V

##### FILE STRUCTURE

The data are available from the ICPSR in two formats: a card image file and an OSIRIS dataset. The card image file contains 9 decks per respondent in a format based on 80 column punched cards. The data are sorted by respondent with all decks for a case together in ascending order. The OSIRIS dictionary gives the format and other information for each variable in the OSIRIS data file. The dictionary or dictionary-codebook file is used in conjunction with the OSIRIS software package. The OSIRIS data file is constructed with a single logical record of 652 bytes for each respondent.

The OSIRIS data file can be accessed directly by software packages which do not use the OSIRIS dictionary by specifying the tape locations of the desired variables. These tape locations are given in the OSIRIS dictionary-codebook.

##### ICPSR PROCESSING INFORMATION

The ICPSR has added to the data a series of identification variables. The first variable is a unique study identification number [7707] that the ICPSR gave to this study. The second variable is a version number. Starting with one, it will increment by one, each time the ICPSR re-releases the study. The third variable is a file number that indicates the particular file's sequence in the complete dataset. In this case, the study is completely contained in one data file. The fourth variable is a sequential identification number the ICPSR has added that uniquely identifies each record in the dataset. All the variables are numeric character and the ranges have been documented in the codebook. Consistency checks have been performed on the data.

# GLOSSARY

**ADJUDICATED DELINQENT** - Detention status of a juvenile who, as the result of a formal and completed judicial proceeding is adjudged a delinquent, usually for a nonstatus offense -- one for which as adult could be prosecuted in a criminal court. Includes some status offenders especially in states without special status offenders statutes. Even in states with such statutes, juveniles with previous offenses can be adjudicated delinquent for status offenses. (Conversely, a judge can declare a juvenile to be a person in need of supervision for a felony or misdemeanor -- see person in need of supervision.)

**AWAITING TRANSFER TO ANOTHER JURISDICTION** - Detention status of a juvenile who allegedly has committed a crime in or runaway from another jurisdiction and is being held pending return to that jurisdiction. Includes runaways from other correctional facilities. Excludes adjudicated delinquents awaiting placement in a correctional facility.

**CAPITAL EXPENDITURES** - Includes spending now for new buildings, major repairs or improvements, and new equipment costing \$1,000 or more, but excludes single expenditures of less than \$1,000.

**CHILD IN NEED OF SUPERVISION (CHINS)** - see person in need of supervision.

**COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS** - Full-time and part-time personnel who receive NO compensation of any type, such as salaries payments, or class credit, for their services at the facility.

**DEPENDENT AND NEGLECTED** - A juvenile over whom a juvenile court assumes jurisdiction because of its finding that the care exercised by parent, guardian, or custodian falls short of a legal standard for proper care. Excludes juveniles held on delinquency charges, adjudicated delinquents, and those declared in need of supervision, even if they also could be considered dependent and neglected.

(CONTINUED)

**DETENTION CENTER** - A short-term facility that provides temporary care in a physically restricting environment for juveniles in custody pending court disposition and, often, for juveniles who are adjudicated delinquent or are awaiting transfer to another jurisdiction.

**DETENTION STATUS** - One of the following statuses under which juveniles are held: adjudicated delinquent, person in need of supervision, held pending court disposition, awaiting transfer to another jurisdiction, voluntary admission, and dependent and neglected.

**GROUP HOME** - see HALFWAY HOUSE AND GROUP HOME.

**HALFWAY HOUSE AND GROUP HOME** - A long-term facility in which residents are allowed extensive contact with the community such as attending school or working on a job.

**HELD PENDING COURT DISPOSITION** - Detention status of a juvenile who has not had any hearing or who has had only a preliminary screening, detention, or similar hearing and is awaiting further court action.

**JUVENILE** - In most states, a person under 18. With respect to juveniles in custody, a person subject to juvenile court proceedings because a statutorily defined event is alleged to have occurred while his/her age was below the statutorily specified limit of original jurisdiction of a juvenile court.

**JUVENILE IN NEED OF SUPERVISION (JINS)** - see person in need of supervision.

**LONG-TERM FACILITY** - A correctional, as opposed to a detention, facility. Includes training schools: ranches, forestry camps, and farms; and halfway houses and group homes.

**MINOR IN NEED OF SUPERVISION (MINS)** - see person in need of supervision.

**NONJUVENILE** - With respect to persons in custody, one within the original jurisdiction of a criminal rather than a juvenile court because his/her age at the time of an alleged crime was above the statutorily specified limit.

(CONTINUED)

**NONPAYROLL STAFF** - Full-time or part-time staff who are NOT on the payroll of this facility. Includes personnel of a parent agency or other agency or service (including school system), who are assigned for some or all of their working time to this facility; also include personnel paid under contractual agreements or Federal grants and college interns who receive class credit for their work at the facility.

**OPERATING EXPENDITURES** - Gross salaries and wages, plus other operating expenditures.

**PAYROLL STAFF** - Full-time and part-time staff on the payroll of the reporting facility.

**PERSON IN NEED OF SUPERVISION (PINS)** - Detention status of a juvenile declared by a juvenile court to be in need of supervision. Encompasses those known variously as child in need of supervision (CHINS), juvenile in need of supervision (JINS), and minor in need of supervision (MINS), as well as those designated as unruly, unmanageable, or incorrigible under special statutes for status offenders. All PINS are not status offenders, and all status offenders are not PINS. Even in States with status offenders statutes, juveniles with previous offenses can be adjudicated delinquent for status offenses. Conversely, a judge can declare a juvenile to be a person in need of supervision for a felony or misdemeanor.

**RANCH, FORESTRY CAMP, AND FARM** - A long-term residential facility for persons whose behavior does not necessitate the strict confinement of a training school, often allowing them greater contact with the community.

**RECEPTION OR DIAGNOSTIC CENTER** - A short-term facility that screens persons committed by courts and assigns them to appropriate correctional facilities.

**RESIDENT** - A person, juvenile or nonjuvenile, held in a juvenile detention or correctional facility.

**SHELTER** - A short-term facility that provides temporary care similar to that of a detention center, but in a physically unrestricting environment.

(CONTINUED)

**SHORT-TERM FACILITY** - A detention, as opposed to a correctional, facility. Includes detention centers, shelters, and reception or diagnostic centers.

**STATUS OFFENSE** - An offense for which only juveniles can be charged, e.g., curfew violation, consumption of alcoholic beverages, running away from home.

**TRAINING SCHOOL** - A long-term specialized type of facility that provides strict confinement for its residents.

**VOLUNTARY ADMISSION** - A type of admission in which a juvenile voluntarily commits himself/herself to a facility without being adjudged by a court to be a delinquent or in need of supervision. The juvenile may be referred to the facility for treatment by parents, court, school, or social agency.

**YOUTHFUL OFFENDER** - A person, adjudicated in a criminal court, who may be above the statutory age limit for juveniles but below a specified upper age limit, for whom special correctional commitments and special record-sealing procedures are made available by statute. The special correctional commitment may be to a juvenile facility, to a special section of an adult facility, or to a separate facility for the confinement of persons between the age limits specified in the particular statute. Such provisions exist in federal law and in the laws of several states.
