JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AWARDS OVER \$35 MILLION TO PROVIDE HOUSING TO VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The Office for Victims of Crime, a component of the Department’s Office of Justice Programs, has awarded \$35,104,338 in grant funding to provide safe, stable housing and appropriate services to victims of human trafficking.

The grants will go to 73 organizations to provide six to 24 months of transitional or short-term housing assistance for trafficking victims, including rental, utilities or related expenses, such as security deposits and relocation costs. The grants will also provide funding for support needed to help victims locate permanent housing, secure employment and receive occupational training and counseling.
