


Letter from the Project Director

The cold months have always presented challenges to our American Indian and Alaska Native people. This winter has been especially challenging with the health crisis we have endured. So many of those domains and environments we have maintained for time immemorial were taken away. The cultural, spiritual, and social gatherings have all been impacted. The socialization of our children has been diminished due to closing schools for our children's and their educators' safety.

I know we all understand the impact the health crisis has placed upon our programs that provide much needed justice, support services, safety, and healing for victims of crime. However, I also understand how resilient our people are. We have always confronted the impossible and prevailed.

We have not journeyed alone through this time. We have enjoyed the support of the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) and the other agencies that support our tribal populations. We have also enjoyed the support of professionals of many races and ethnicities that work for and support the

Reminders

Population Certification

If you intend to participate in the noncompetitive FY 2021 Tribal Victim Set-Aside Formula Grant Program, you must submit a **population certification by Friday, March 5 at 11:59 p.m. eastern time.** *If you applied in FY 2020, you may resubmit the population certification form from that application period if the data is still accurate.* Population certifications will be used to determine formula award amounts for each applicant. Tribal Set-Aside Highlights

- The standard 20-page written project narrative will <u>not</u> be required under the FY
 2021 Tribal Victim Services Set Aside Formula Grant Program. In lieu of submitting a formal project narrative, applicants can complete a checklist or have an interview with OVC staff if they chose. This process is expected to begin later this spring.
- FY 2018 Tribal Victim Services Set-Aside grant awards are approaching their end dates of September 30, 2021. Awards identified by the "VO" in their award numbers (for example, 2018-VO-GX-0001) are eligible for no cost extensions. If you have a VO-coded award and you believe you will require more time beyond September 30, 2021 to fully implement your grant project, please contact your Grant Manager to discuss the process for requesting an extension.

Important note: Some FY 2018 tribal grants were made using other available funds – not Tribal Victim Services Set-Aside funds. Those other funds have award numbers that include a "V4" or "V6" (e.g. 2018-V6-GX-0002 or 2018-V4-GX-0003), and principally are awards under the FY 18 Combined Tribal Assistance Solicitation Purpose Areas 6 and 7. **These grants are not extendable** because of the specific statutory laws governing the timeline for the expenditure of these funds. OVC cannot change the law that governs those funds, and therefore cannot make exceptions or grant extensions for those awards. Additional guidance from OVC was shared with FY 2018 grantees, please reach out to your assigned OVC Grant Manager if you have any questions.

Population Certification Deadline

Submit the <u>Population Certification</u> by 11:59 p.m. eastern time on Friday, March 5 to be eligible for the FY 2021 Tribal Victim Services Set-Aside Formula Grant Program solicitation.

<u>Application Mechanics: Submitting and Application</u>

Reporting Requirements

Uniform Guidance revisions include De Minimis rate and Procurement. Effective November 12, 2020. Key Takeaways and Guidance for Grants.

The new <u>JustGrants</u> system is now active. Make sure you can log-in and access the information for your grant awards. The PMT remains the same. Grantees need to report as they have and upload the PMT generated PDF to JustGrants.

Federal Financial Reports (known as the "SF-425" or the "FFR") are due quarterly as follows:
