

## OFFENDER RISK ASSESSMENT CODING INSTRUCTIONS

The coding of the offender risk assessment involves a five-step process as follows:

Step I: 4-Factor Scoring

Step II: Offender Typing

Step III: Special Risk Factor Scoring

Step IV: Final General Risk Assessment

Step V: Final Violence/Property Risk Assessment

The final product of the process (from Step V) consists of two assessments, one of the potential for new violence, and the second of the potential for new property (non-violent) crime.

Step I entails the examination of the combined predictive power of four "general risk factors," namely 1) Substance Abuse Classification, 2) Current Offense Classification, 3) Criminal History Classification, and 4) Age at Conviction. First, the appropriate row in the matrix of Step I is determined by classification according to substance abuse history and current offense type. Similarly, the appropriate column is located by classification according to criminal history score and age at conviction. The entry in the body of the matrix where the selected row and column cross indicates the "4-Factor Score" for the offender, which should be circled in actual coding. This score varies from 1 to 7 in increasing order of risk. The coding of the four general risk factors covered under Step I is given in the "Item Definitions" section to follow.

Step II provides a general typology of offenders which proves useful in Step IV and Step V. Initially, Step II involves the classification of the offender as either a Violent Offender or a Non-Violent Offender. This is a reference to the

fact of a known history of violence and <u>not</u> a specification of any type of violence risk. A Violent Offender is one who is either: 1) currently convicted of an offense against person(s), 2) covered by one of the special violence risk factors of Step III, or 3) currently convicted of escape or jailbreak. The appropriate categories here should be checked. Step II, in addition, identifies offenders to be covered under Burn-out and First Offender designations appearing in Step IV. Again, if applicable, the appropriate categories should be checked. A First Offender is one who, has no prior record of felony arrests or convictions. The Burn-out designation applies if either: 1) the offender is not classified as a Violent Offender and is age 50 or over at conviction, or 2) the offender is not a Violent Offender, is age 25 to 49 at conviction, and has a 4-Factor Score of 1 to 4. If either the First Offender or Burn-out designations apply, this <u>may</u> result in a lower general risk assessment from Step IV.

Step III provides a much more sensitive reading of the offender's criminal history than was possible in Step I, and is particularly aimed at the identification of special highly predictive risk factors that may virtually stand alone as indicators of high risk offenders. To this extent, a special risk factor may override the 4-Factor Score from Step I in providing a more accurate risk assessment. To code Step III, it is necessary to examine the detailed criminal history of the offender, including dates and dispositions of all felony charges, and of other indictable offenses resulting in incarceration, as well as periods of "street time" since previous arrests, convictions, and incarcerations of certain types. The designation "N+" means "N or more". Generally speaking, in coding this section, it is only necessary to identify one special risk factor, since the the simple occurrence of a factor is what applies in Step IV. Special risk factors are not counted, and the ordering is purely arbitrary except for the groupings indicated to the left

of the numbered sequence. In stating that only one special factor need be identified, we must qualify this statement somewhat as follows:

- 1) If the offender is not otherwise classified as a Violent Offender from

  Step II, it may be necessary to code a special violence risk factor (where
  applicable) to obtain the Violent Offender classification.
- 2) Independent of the classification of Violent and Non-Violent Offenders,
  Class II Special Risk Factors are generally stronger predictors that
  take precedence over Class I factors in many cases. It may be necessary,
  depending on the 4-Factor Score, to find a Class II factor to be able to
  classify the offender as a Poor Risk under Step IV.

The "Item Definitions" section gives the meanings of all terms used in Step III, including "street time," "high recidivism offense," and "felonies of same type."

Step IV provides a Final General Risk Assessment resulting from a combination of the results of the first three steps. To code Step IV, first locate the 4-Factor Score from Step I on the left side of the table, making a check mark to the left of the score. Then determine from Step II if either the First Offender or Burnout designations apply. If so, then the Final General Risk Assessment is given in the first column of the body of the table. If not, then the first column should be ignored, and the remaining three columns examined to obtain the general assessment. In the latter case, if any Class II Special Risk Factor was coded under Step III, then the general assessment is given in the last column. If no Class II factor was coded, but at least one Class I factor was coded, then the middle column gives the general assessment. If no Class I or II factor was coded, then the first (None) column gives the general assessment. In any case, the resulting assessment should be circled.

