The pace at which judges and juries sentence persons to death for crimes committed while under the age of eighteen remains extremely low. Accurate accounting of such sentences began in 1982, with only partial data available for years before 1982. The number of such juvenile death sentences, compared to total death sentences, for 1982 through the present is as follows:

These 47 juvenile death sentences since 1982 are only 2% of the total (2,181) and in the last few years have fallen to around 1% of the total. In essence, total death sentences imposed have risen to and leveled off at about 300 each year, while juvenile death sentences have fallen to about 3 each year. This decline in juvenile death sentences may have resulted from the United States Supreme Court decision in Thompson v. Oklahoma (108 S.Ct. 2685 (1988)) but may be reversed somewhat by that Court's decision in Stanford v. Kentucky and Wilkins v. Missouri (57 U.S.L.W. 4973 (1989)).

As of July 15, 1989, twenty-eight persons remained on death row for crimes committed while under the age of eighteen. The last juvenile death sentence imposed, and the only one so far in 1989, was that of Richard Wayne Joyner on May 25, 1989, in North Carolina. Apparently still only 17-years-old, Joyner is the youngest person on death row. Also of note is the July 13, 1989, reversal of the death sentence of Paula Cooper in Indiana, only 15 at the time of her crime.

The juvenile death sentences for January 1, 1982, through July 15, 1989, are listed on the following pages. While the sources of this information are many, the major source is the outstanding research effort of the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc., and their newsletter, Death Row, U.S.A..
