FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON JUVENILE JUSTICE TO HOLD <u>MEETING</u>

WASHINGTON — The Federal Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice will convene on March 6. Composed of members of state advisory groups on juvenile justice, the committee advises the President and Congress on matters related to juvenile justice, evaluates the progress and accomplishments of juvenile justice activities and projects, and advises the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Administrator on the work of OJJDP. At the meeting, OJJDP Administrator Caren Harp will give remarks and lead work group discussions.