Step V combines the Final General Risk Assessment from Step IV with the result of the Violent/Non-Violent Offender classification to give both a Final Violence Risk Assessment and a Final Property Risk Assessment. First, the Final General Risk Assessment should be located on the left side of the table. Then the final Violence Risk is determined by examining the first two columns in the body of the table, the first column giving the Violence Risk for Violent Offenders and the second column the Violence Risk for Non-Violent Offenders. Similarly, the final Property Risk is determined by examining the last two columns, the first of the two giving the Property Risk for Violent Offenders and the second the Property Risk for Non-Violent Offenders. Both of the resulting assessments should be circled.

## OFFENDER RISK ASSESSMENT ITEM DEFINITIONS

## Substance Abuse Classification

Based on documented or self-reported history of drug or alcohol abuse.

Substance Abuser III: History of problem use of narcotics, hallucinogens,

or glue, or

History of illicit drug injections

Substance Abuser II: History of non-problem use of narcotics, hallucinogens,

or glue

Substance Abuser 1: History of problem use of drugs or alcohol

Non-Abuser: No history as above

In coding this item, always select the highest applicable category.

## Current Offense Classification

Based only on offenses for which the offender has been arrested, convicted, or incarcerated in the last year of street time. In case of multiple offense applicability, the highest category (bottom to top) is to be selected. For example, if a Substance Abuser III has current Robbery, Burglary, and Larceny charges, then the category "Aggravated Assault/Robbery" is chosen as the current offense classification. The definitions of the general offense categories considered under this item are the same as those used in conjunction with the Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) program. In lowa, offenses would be classified as follows:

Aggravated Assault - Attempt to Commit Murder, Willful Injury, Assault while Participating in a Felony, Terrorism, and Assault with Intent to Inflict Serious Injury.

Robbery - Robbery in the First Degree and Robbery in the Second Degree

Aggravated Burglary - Burglary in the First Degree and Attempted Burglary in the First Degree

<u>Burglary</u> - Burglary in the Second Degree and Attempted Burglary in the Second Degree

Motor Vehicle Theft - Theft in the Second Degree (Motor Vehicle) and Operating Motor Vehicle without Owner's Consent

Forgery - False Use of a Financial Instrument

Bad Checks - Theft in the First, Second, or Third Degree (by Check)

## Criminal History Classification

The Criminal History Classification is a classification according to the general "volume" and "seriousness" of the offender's prior criminal record. A single Criminal History Score is calculated from information on the number of prior arrests, probations, jail terms, and juvenile and adult commitments, and then a single category is determined based on placement along an array of five ranges of scores as follows: 0-1, 2-5, 6-10, 11-19, 20+. The Criminal History Score is calculated as:

CRIMINAL HISTORY SCORE = A + B + C + 2D + 2E, where

A = Number of prior arrests

B = Number of prior probations

C = Number of prior adult jail terms

D = Number of juvenile commitments

E = Number of prior adult commitments

Equivalently, the Criminal History Score assigns one point to each prior arrest not leading to a probation or incarceration, two points to each prior arrest leading to a probation or jail term, and three points to each prior arrest leading to a juvenile or adult commitment. Strictly traffic offenses (non-criminal) should be excluded in counting prior arrests, convictions, etc., however, all arrests for criminal and juvenile status offenses should be counted, including arrests for

simple misdemeanors.

## High Recidivism Offense

A high recidivism offense is any offense falling in one of the categories: Burglary, Motor Vehicle Theft, Forgery, Bad Checks, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault, as defined above.

#### Fe lony

A felony is defined as any offense for which an adult may be committed to a state or federal correctional institution. In lowa, this includes the category of aggravated misdemeanor.

## Street Time

In referring to the amount of "street time" since a past event, as under the coding of Step III, we imply the amount of time between the event in question and the current conviction or commitment (whichever is used as a reference point) which was not spent in a county jail (pre or post conviction), juvenile institution, or adult correctional facility (prison, halfway house, etc.).

