### INTRODUCTION

This study updates the February 1, 1983 Five-Year Recidivism study. The earlier study included all persons returned to prison by June 30, 1982, the end of FY 1982. The present effort adds FY 1982 releasees and FY 1983 returnees. The data presented herein give a general picture of adult recidivism in Washington State.

For the purposes of this study, recidivism is operationally defined as the return to a Washington State adult correctional facility of an offender who had been either paroled or discharged from such a facility, the return occurring within five years after release as the result of conviction of a new felony or technical violation of a parole condition. This definition is not intended to provide a strict measure of success for releasees. It does not include subsequent commitments to other correctional jurisdictions or returns beyond five years at risk. The definition limits recidivism to five years at risk because little recidivism occurs beyond that point. The primary concern here is the impact of recidivism upon the Washington State

## METHODOLOGY

The subjects of this study are offenders, both male and female, who were either paroled or discharged from a Washington State adult correctional facility during Fiscal Years 1960 through 1982, i.e., between July 1, 1959 and June 30, 1982. Recidivists are those releasees who were returned to June 30, 1983.

The recidivism cohorts are divided into five intervals: one, two, three, four and five years at risk. With the return cut-off date of June 30, 1983, the one-year cohort includes all Fiscal Year 1960-82 releasees; the two-year cohort all Fiscal Year 1960-81 releasees; the three-year cohort all Fiscal Year 1960-79 releasees; and the five-year cohort all Fiscal Year 1960-78 releasees.

Release cohorts were studied as a whole and also were divided into the following major offense categories: Murder 1, Murder 2, Manslaughter, Sex Crimes, Robbery, Assault, Property Crimes, Drugs, Other Felonies, and Offense Not Reported. For a broader distinction, the ten individual offense categories were grouped according to person and non-person types. The former includes Murder 1, Murder 2, Manslaughter, Sex Crimes, Robbery, and Assault; the latter includes Property Crimes, Drugs, Other Felonies, and Offense Not Reported.



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### RESULTS

To provide recidivism data to fill many users' needs, this study includes summary tables as well as more detailed tables, by offenses category and by fiscal year of release, for each of the five at-risk periods. Analyses by offense type are often significant; analyses by year of release permit an examination of historical trends.

The percents of releasees returned within each at-risk interval, for all releasees included in the study, are shown in Table 1. This table indicates that the overall recidivism rate for Washington State is about 36.2 percent. The components of this overall rate range from a high 40.7 percent for property offenders to a low of 18.5 percent for persons convicted of second-degree murder. These results are nearly identical to the February 1983 study results. Non-person offenders are more likely to be returned to prison than are person offenders at all intervals of the at-risk period.

According to Table 2, just under half (43.1 percent) of all recidivists return during their first year at risk, and nearly three fourths reappear in prison within two years of release. The return patterns appear to be fairly consistent throughout the various offense categories, although there is some variation. At each follow-up interval, the proportion of non-person recidivists exceeds that of person recidivists. This relationship holds true throughout the time span of the study, but the difference in return rates between person and non-person offenders is less in recent years. This diminishing difference appears to be due primarily to decreasing recidivism for property offenders, especially at one year at risk.

Tables 3 through 7 present the return rates, by offense category and year of release, for each follow-up period. These return rates and the raw data from which they were derived are grouped into person and non-person types in Tables 8 through 17.

Overall, property offenders and robbers comprise the greatest risk for recommitment, whereas persons convicted of murder or manslaughter recidivate the least.

### DISCUSSION

The present study is descriptive in nature, providing interested persons with pertinent recidivism information that can be used as a basis for management decisions and/or further research studies. Although it may raise more questions than it answers, the information contained in this study does point out some overall tendencies.

The general assumption that person offenders tend to be recommitted less than non-person offenders is upheld by the return rates presented herein. Whether this phenomenon is due to differences in the nature of the criminal behavior involved, to the tendency for person offenders, on the average, to be older than non-person offenders at the time of release, or to a combination of these or other factors, is not apparent from the results of this study.

The return rates for each of the offense categories indicate general trends. The offense categories are too broad to warrant definitive conclusions regarding the risk potential of specific offender types. Further studies on recidivism could focus on more homogeneous sub-groups of releasees and examine in more detail the kinds of behavior that generate returns to prison. Because of the critical impact of recidivism on both the Criminal Justice System and the general citizenry, this descriptive analysis may serve as the foundation for further, specific investigations.
