BJS TO RELEASE *CRIMINAL VICTIMIZATION, 2016: REVISED*

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Department of Justice’s Bureau of Justice Statistics will issue a press release and report, *Criminal Victimization, 2016: Revised*, **EMBARGOED UNTIL WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2018, 8 A.M. ET.** This report is the 44th in a series that began in 1973. It provides revised official estimates of violent and property crime reported and not reported to police, which replace previously released 2016 estimates that did not permit year-to-year-comparisons.