## Crime Against Persons

Generally, a crime against persons is taken to be any felony or misdemeanor involving harm, or threat of harm, to a person. Specifically, crimes against persons include the following:

- o Murder, manslaughter, feticide, and attempts
- o Nonconsensual termination
- o Assault, aggravated assault, battery, aggravated battery, etc.
- o Terrorism
- o Administering harmful substances
- o Rape, attempted rape, sexual abuse
- o Kidnapping, child stealing
- o Robbery, attempted robbery, extortion, larceny from a person

- o Aggravated burglary
- o Arson of a dwelling
- o Lascivious acts, indecent contact, sodomy, incest, other sex offenses
- o Sexual exploitation
- o Nonsupport, neglect, abandonment
- o Contributing to the delinquency of a minor
- o Going armed with intent

## Felonies of Same Type

Certain felonies are classified as being of the same type for purposes of defining the special risk factors of Step III:

- o Murder, manslaughter, feticide and attempts/aggravated assault/terrorism
- o Rape; attempted rape, sexual abuse/lascivious acts, indecent contact, sodomy, incest, other sex offenses/sexual exploitation
- o Kidnapping, child stealing
- o Robbery, attempted robbery, extortion, larceny from a person
- o Nonsupport, neglect, abandonment
- o Burglary, possession of burglar's tools, larceny in the nighttime
- o Motor vehicle theft (includes operating without consent)
- o Arson, vandalism, explosives offenses, bomb threat
- o Larceny, shoplifting, stolen property (include larceny in the nighttime)
- o Forgery, counterfeiting, altering, bad checks, fraud
- o Embezzlement, white collar offenses
- o Weapons offenses
- o Drug offenses
- o Alcohol offenses (intoxication, drunken driving, etc.)
- o Prostitution, pimping, pandering, pornography
- o Motor vehicle offenses (exclude theft, drunken driving)
- o Escape, failure to appear, flight
- o Bribery, perjury, obstruction, tampering, misconduct in office

## Step II - Offender Typing

Classified as "Violent Offender" based on the presence of a special violence risk factor (prior conviction for felony against persons in last 5 years of street time) (see Step III)

Not classified as a first offender (has prior felony record)

Not subject to "burn-out" classification

## Step III - Special Risk Factor Scoring

Special factor #1 is applicable based on a prior conviction (adjudication) for a felony against persons (robbery with aggravation) in the last 5 years of street time (25 months of street time since admission to Boys! Training School for robbery).

Special factor #6 is applicable based on a prior felony incarceration (for attempted breaking and entering) in the last year of street time (8 months of street time since previous prison admission).

Special factor #23 is applicable based on the current conviction for breaking and entering being the third conviction for a "high recidivism" offense in the last 5 years of street time (previous convictions for robbery and attempted breaking and entering in the last 33 months of street time).

## Step IV - Final General Risk Assessment

4-Factor Score of 6 (from Step I)
No burn-out or first offender classification (from Step II)
Has Class II Special Risk Factor #23) (taking precedence over Class I factors)
(from Step III)

## Summary

Offender served 29 months on a 10-year sentence for breaking and entering.

Rated as VERY POOR RISK both for violence and property crime.

Received new 7-year prison sentence for robbery after 18 months on parole.

## Step II - Offender Typing

Classified as "Violent Offender" based on a current sentence for a crime against persons and on the presence of special violence risk factors (see Step III) -- either of which would be sufficient to allow classification as a violent offender

Not classified as a first offender (has prior felony record)

Not subject to burn-out classification

## Step III - Special Risk Factor Scoring

Special factors #1 and #12 are applicable based on a prior conviction (adjudication) for a felony against persons (murder) in the last 2 years of street time (11 months of street time since placed on juvenile probation for murder).

Special factors #2 and #15 are applicable based on a total of three arrests for felonies against persons in the last 3 years of street (prior arrests for robbery and murder and the current arrest for robbery with aggravation all in the last 36 months of street time).

Special factors #3, #4, and #17 applicable based on the recency of the prior arrests for robbery and murder.

Special factor #21 applicable based on two prior felony convictions (adjudications) (for murder and carrying a concealed weapon) in the last two years of street time (11 months of street time since the first of the two convictions).

4-Factor Score of 6 (from Step 1) No burn-out or first offender classification (from Step II) Has Class II Special Risk Factors (#12,#15,#17,#21) (taking precedence over Class I factors)

## Step V - Final Violence/Property Risk Assessment

Final General Risk Assessment from Step IV is POOR RISK Has "Violent Offender" classification from Step II (current offense against persons)

Final Violence Risk Assessment: VERY POOR RISK Final Property Risk Assessment: VERY POOR RISK

Rated as VERY POOR RISK both for violence and property crime.

Received new 25-year sentence for robbery with aggravation after 10 months on parole.

Received new 40-year sentence for robbery and habitual criminal after 10 months on the second parole.
