NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE HELPS SOLVE SERIAL KILLER COLD CASES

WASHINGTON – The Office of Justice Programs' National Institute of Justice today released an article focusing on cold cases involving serial homicides. The report outlines how NIJ supports efforts to solve these cases and profiles a number of serial killers who were identified with help from NIJ programs. It also discusses how newly available techniques and tools can help catch serial offenders early, potentially saving lives and preventing future crime.
